Looking Forward to a Great School Year

Welcome back to all of our students, teachers, staff and parents at the start of our new school year – our 18th. I hope the holidays were a relaxing and enjoyable time for everyone. We are really excited about the upcoming academic year. The school is in its typical state of preparation in anticipation of welcoming back our students and families next week.

Summer at Southridge was very busy this year. Our four weeks of camps were all very well attended as we welcomed close to one thousand young campers from the White Rock and South Surrey areas. There has been much painting and deep cleaning also happening around the school, not to mention landscaping work on the land surrounding our rugby field, including an expansion of the patio area outside the cafeteria. A very big addition to our campus over the summer was the final phase of our fencing project along 160th Street. The installation of vehicle and pedestrian entrance and exit gates will be completed shortly. Along with the fencing project, we are planning to add a short stretch of sidewalk to connect 160th Street with our internal walkway at the Senior School entrance (the south entrance to our property). With this additional walkway, we will have two clear, obvious pedestrian pathways for our community to use safely.

Please be aware that some of the landscaping, fencing and gate installation at the front of the school will be completed over the next few weeks. This means there may be some construction taking place on campus when school is in session. I appreciate your flexibility and understanding as we aim to complete our projects as soon as possible. You will also notice some major landscaping continuing to take place at the back of the Senior School. We have been able to take advantage of the required commitment of the local neighborhood developer and are taking the opportunity to expand our patio area to the east of the cafeteria. This will also allow us to realign our back play field to allow for an expanded end zone.

A very big thank you goes out to our community for their generosity at our fundraising events throughout the 2011-2012 academic year. Your wonderful support of Southridge has allowed us to pursue these projects during the summer of 2012, addressing some important issues regarding campus access and safety as well as attending to the general improvement of our overall campus plan.

We have a number of new families at our school this year, and I would like to take this opportunity to welcome them to our community. Starting at a new school can be a source of anxiety, but our experience has shown that our student orientations as well as our community Welcome Back Picnic go a long way to assist with the adjustment to a new environment. Besides, Southridge is a very friendly place and we are excited to have you here with us. We will do our best to help you feel welcome and well supported.

It is exciting that a new school year is just ahead of us, and I am very much looking forward to all that it will bring.

Edu-pac Availability and Class Lists

The Edu-pac supplies are available for pickup during the days of August 29- August 31, 2012. The Edu-pac supplies are not in boxes this year, but rather heavy, clear plastic bags. Once supplies are brought to school, we would like to recycle these plastic bags by sending them back to the company for reuse. It is best to bring the labeled materials to laptop rollout sessions, where we will collect the Edu-Pac bags. Class lists will be posted on the website on August 31, 2012. In order to preserve paper, the lists will not be posted in the Junior School Great Hall.

Locker Dimensions for Students in Grades 4 to 7 - Attention Grade 5 Students*

If you are planning to purchase a backpack or other school bag for your child, please keep in mind that our locker dimensions are 32 cm (depth) by 21 cm (width). Bags must be able to fit completely into lockers for safety reasons. It is difficult to find a backpack with wheels that fit into the lockers so please take a measuring tape with you when shopping. This year, all grade five students will need to purchase a backpack with these dimensions, as the school will no longer be providing roller backpacks for the laptops.

New Student Orientations and Grade 5, 6, 7 Laptop Sessions

New students (and their pre-arranged buddies) in Grades 1-7 are invited to attend our annual New Student Orientation on Wednesday, September 5, 2012. The orientation will take place between 9:00 and 9:45 am. As well, all students in Grades 5, 6 and 7 will need to attend school for a period of time on the 5th for their laptop orientation (Grade 5) and refresher (Grade 6 and 7) sessions. Students in Ms. Bennett's class will need to be at school from 8:30 - 10:00 AM, and students in Ms. Graham's class will need to be present from 10:15-11:45 AM. In Grade 6, students in Ms. Mauricio's class have their refresher from 12:30-1:15 PM, and students in Mr. Anderson's class have their refresher from 1:30-2:15 PM. Students in Ms. McNeil's Grade 7 class will have their refresher session from 2:15-3:00. Students in Mrs. Beaulieu's Grade 7 class will have their session from 3:15-4:00 PM. In order for Grades 5, 6 and 7 students to receive their laptops, all necessary paperwork (the laptop damage/loss agreement and the acceptable use policy) must be signed and submitted to homeroom teachers on September 5th. If you require any additional paperwork, these forms will be available at the Junior School office.

All students attending an orientation session on September 5th must wear their summer uniform: white Southridge golf shirt, black shorts, white ankle socks, and black dress shoes. See you on the 5th.

