The Value of Our National Association

Last week I spent four days in Toronto at the annual CAIS (Canadian Accredited Independent Schools) Heads and Chairs Conference. Our national organization is an accrediting body but it also has a professional development focus as well as a student events focus. This year's Heads and Chairs Conference was hosted by Upper Canada College and St. Clement's School, and the theme was sustainability and strategy. There were many highlights, not least of which was listening to great speakers who are experts in their area and engaging in really purposeful dialogue with other heads, board chairs and business managers from across the country. (Ms. Hector and her colleagues from other CAIS schools were also in attendance at this year's conference).

At the banquet on Friday evening, there was an opportunity to say good-bye to and recognize retiring heads of school from across the country. This year, the heads of West Point Grey Academy, Mr. Clive Austin, and Havergal College (Toronto), Dr. Susan Groesbeck, were recognized. The presentation to Dr. Groesbeck was particularly interesting because it highlighted an important aspect of CAIS. To bid farewell to their colleague, the heads of the three other Toronto girls' schools gathered together for a combined effort that demonstrated their friendship, mutual support and respect for one another. At CAIS conferences, there is the opportunity to share stories and find out how other schools are dealing with various issues, but I think we take for granted the other benefit of the conference – that despite the explicit or implicit competition between some of our schools (especially those in close geographic proximity to another), the friendships we make through CAIS and the memories that result are worth a great deal.

The presentation to Dr. Groesbeck made me think of our students and the experiences they have because of our association with other schools – through both CAIS and the ISABC (Independent School Association of British Columbia). Most often our students come together with their peers in friendly athletic and academic competitions, play days and festivals. But our students also have special opportunities to form friendships around the world by way of our service learning trips, our athletic tours, our academic trips, our exchange program and various competitions. These kinds of experiences really enrich the Southridge experience because they help to develop connections and relationships that last a lifetime.

A strong value of a Southridge education lies in the opportunities our students are presented with during their time here. Taking advantage of all of our programs and making friendships through a variety of experiences really helps to make Southridge a special place for people. When there is a strong sense of connection with school, we know that students learn and grow in terrifically holistic ways. Southridge has never been about just the academics. Southridge is a community that aims to draw out the very best in its students, and we accomplish this when they experiences the fullness of what our school has to offer.

When our founding headmaster, Mr. Brown, said that Southridge is a serious place of lighthearted purpose, he was making reference to the fact that our school is the kind of place where we work hard but still have a good time doing it. Our school is the kind of place where students engage with peers from other schools to make friendships and develop relationships that supplement classroom experiences. Mr. Brown knew that great schools make connections with other schools. He also knew that we shouldn't take ourselves too seriously, even though we should be serious about what we do.

Close Call Serves to Remind

Lately, we are reminded of how fortunate we are when we view the events of the past few days as our context: the 7.7 earthquake off the coast of Haida Gwaii, and the devastating weather effects brought on by Super Storm Sandy. Indeed, the impact of Mother Nature cannot be fully predicted or prepared for in every circumstance. You can never prepare entirely for the unexpected, but you can anticipate eventualities, and apply the best practices for safety. These unfortunate events serve as reminders for readiness, and the precise reason why we have drills at Southridge. Each year we have three fire drills in the Fall and three in the Spring—we try to vary the times that these occur and they are unannounced drills for our faculty as well. Additionally, we have 2 earthquake drills and a lockdown drill. The purpose of the drill is to implement protocol and awareness—sort of habits—so that when an unpredictable does occur, we can easily fall into the pattern of what we know to do. Although these drills are not pleasant, we want our students to practice so that they can react in a calm, predictable manner for everyone's safety. We do take your child's safety very seriously—and these events serve to remind us again to ensure that our practices our streamlined and effective.

This coming Thursday, we are proud to host an Open House for our community to come and converse with our great people about our educational program at Southridge. Midterm Report Arrives Home This Week

Happy Halloween! As you read this perhaps you are continually answering the door for trick or treaters. Maybe you are waiting for the kids to arrive back from their own 'treating' or just finding out all of the news from the day of costumes in the Senior School. I know our Senior Boys Soccer Team is enroute to Victoria to participate in what we all hope is a highly successful Provincial Championships! It is a fun and certainly frenetic day filled with sugar! It also adds to a week that involves the Mid-Term Report coming home likely on Friday and the theme of my Wednesday submission this week.

