According to educational philosopher John Dewey, a person with good judgment "is the one who can grasp the scene or situation before him, ignoring what is irrelevant, or what for the time being is unimportant, who can seize upon the factors which demand attention, and grade them according to their respective claims."

Having good judgment and exercising it in an intelligent and sensible way is an excellent descriptor of wisdom. "Another year older, another year wiser" resonates so well at Southridge because the primary focus of a Southridge education is to become a good person – someone who is wise in smarts and character. To be sure, making a difference in the world relies on both parts of our students being equally nurtured.



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Drawing the school year to a close presents a wonderful opportunity for all of us to take stock of how we have each become a bit wiser. So, I hope you will be able to celebrate with us on Friday as we reflect together on our students' successes.

Thank You to All! Advancement Year in Review

At this time, I would like to thank the Southridge Community for their generous support over the year. Our three major events, three fundraising campaigns, and the many other events and initiatives within Advancement were all great successes!

First of all, our new playground is a huge hit with our Junior School students! Phase 1 was installed in early September and Phase 2 was completed during spring break – all thanks to the generous donations we received from our parent community as well as the success of our fall gala. In total, more than \$100,000 in directed donations was raised for the playground project and donors of \$1,000 or more will be recognized on a donor wall that will be installed during the summer.

The Masquerade Ball, chaired by Jody Thomas and Anita Hundal, was a great success, raising \$185,000 for a number of projects around the school including the playground, cafeteria enhancement and landscaping. We are looking forward to another great gala next year – save the date – November 19, 2016.

The Country Fair was also a great success! The crowds came out on a beautiful day in May and were greeted by our warm and welcoming volunteers. Expenses are still being tallied, but we'll net over \$40,000! This year's revenue was earmarked for three projects: the development of our school mascot, the purchase of several additional Smart TVs and a new lawnmower. Thank you so much!

The Golf Tournament, our third major event of the year, was held only a few short weeks ago. We are still finalizing expenses, but we are able to report that over \$30,000 was raised from our parent and alumni community. Thank you to all the golfers, sponsors and dinner guests for your participation in this fun community tournament! The money we raised from this event will be used to purchase a new dividing curtain in the Senior School gymnasium, new goals for the soccer and rugby fields, and a line painter.

Our Legacy Giving Campaign was also a great success. Once again, the vast majority of our new families made multi-year pledges totaling nearly \$700,000. My personal thanks to all our canvassers and our very gracious new families who welcomed their visits! Thank you!



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Thanks to annual donations from our families, staff, friends, alumni and alumni parents, we raised over \$116,000 and donations are still coming in. This will definitely allow us to purchase all the items on our wish list, including the new scoretable for our Senior School gymnasium. In addition, a family has also established a new bursary fund – stay tuned for more information in a September issue of *The Wednesday*.

Thank you again to all our families who so generously gave this year!
