## Let's "Sit with" Our Students

The word assessment is derived from the Latin verb, *assidere*, which means *to sit with*. The nature of the word implies that assessment is something that we do *with* and *for* students, instead of *to* them. Meaningful dialogue about assessment involves the learner, the teacher and the parents working in partnership to "sit with" the child to support them as they develop and refine their strengths (that which they do well) and grow their weaknesses (that which they don't do well yet).

Reporting is a formal way of documenting each learner's progress, providing a snapshot of where a student is at in their learning journey at one moment in time at various intervals throughout the school year. The tricky part about report cards is that by the time a report card is written, prepared and sent home, the snapshot is likely already out of date because learning is continuous and as such the learner is always growing and changing.

As the Junior School moves forward with our work to re-calibrate our assessment and reporting practices, our goal is to provide meaningful, specific and relevant feedback to parents through a standards-based report card. As we look to re-design our Junior School report card over the year and a half, we are delighted to be able to work with Canadian and international assessment expert and author, Ken O'Connor. I first had the opportunity to work with Ken in 2011/12, while I was a part of a team working on the Junior School report card revision at Branksome Hall School in Toronto. While Ken was new to me, he was well known to many of my colleagues. The opportunity to work with Ken while I was at Branksome Hall had a significant impact on my understanding of assessment and the importance of standards-based grading and reporting. He also challenged me as a parent to reshape the kinds of conversations I was having with my own children about their grades and report cards.

Ken is known as the "Grading Doctor' because of his work to support schools with their implementation of standards-based grading and reporting practices. Ken is the author of seven books and many articles. His most recent publication is the fourth edition of his seminal book, *How to Grade for Learning: Linking Grades to Standards*. Over the last 21 years as a consultant, Ken has supported schools in 9 Canadian provinces, 46 states and 22 countries outside North America. In the forward to the 4th Edition of *How to Grade for Learning*, Instructional Coach, Garnett Hillman writes, "Ken O'Connor has touched the lives of countless educators and students through his work as a teacher, administrator, consultant, and author. His charge to improve grading practices in order to support

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student learning has consistently pushed the thinking of teachers and administrators to challenge the status quo of grading."

Ken will share his insights on grading and reporting with the Southridge community, not just as an expert educator, but also as a father and grandfather. You won't want to miss the opportunity to hear him speak on Thursday, January 11, 2018 from 7:00 - 8:30 p.m. in the Junior School Great Hall. 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## **Reporting Student Marks to Post Secondary Institutions.**

#### **Guidelines:**

Grade 12 can be an anxious time for both students and their parents. Ms. Livingston, Ms. Becker and I have been talking to our Grade 12 students to advise them of the best procedure for ensuring that their marks are reported in an accurate and timely manner. The criteria and deadlines for applying to different institutions and programs have become much more varied and complex, as institutions vie for the very best students, and we need to help our students advocate for themselves in an appropriate manner. To this end I have clarified what is, and is not, appropriate in discussing marks with their teachers. Students should not approach teachers directly for additional marks, or ask for extra assignments to generate better marks. They can, and should, ask for help in developing their skills and understanding, attend additional tutorials, work with a peer tutor – all of which may lead to the desired improvement in performance.

I have advised students that if they need to advocate for an increased mark – they are just shy of an average for a competitive program or a major scholarship for example - then the correct pathway would be to go directly to Ms. Livingston, Ms. Becker or myself. Similarly, we would ask that parents follow the same procedure and approach the University Counsellors with any specific requests or concerns. We can then discuss the most appropriate course of action and approach the teachers concerned. Please be assured that, though we must maintain our integrity as an academic institution, we will always work for the optimum benefit of all our students.