It is important to remember that this report's grades (both percentages and effort) represent only a small number of assessments to date. In some cases, for classes that only meet a few times per cycle, teachers may have noted an "IP" (in progress).

The Interim Report is intended to provide students and their parents with a general sense of the student's academic performance and effort in each subject in these opening weeks. For the next reporting period, with the term's work having been fully completed, the marks will reflect far more accurately each student's progress in a given class. This is planned for a December 14th distribution. It is one week later than the Interim report last year due to the Leadership Experience Week that occurred this year.

In addition to the actual report, we will be including the rubric that is used to assess a student's effort for each class. Hopefully, this will provide a clearer understanding of your son or daughter's effort grades and, if necessary, aid them in understanding how to improve within a specific area.

Comments have been provided for all Grade 8 students, new students to Southridge, and those students who received an effort grade of '2' or below. In the next reporting period, all students will receive comments for each class as well as a comment from their Advisors.

As always, parents should feel comfortable with contacting teachers at any time with questions regarding their son or daughter's progress. Students can also consult with teachers on a daily basis. This is an excellent way to continually gauge the learning that is occurring or any impediments that might be causing difficulties in this process.

Although the competition was fierce, with participants vying for positions on the Canadian and American public speaking teams that will compete at the World Debating and Public Speaking Championships in South Africa next spring, all of the competitors were very supportive of each other. On the debating and public speaking circuits, the IISPSC is known for being an unusually friendly and cooperative tournament.

An added bonus to this year's championships was a day trip to Banff where competitors were invited to explore the Canadian Rocky Mountains. One of the highlights of this part of the trip, for me, was listening to a particularly extroverted young man from Bermuda respond to the beauty of the Rockies with a complete sense of awe and wonder. I am told that, later in the day, he was given a lesson on "good" snow and "bad" snow as he became embroiled in his first snowball fight. As no one on our team had ever been to the IISPSC before, Serena is to be commended for earning a place in the finals for dramatic interpretation, placing second overall after the regular rounds of competition.

We should all be very proud of the way that Cassia, Serena and Abby represented Southridge throughout the tournament. They were worthy competitors and great ambassadors for our school.

This year's top overseas school was The Doon School (Uttaranchal, India). The top American school was The Hotchkiss School (Lakeville, Connecticut) and the top Canadian school was Branksome Hall (Toronto, Ontario.)

Daily Digest and Menu for the Week of November 5th – 9th

Southridge Café is a great place to enjoy many healthy, fresh options but also some that take care of those cravings that aren't everyday choices. Come into our Café and see all the wonderful and delicious items we have to offer. We have always tried to keep our pricing quite low but unfortunately we just can't hold back the things that are happening around the world that directly affects our costs of doing business. I just wanted to share with you some information that was sent to us from our head office regarding some price increases in everyday products. We will try to keep our pricing lower than our competition and continue serving good health options. Our prices increases won't be immediate but gradual and I will let everyone know as to the new prices when it happens.

Our primary poultry supplier (Olymel) have increased their prices across the board on all chicken and Turkey products, effective November 1st, 2012. Reasons for the increases are twofold. The cost of the live birds to the manufacturer has increased by up to 30 % over the past year (our pricing hasn't changed since 2011) and in the case of Turkey supply is limited, resulting in higher pricing. Canadian Marketing Boards dictate what the pricing will be and it's expected that we will have another two increases before the end of the year.

The weather this year has played havoc with the fruit crops in North America. Michigan and Ontario account for 80% of the North American cherry supply. The unusually warm spring weather caused the buds to blossom early. Unfortunately the weather changed dramatically with spring frosts setting in. The damage caused greatly reduced the 2012 harvest, especially in cherries and blueberries. Suppliers have been trying to source raw material from Europe which is coming at a premium. Poland has reported a 35% - 50% reduction in cherries adding to the price pressures. Compass pricing will be increasing an average of 4.25%.






