
PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES (Thank You)


- 1. Support school officials in their efforts to develop and maintain well-disciplined schools.


BREAKFAST AND LUNCH PROGRAM

From the Nurse's Office

Parents, please help keep our Peanut/Tree Nut Lunch table allergen free and safe for our students! Some students are allergic to peanuts and others are allergic to all nuts. Exposure to peanut alternatives such as cashew or almond products may cause an allergic reaction in students who are allergic to Tree Nuts. Our staff is also making sure that the Peanut/Tree Nut lunch table is nut-free.

We are in need of girls clothes (mostly pants and underwear) for our kindergarten and first graders. If you have any gently used little girls clothes you no longer have a use for, please consider donating to Eastside nurse's office. Medication Policy

Sometimes it is necessary for children to take medications during the school day. Due to Wisconsin State Law all prescription medication must have a permission slip signed by a parent and doctor on file. Non-prescription medications must have permission slip signed by a parent. These medication forms may be picked up in the school office. No medications will be sent home with a child. Medications must be in their original containers with the following information printed on the container. Students full name, Name and dosage of the medication, time to be given and practitioner's name. All medication must be kept in the nurse's office and administered by the nurse, Mrs. Peterson, Please refer to the student/parent handbook for detailed information.

Fall is the season of: back to school, football, pumpkins, Halloween costumes, and *lice?* Yes lice. Summer camps, vacations, sleep-overs, and sports with helmets can all be prime opportunities for sharing lice. Did you know that the average person has had lice for 4-6 weeks before it is discovered? That makes this time of the year one of the peak seasons for lice discovery.

Lice happens! Now is a great time to get in the habit of checking your child's scalp periodically for lice.

What to look for:

Intense itching and scratching of the scalp

Visible redness or sores from itching

To check child's head for lice it is best to be in a well-lit room or natural sunlight. Be on the look-out for nits (eggs) and lice

Nits are tiny tear-drop shaped eggs that attach to the hair shaft. They often appear yellowish-whitish and can look like dandruff, but cannot be washed off or blown away like dandruff can.

Lice are small insects the size of a sesame seed. They can adapt to match hair color, but are usually tan or gray. They do no jump or fly, but they move quickly and can be hard to see. Lice often are found around the ears or on the nape of the neck.

What to do if nits or lice are found

Check all household members' heads and treat anyone with lice or nits. There are many different over the counter, prescription, and homeopathic options. For more information you can contact your school nurse or health care provider.

Please notify your child's school and daycare. This helps us in tracking and efforts in preventing transmission in school. It is also a good idea to notify any close contacts such as friends, teammates, neighbors, or extended family.

AFTER SCHOOL

Bus students line up in the cafeteria (the exception of 3rd and 4th grade they wait in their classroom for the bus to be called) all are escorted to their busses by school personnel. Other students are encouraged to leave the school grounds promptly unless they have after school activities.

LEAVING SCHOOL GROUNDS

Once students arrive at school, they are to remain here until 3:10 p.m. or until their bus arrives. Parent/guardians can make special arrangements with the school. Because of the school's concern and liability for your children, please send a note he/she needs to leave school before 3:10 p.m. The child will need to be signed out in the office.

PARKING

As a reminder, the pick-up and drop-off area is the back parking lot with the entrance from Scheuerell Lane. The Elizabeth Lane area is off limits for pick-up, drop-off and parking. The main office lot is for busses and day care vans only.

SAFE ARRIVAL

The staff at Eastside Elementary School shares your concern about the safe arrival of children at school. Parental cooperation in calling, if a child is absent or tardy, has been excellent and is greatly appreciated. In an effort to make calling more convenient, the call-in machine is available to take your messages 24 hours a day.

EAGLE PRIDE BEHAVIOR PROGRAM is up and running. Ask your child what they are doing for this program.

PAYMENT OF FEES AT EASTSIDE

Payment of fees/lunch money may vary from school to school. Please consider the following points when sending money to school:

- a. It is best to pay by check rather than cash.
- Checks should be made out to SUN PRAIRIE AREA SCHOOL DISTRICT (SPASD),
 not to a teacher.
- c. It is helpful to us if you send money to school in an envelope marked with your
 - child's name, the amount enclosed, and the purpose of the money.
- d. **Do not write one check for field trips and lunch etc**. Please make out separate checks. Each check should be made out to SPASD. They are going into separate accounts.
- e. Checks for book orders should be made out to the name of the Book Club.

(E.S.C.O.) EASTSIDE SCHOOL COMMUNITY ORGANIZATION

(E.S.C.O.) is a group of parents and educators who work together to provide many activities and resources for your school. In past years this group has sponsored assemblies, family programs, extracurricular activities, and other special events. We will keep you informed of E.S.C.O. activities and encourage you to become involved in this fine group! A full roster of this year's meetings will be announced as soon as a calendar has been finalized. Similar names in the past have been PTA or PTO. Members do not just fundraise, they find out what is happening at Eastside; meet and interact with other parents; interact with instructors; and provide additional resources to help Eastside children become successful.

ANNUAL ASBESTOS NOTIFICATION

September 05, 2018

As a result of the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), every school district is required to complete a comprehensive asbestos inspection and develop a management plan for all asbestos-containing building materials (ACBM), present within the district. In an effort to comply with this regulation, the Sun Prairie Area School District had all buildings owned or leased by the District initially inspected by an Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), accredited inspector and any samples taken and analyzed by an independent laboratory. This information was then utilized to develop a comprehensive asbestos management plan.

A comprehensive re-inspection by an accredited inspector of all ACBM is required every 3 years, while periodic 6-month surveillance is an additional requirement. Beginning in July, 1998, the Sun Prairie Area School District contracted Environmental Management Consulting, Inc. (EMC), to perform 3- year re-inspections and 6-month surveillances for all district buildings.

Environmental Management Consulting, Inc. has completed the most recent comprehensive asbestos inspection and management plan, with this report available for your review during normal business hours in the Facilities and Grounds office. Copies of this report are also available to upon request.

All ACBM found within the District has been identified, with location and condition assessed. Any areas noted as being in moderate to poor condition will be repaired or removed. A district long-range management plan of all ACBM has been developed.

Communication

In an effort to ensure that the majority of our time is spent with students we will be utilizing monthly newsletters that will be sent to all ALP families at the end of each month. In the newsletter we will be giving information about upcoming events and information to support your children at home. There will be an update for each grade level. Math 24 Club

We are in the process of planning a Math 24 club at Eastside which will be offered to 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students. Some of the students in 4th and 5th grade will have the opportunity to compete at the regional tournament in the Spring. More information will follow.

Yahara River Writers

This is an opportunity for 5th grade students to enter a writing competition. Students can select from short stories, poetry, editorials or editorial cartooning. There are also opportunities for students to submit artwork for the cover and divider pages. I will be introducing this to students the week of October 8th. Students that are interested will be asked to complete a form with their intent. A rough draft will need to be submitted by December 1. I will work with students to edit and finalize their pieces and prepare them for submission. In early January we judge the local pieces and select the top 10 pieces per grade level, per category to continue on to the regional competition.

Winn Math

WINN (What I Need Now) Math program is starting this year for students who have demonstrated that they are proficient in the standards being taught in the unit. They will be set up with a Google Classroom account and will be placed in a virtual classroom with other students who have also shown that they are proficient. The building ALPS will be checking in with them and assisting them in their extended learning. This does not mean that your child has been identified as an Advanced Learner or that identified students will be doing each unit. The ALP specialist and the classroom teacher are working together to meet the needs of your child and to ensure their most optimal learning progression.
