The Significance of Service

If you have visited the school's website recently, you may have noticed the following paragraph on the homepage:

SOUTHRIDGE IS A PLACE OF SIGNIFICANCE

It is a place where students journey in their growth academically and personally, exploring, embracing, and sharing their own unique qualities and gifts. It is a place of personal fulfillment and contribution to the greater good. It is a place where youth actively make an intentional positive difference in the world.

Southridge certainly *is* a place where students regularly make contributions to the greater good, and it can be seen throughout our K-12 program. Our students, young and old, positively impact our local and global communities through a wide array of service programs, initiatives, and partnerships. Whether it be our PYP students making sandwiches for the Surrey Urban Mission at their Thursday afternoon sandwich club, or the Senior School Jazz Studies class brightening the day of senior citizens at the <u>Zion Park Manor</u> retirement centre, our students intentionally make a positive difference in the world.

While many schools (particularly, independent schools) have adopted service as part of their mission, there is something very special about service at Southridge. Many of our partnerships in the community are long-standing (i.e. our relationship with the Surrey Urban Mission, our Christmas hamper program, Project Backpack, etc.) and nearly all of our new service initiatives are proposed, planned, and carried out by students. This year alone, Senior School students have organized – a book drive to support Books For Me Vancouver, a tutoring program for elementary students at Martha Currie School, a clothing drive for refugee families, a feminine hygiene product drive to celebrate International Women's Day, and a community Speaker Series in which representatives from community organizations speak to our students about their programs and volunteer opportunities – just to name a few.

And these student-led initiatives are not limited to the Senior School. Two weeks ago, I attended a Junior School assembly and had the pleasure of watching three thoughtful, articulate Grade 5 students outline their plan to support the <u>BC SPCA</u> through a jellybean raffle and a towel/blanket collection for the animals. The students can feel proud of the



fact that they have made a positive impact in the community. It was their ideas and their follow-through that made the initiative such a success.

It is very heartening to see intrinsically motivated students of all ages making our community a better place. Some students like to make positive contributions to the global community through actions on one of our global expeditions, like the group of Senior School students headed to Uganda at the end of the week. Others are happy spreading mustard on the sandwiches that will be passed out to the homeless and hungry in our local community. All of these actions are important.

And thus, Southridge *is* a place of significance. With the variety of service opportunities that are open to our students from Kindergarten to Grade 12, there is no doubt that our school produces students who understand the sacrifice and reward of community service, and who will go on to make a difference in the world – they're already doing it.

Term Two Report Cards

Term Two Report Cards for all PYP and MYP students will be sent home on Friday, March 16 at 3:00 pm. Please be aware that we are not able to provide students with their progress reports early. If your child will not be present to receive their progress report on March 16th, you can come by the school during March Break to pick up their report from the Senior School Reception Desk, or it will be given to your child when school reopens on Tuesday, April 3, 2018.

March Break Dismissal and Return

On Friday, March 16, all students will be dismissed at 3:00 pm for March Break. March Break is two weeks long, plus Easter Monday, with a return-to-school date of Tuesday, April 3 (Day 2). Please also note that Tuesday, April 3 is also a late-start day, and students need to arrive between 10:10 and 10:20 am for a start time of 10:25 am. Please do not drop off students any earlier than 10:10 am, as all teachers and staff are in meetings and no supervision is provided. Please mark your calendars accordingly.

Summer Uniform Options Begin - Tuesday, April 3rd

Students may begin wearing summer uniform items on **Tuesday, April 3rd**, upon our return from March Break. Please see your child's PYP or MYP Prep Book for Junior School summer uniform expectations. Given, the unpredictability of the weather as spring is getting started, students may continue to wear winter uniform items, as needed. As part of a brand new opportunity presented to Southridge, the Junior School was able to take 4 teams to compete at the British Columbian Regional division of the International History Bee and Bowl. Playing against teams from across the Lower Mainland, and each other, all of the Junior Teams performed very well, displaying excellent historical knowledge. Two of our teams did so well in fact, that we qualified for the National Championship in Toronto! As a final piece of exciting news, one of our Grade 7 students placed in the top 25 percentile globally in the Geography Bowl, automatically qualifying for the International Championships in Berlin! Not to ignore our neighbors across the walkway, the Senior School also performed exceptionally well, with two teams also placing at the top of their respective divisions.

Senior School Service Update

Here we are at the end of Term Two, and there is so much going on with our busy Senior School Service program. An update from Mr. Jones:

Surrey Urban Mission: Through the winter months, we've continued with our weekly visits to the Surrey Urban Mission. Students have been making soup and sandwiches (sometimes with veggies right from our very own community garden!) to take to the Mission, and serving lunch with their advisory groups once on-site. Well into our 10th year of supporting the Mission, this weekly visit continues to be a highlight of our service program.

Rewynd: The Entrepreneur Club has also done some wonderful work for the Surrey Urban Mission this term. The group marketed and sold their innovative "Rewynd" product, which keeps earbuds from tangling in your pocket (a problem many of us can relate to). The proceeds of their sales raised more than \$600, which will be donated to the Surrey Urban Mission. Way to go, entrepreneurs!

Project Backpack: In their advisories, our students and advisors have also been busy collecting essential living items (i.e. toques, gloves, socks, hygiene products) and filling them into backpacks for our annual Project Backpack drive. The bags were picked up on Monday, March 12th and delivered to homeless youth in the Vancouver area.

Service Club Speaker Series: Our talented Service Stewards, Sanya Grover and Amadea de Wit, have coordinated a Speaker Series in which representatives from local organizations speak to our students about their organization's mission and impact in the community. It also provides our students the opportunity to connect and seek out individual service opportunities with the visiting organizations. On Monday, March 5th, the Service Club had Michelle Ingall, Executive Director of Pacific Riding for Developing Abilities (PRDA) speak to students about the services they provide in the community. And on Friday, March 9th, the Self-Advocates of Semiahmoo House were here to speak with our students about the actions they have taken in our community!

Martha Currie Tutoring Club: A great student-led initiative started by 2018 graduate, Evanee Verma, has seen a small, but dedicated group of Southridge students working with elementary kids at Martha Currie School in Cloverdale. Our students have been making weekly visits after school to help the Martha Currie students with reading, math, and more! Here's what we've heard from Ms. Crismas (our sponsor teacher at Martha Currie), "The Martha Currie students who benefit from this program enjoy attending, are seeing improvement in their homework habits and grades, and are getting some much-



needed one-on-one attention that our teachers appreciate." Thank you to our dedicated volunteers for having an impact in the community!

- Organizing the collection of baked goods from parents as per Fraser Health's established requirements.
- Coordinating, as desired, baking volunteers to assist in additional bake table submissions for families wishing to provide a donation in-lieu.
- Organizing assigned volunteers to package, label, price and display baked goods.
- Attending committee meetings as needed.
- Determining volunteer requirements and ensuring volunteers follow policy and procedures.
- Liaising with fellow department heads to determine logistical, equipment, supply, signage and space needs for assigned area.
- Organizing and working with volunteers on Fair Day to set up, run, and tear down area as directed. Of note, hours of operation are earlier and longer than regular Fair hours, including Collection Day.
- The Department Heads must also supervise volunteers with cash.
