PRAYER AND SACRAMENTS

Liturgical opportunities are available to all students and prayer is an integral part of our daily experience in the classroom. Morning Mass is offered weekly and we gather to celebrate Mass as a school community at least once per month. Weekly Eucharistic prayer services are offered before school. Students have opportunities to serve as Eucharistic Ministers, participate in rosary, prayer services, adoration, and reconciliation.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Totino-Grace staff members have answered their vocational call to education and witness their commitment to Christ every day. We strive to enrich the faith of students at their particular stage of development, complementing the role of the parish and family. Totino-Grace provides opportunities for students to make their faith living, conscious, and active. The Religion Department guides our students to articulate the Catholic understanding of scripture, tradition, liturgy, sacraments, vocations, prayer, moral decision-making, and social responsibility in a pluralistic society.

RETREATS

Retreats are a unique way for students at Totino-Grace to put in practice the four pillars of the school: learning, faith, community, and service. Each year, students are required to participate in one day-long retreat, providing them the opportunity to examine their faith and bond with classmates through prayer, reflection, and guided community building activities.

MISSION AND SERVICE

As a Catholic Lasallian school we have a strong focus on the most vulnerable in our community and providing our students with opportunities to answer the Gospel call to serve others. Although it is not required, Totino-Grace students log more than 16,300 volunteer hours each year through local and international mission trips and after-school service opportunities. This number translates to 22 hours per student on average.
