## **Junior School News**

## The Faculty of Southridge - 21<sup>st</sup> Century Learners

Once a term, a group of Junior School teachers meet over sushi in our staff room to discuss the latest educational journal selected for our professional reading club. This group, consisting of various PYP, MYP and specialist teachers, voluntarily meets once a term to discuss, debate, critique, digest and challenge a different educational book or journal with their peers. Sometimes educational journals can be somewhat dry and challenging to comprehend—however, when reviewed in a collaborative setting with colleagues and peers, these philosophies can be distilled down and internalized. Two of our Junior School teachers started this professional book club—since its inception, it has grown to over 12 members, the membership fluctuating dependent on the book, or the time of year. Our last book was Tony Wagner's Creating Innovators—The Making of Young People Who Will Change the World addressed the characteristics of a 21 century learner and how schools can teach students to be creative innovators. Whilst discussing this book, it became apparent to the teachers present that our mission statement at Southridge School actually encompasses all the attributes of what a 21<sup>st</sup> century learner should be. It was affirming and validating to see that these attributes are timeless, and that the early founders of our school had these core attributes of learning encapsulated so well. I encourage you to reread the entire mission statement—it reinforces to me why I send my son to Southridge, and why I am so proud to be here.

- Tuesday, January 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2013 is a competitive meet at UBC hosted by Mulgrave. (for Grades 5-7, plus Grade 4 club swimmers optional)

#### **Remembrance Day Ceremony**

In past submissions and posts I have commented on the unique perspective I can have at a ceremony being on the stage and looking out at the students, guests and parents. Last Friday during our Remembrance Day Ceremony in the gym, I was allowed another chance to learn from this particular vantage point.

Perhaps for lack of a clearer term, the overall feeling I gained from the experience was an incredibly deep sense of pride of being part of this amazing community and especially the students and staff. In fact, the feeling began earlier in the week when the PYP and MYP Choirs came to visit the Senior School to rehearse. It is always a special time to see the interaction that occurs when the younger and older students collaborate. There is excitement, smiles and an overall general sense of enjoyment. In fact, after the rehearsal finished there were a few cheers and clapping. The students sensed that the performance was going to be good!

As the Head of Senior School, and perhaps from the era that I grew up in, I am always hopeful that a ceremony such as Remembrance holds a certain high level of respect for the students. I do think it helps that people my age have a closer proximity to those that served in the Great Wars. In addition, as we grow older we realize the importance of these types of events and why they remain important to continue. So, at the assembly on the Monday, prior to the ceremony, I asked the students to show their respect through their attire (Number 1 uniform looking good), behaviour (quietly reflective) and focus (attuned to the importance of remembering).

If you attended the ceremony, you will know that they followed through to the highest level I, or anyone could ask for! As they came down the hallway to the gym, they were self-checking their uniform, setting themselves up to be focussed and reflective and helping others in their Advisories to do the same. The students that had major parts in the ceremony were simply brilliant! The poems and reflections read, the media productions created and the introductions to different speakers were all done with an amazing level of attuned understanding of the day.

Returning to the beginning of my post, the best part from my vantage point was seeing the audience's reaction to two different events in the ceremony. First, the band and choir performance that involved students from Grades 2-12 was phenomenal! But to watch the audience's reaction made it even more impressive! So many parents and students mouth dropped open as they focussed on the moment, forgetting about themselves and immersing themselves in the music!

Second, as our guest speaker had his son read his words, the audience waited on his every word. You could see the amazement in trying to recall his experiences and reflections. Finally, our trumpeter, Jaren Wong, played flawlessly to finish the ceremony and to be beside our veteran as he stood tall and saluted proudly throughout was a perfect finale to the event.

I know the students "get it" and they continually remind me of the possibility of youth and the difference they can make right now! It is an inspiring position to be in on a daily basis.

## Southridge Writes: A Powerful Tool for the Assessment 'of ' and 'for' Learning

Last Wednesday all the students in the Senior School were given a one line prompt - Self-awareness leads to meaningful change – and given one classroom period to compose a written prose response. This whole school assessment of student writing is done with several key objectives in mind.

Importantly, for the individual student it is a summative assessment of his or her ability to create a multi-paragraph composition on a given topic in an engaging, thoughtful, grammatically sound and stylistically adept manner. To this degree it is an assessment 'of' the learning in the skills of written English that has taken place to this point in a student's development. We do take into account the age and maturity of the students, but they are graded using the rubrics used in provincial Grade 10 and Grade 12 examinations. In terms of assessment 'for' learning, the student can clearly see where he or she stands in relation to provincial standards and, with the teacher's help, can identify areas of strength and areas of composition needing further development. It is a powerful tool for self-reflection and growth.

Secondly, it provides the English faculty with invaluable professional development and enables them to align their marking to a common understanding of the 6 point scale used in the provincial examination rubrics. As the papers are identified by an ID number and teacher's name only, it further enables us to more objectively measure the student's ability. The discussions that take place as we mark papers, exchange ideas, and seek to work to improve student writing, are invaluable. Lastly, the shared experience of marking each grade at the same time gives us a good overall snapshot of the writing strengths and weaknesses of our student body. We can thus formulate 'an action plan' to address areas that need improvement at each grade level and target our teaching to those areas much more effectively. In this respect the assessment is truly 'for' the future learning of our students.

I hope that gives a little insight into why we believe that "Southridge Writes" plays an important role in improving the quality of our students' writing.
