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Junior School News

Start of the Day - Please be Punctual!

Please be reminded that our school day starts at 8 a.m. All students should be in their home room classes no later than 8:00 a.m. for attendance procedures. A welcome bell rings at 7:55 a.m. Students arriving after 8:05 a.m. are considered late and must sign in at the Junior School Reception Desk. Starting the day on time is an important part of demonstrating self-management, and sets your child up for a successful day. Thank you for your support from home in developing routines that support a punctual and positive start to the day.

Walking Registry

If your Junior School child walks home from school, please email attendance@southridge.bc.ca. If they walk home on a regular basis, one email indicating the days of the week they will be walking will suffice. Just be sure to let us know if anything changes. If they walk on an occasional basis, please email each time they are to walk home. This will help us to maintain a centralized registry of walkers.

Updated Co-Curricular Calendar

An updated version of the 2017-18 Co-Curricular calendar is now posted in the Calendars and Schedules section in the Resource Centre of the Parent Portal. Please use this schedule when planning for your child's involvement in Junior School athletics and clubs.

Illness and Injury

Should your child fall ill during the school day (e.g. fever, vomiting) or sustain an injury that warrants parent notification (e.g. head injury, suspected bone injury) you will receive a call from the school. If we cannot reach a parent directly, we will call your emergency contact. Please do not send your child to school if they have a fever, or if they are vomiting or have diarrhea. Children should be symptom free for a full 24 hours before they return to school.

Reunification Password and Drill (Save the Date!)

Please note that a **reunification password sticker** has been placed inside the cover of your child's Prep Book. Please take a photo of this sticker and save it to your phone, or write it down and keep it in your wallet. You should also share this password information

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with your emergency contact should they need to pick up your child(ren) in your place. Should an emergency evacuation of the school be required at any point this year, the password, which consists of your child's house name and student number, will be needed for your child to be released to any adult that is picking them up. Last year, we ran our first Junior School Reunification Drill. This year, we will run a full school (K-12) drill on the afternoon of Friday, May 18, 2018. Please mark your calendar now and save the date – more specific communications will come closer to the date of the drill.

Reporting Practices Update for Junior School (K-7) Parents - Tuesday, Sept. 19 @ 8:30 a.m.

Please join Mrs. de Hoog and Ms. Graham for an information session about specific updates to our MYP reporting practices at 8:30 a.m. in the Junior School Great Hall (immediately following the Junior School Assembly) on Tuesday, September 19. At this session we will explain the process and rationale behind the shift to a 5-point performance scale in the MYP Division for the December, March and June report cards, share research about assessment and reporting practices, as well as next steps in our full K-7 report card enhancement process. Both PYP and MYP parents are encouraged to attend. We appreciate that it may be challenging for many parents to attend a morning session. As such, we will have the session recorded by our AV Services department so that all parents can have the opportunity to view the presentation on-line. China Tour - Summer 2018

The Social Studies department has created an opportunity for an academic/cultural trip to China for the summer of 2018. The trip would consist of three main concentrations: Beijing, Nanjing and Hong Kong.

In Beijing the highlights would include visiting Tiananmen Square, the Forbidden City, the Temple of Heaven, the Summer Palace, and of course, a trip outside the city to walk on the Great Wall and to also visit the Ming Tombs.

In Nanjing, the highlights would include a visit to Purple Mountain, which holds the mausoleum of Sun Yat-sen, and many other spectacular sites. In Nanjing, we will also learn about the history of the city during the Second World War, which will complement their studies in the upper grades of Social Studies.

The final destination will be Hong Kong. Once again, there is a huge connection to the Second World War and the Canadians who fought there, which is taught in Socials 10. In addition, we will visit the harbour, Victoria Peak, Stanley Market, and leave some time to do some final shopping!

The trip will begin on Monday, June 25, 2018 and we will return to Vancouver on July 5, 2018. The dates will not conflict with any final exams or Grad events. The cost of the tour will be around \$4,100 and it covers all transportation, food, lodging, entrance fees, and our guides.

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Southridge Athletics:

It's an exciting time of year in the Southridge sports world. With the fall sports getting going, coaches and players are preparing for the start of their seasons. In the fall term, Southridge features both field hockey and volleyball as core sports for the girls. There is a junior and senior team for field hockey, while volleyball has a separate grade 8 team along with junior (grade 9-10), and senior (grade 10-12) squads. For the boys, soccer is the main sport. The swim team is a co-ed and along with cross-country, offers opportunities for any interested students to get involved regardless of their previous experience. Also, Ms. Lew is offering a wide range of classes in our renovated fitness centre.

Southridge is extremely fortunate to have a very high level of faculty involvement with our athletics program. Many teachers share their expertise and enthusiasm for sports, and in doing so provide so many opportunities for our student-athletes to experience this important aspect of the Southridge experience. One thing that has impressed me so far this year has been the level of support and cooperation within teams of the same sport. At an early morning junior girls field hockey practice run by Ms. Alexandra, both members of the senior team coaching staff (Mr. Barnim and Ms. Kolic) were on the sidelines taking in the session. Meanwhile, in the gym, the junior and senior volleyball teams ran parallel opening try-outs. This allowed for the coaches to share knowledge about the players and for the students across four grades to train and compete together.

Along with the coaches and sponsor teachers, our new Athletic Stewards Katherine Toy and Kale Fehr play a significant role in the promotion of our athletics program and provide announcements about exciting results and upcoming events during the weekly senior school assemblies. There are a few other reminders for students and parents. Schoology is used as the main source for team schedules and updates. Of course individual teachers can also be contacted in person or via email.

Southridge also has a longstanding policy designed to encourage grade 8 students to get involved. They are all expected to try-out each term for one of the core sports, which again are soccer for the boys and volleyball or field hockey for the girls. At the grade 8 level we try and keep as many keen and committed players involved as possible, although there are roster limitations for some of these teams. Hopefully between the fields, the gym, the fitness centre, and the pool, students can find active and enjoyable athletic options to suit their interests.









