The students, teachers and staff of Southridge invite you to join us for our Remembrance Day Ceremony. There will be reserved seating identified for parents, grandparents and guests. Students will begin to assembly at 10:10 AM for our 10:15 AM start time. The assembly will run for about an hour will include a moment of silence at about 11:00 am. The Last Post and Rouse will be played by Jared Wong (Grade 11). Mr. Brian Carse, father of McKayla in Grade 2, will play the bagpipes for this special occasion. Please join us.

Over the past few years we have worked at creating a Senior School Educational Program. Graphically, this has taken the form of a wheel divided into three main parts: knowledge, skills and attitudes. Each of these three main parts is further subdivided and gives a detailed view of what are essential components that students need to have in order to be successful in post-secondary education and beyond.

Throughout this time we have begun to implement the program in a number of ways, which have included creating a new timetable, introducing new Advanced Placement (AP) and other courses, increasing experiential education opportunities, reducing class size, and expanding the Senior School facility to allow for further flexibility in timetabling. This explains our first phase of implementation.

Over the past number of months we have formulated a new phase of this implementation. If you were able to attend the Senior School Mini-School Night, you would have heard me speak very briefly about a few aspects of this plan. In addition, we promised to have another evening that would allow a greater amount of time to share some key aspects of the plan.

With this in mind, we invite you to join us on Monday, November 19<sup>th</sup>, 2012 at 6:30 PM. in the Alan Brown Great Hall. We will be sharing further details of our implementation plan and explaining the SSEP in greater depth. In addition, we hope that this evening will afford you an opportunity to ask any questions you may have.