New to Grade 5-7 (MYP) Parent Presentation - Tuesday, September 5, 2012 4:00 - 5:00 PM

What is it like to be in Grade 5 -7 and have specialist teachers for your subjects, and use the laptop for many of your courses? Come and find out, as we present 'A Day in the Life of an MYP'. This parent session is open to all our existing Grade 4 parents who will be Grade 5 parents next year, and new parents to Southridge. Come and hear presentations about the laptop programme, MYP and the IB philosophy, homework (prep) expectations with time management strategies, an overview of the adolescent years and how we support their learning in the MYP, as well as an overview of term tests. Kindergarten Orientation and Gradual Entry Process

All kindergarten children will attend school on Friday, September 7, from 8:00 a.m. until 10:30 a.m. (no lunch will be needed, just a snack). During the first full week of school, there will be a gradual entry process in place for all kindergarten students. No lunch will be needed until Thursday, September 13, 2012. Please plan to attend our meet the teacher evening on Thursday September 20 at 7:00 PM. This provides an excellent opportunity for you to connect with our classroom teachers and understand the routines and expectations in each class. Earlier in the evening, we are also offering an 'Introduction to PYP' (Primary Years Program) for any of our new families from 6:30 – 7:00 PM that evening so that we can explain the philosophy and teaching practices of an International Baccalaureate World School (IB). Ms. Shanaz Ramji-Motani, our PYP Coordinator, will be pleased and honoured to explain our program.

Communicating Scheduled Late Arrivals and Unscheduled Sicknesses

Remember that absences and late arrivals must be called into the school. If it is more convenient for you, simply call the school before it opens in the morning (or even the night before) and leave a message regarding your child's situation. You may also email Barb Schaub at attendance@southridge.bc.ca and leave an email communication. Even if you communicate to your child's teacher, we cannot guarantee that this message will be forwarded to the office. Please ensure this communication to the office comes directly from you. This will help us keep on top of our attendance records. Thanks for your help. Additionally, please ensure that each school day you do not drop off your child any earlier than 7:40 AM as appropriate supervision will not be available until that time.

School Uniforms

There have been virtually no changes to the school uniform over the summer. Please ensure that your child attends the first day of school dressed properly. Boys' hair must be tidy in appearance, and its length must be off the collar with the earlobe showing. Uniform regulations include no dying of hair. If your son or daughter's hair had an adjustment to its colour over the summer, kindly ensure that it is back to its natural tone by September 6, 2012. Students who attend school in violation of our uniform regulations (including dyed hair) will not be permitted to attend class until such time that their uniform infractions have been ameliorated. Of course, the overriding principle of the Southridge uniform is that the students wear them with pride. Shoes should be polished and the uniform should be neat and clean. Recall that the students are representatives of Southridge and are recognized because of the uniform. I know our students are proud of our school- let that be reflected in the pride of wearing the uniform well. Thanks for your cooperation.

Along with the expansion of shop hours, we will also be expanding the selection of "extra" Southridge spirit wear and items. Over the last few years, our uniform supplier has been inconsistent in delivery, a situation that Barb is busy remedying by focusing on sourcing new suppliers. The Uniform Shop will be carrying scarves, lunch bags, neoprene tablet sleeves, Hue Opaque Tights and Land's End fleece vests and jackets as part of their spirit wear collection.

To make space for our new items, the shop will no longer be carrying used clothing articles. Used clothing articles will be offered as a Grad fundraiser this year.

2011/2012 Fundraising Results and Decisions

What a year we had in 2011/2012! It gives me great pleasure to announce that we surpassed our fundraising results for all 3 events from the previous year! The Fall Fundraiser, Country Fair and Golf Tournament raised \$120,000.00, \$54,000.00

and \$20,000.00 respectively. It was an amazing year for us and we hope to be able to keep the momentum going in 2012/2013. Thank you everyone for your generous support!

In addition, venue location of future Fall Fundraisers has also been looked at and decided upon. For several years now, announcements have been made that this year will be the last year the Fall Fundraiser will be held at the school; only to find it held at the school once again. We wanted to clarify why this has happened and announce what we will be doing going forward. In previous year's we had hoped to find a location offsite that would fill our needs and keep costs down, so the search went on in the surrounding area to find this space. After an extensive hunt, we were unsuccessful in finding this location – it doesn't seem to exist at the present time in close proximity. Therefore, this year's event will be held at the school and it will be a Gala (unlike last years' unGala). We will alternate between the two formats to be as inclusive as possible to our community. Going forward, we will be holding these events at the school and for several reasons. The first and foremost is that there isn't an adequate space in the area that would fulfill our needs for this event. Also, logistically, there are issues regarding the transportation and security of moving the hundreds of the auction items to an offsite location, as well as the issues surrounding the accessibility to our payment system we use for check-out at the end of the evening. We have spent considerable time analyzing the costs of having it at the school and made some modifications so that we can keep costs down and still have a spectacular venue. We may look into holding this event offsite one day, but for now and in the foreseeable future, Southridge will be the home of the Fall Fundraiser.
