Best Buddies - Club that promotes social inclusion for students with and without disabilities through developing one-to-one, meaningful friendships both in and outside of school. New members are encouraged to join throughout the year.

Creative Writing – Do you like writing? Do you like writing about LITERALLY (we will discuss what is/isn't literal) any topic that you find interesting? In the whole world? Fiction or nonfiction? Join "THE CREATIVE WRITING CLUB" and we will literally (see!) read and write about all kinds of cool stuff.

Drama Club - Wanted: Singers, actors, actresses and dancers. Do you love to sing? Or is dancing your thing? Or do you just like hammin' it up? If you said yes to any of these questions, then Drama Club is for you. You will be unable to sign up for another after school activity if you are interested in being a member of the Drama Club. Drama Club is held on Mondays and Thursday until 5:30 pm.

Homework Club – Open to all grades. This club offers a great chance to get ahead on homework. You do not have to attend every session.

Intramurals Session 1 or Session 2 – This co-ed program allows students an opportunity to exercise in athletic activities and team sports. Note the dates of the two sessions and choose either Session 1 or Session 2. If space permits, you may have a chance to join both sessions. This will be determined at a later date.

Jazz Band - This is a club for instrumentalists who want to gain experience learning and playing jazz music. Students will learn about and play different styles of jazz while developing listening skills and improvisational skills on their instrument. Jazz Band members have to opportunity to perform in various concerts during the spring semester. All instrument groups are welcome. Students who wish to play drum set, piano, or bass or electric guitar will need to audition for Mr. Boccia prior to our first meeting (excluding returning members who play these instruments). Jazz Band begins **in January after winter break and meets every Tuesday after school.**

Mathcounts - This is a national math club and competition program for grades 6 -8 designed to challenge and motivate students to develop strong math skills in preparation for the MATHCOUNTS competition. Our club is also a place to simply have fun solving math puzzles!

Mural Design Team- This club is for serious middle school artists, who “think out of the box” and want to explore painting with more intensity than their art classes can offer. Students will actively participate, and collaborate to create murals in the building. They will leave lasting, meaningful “impression” on the walls of ESMS. Space is limited.

Natural Helpers - Natural Helpers learn and promote effective ways to help and support their peers and contribute to creating a safe school environment. Space is limited. An application and interview with club advisors will be required. Applications are in the main office.

Newspaper Club - Do you have an interest in news reporting? Then you should join Newspaper Club! We will be writing articles, taking student and staff polls, photographing events and reporting the news here at East Shore with our very own newspaper. No previous newspaper experience or camera necessary to join.

Science Club – A team building experience with hands-on activities. Science club offers activities and challenges that are enhancements to the science curriculum. Some activities involve microscope work, building challenges, chemicals properties and motion. These projects require members to think outside the box, communicate clearly and cooperate with one another as they work to find solutions.

STEAM - Science | Technology | Engineering | Art | Math. We will explore areas related to STEAM and build an Underwater ROV (remotely operated vehicle). This ROV may even be entered into competition. Other areas of TEC Ed may be explored as well.

Spanish Club – Do you have a love of languages? Does the idea of learning about foreign countries excite you? In Spanish club, we will look at the cultures and countries of the Spanish-speaking world. We will learn about sports, food, music, architecture and many other aspects of where Spanish is spoken.

Student Council -Student Council helps to empower young leaders. Its members care deeply about their global, state, and local communities. They work hard to set a positive example, create school spirit, and promote unity for all. Make A Wish, JDRF, The Water Project, and Gifts for Grandparents are just some of the many charities the Student Council has supported in the past. The East Shore Student Council plays an instrumental role in food collection during The Thanks For Giving Food Drive each year as well.

Unified Sports – As part of the Special Olympics, ESMS Unified Sports team is looking for selected peers to support, encourage, and build friendships with one another as part of an afterschool program. This team is meant to bring people together while providing positive experiences through practices and tournaments for a variety of sports and activities.

Volleyball Club - This club will help students learn the basic skills of volleyball and build from what they have learned in gym class. They will learn each player's position and how to play in a game setting.
