### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- Dr. Beresford shared with the Board that CHS teacher Sarah Wolff is now a Top 3 Finalist for the Indiana State Teacher of the Year. He shared that Sarah delivered an impressive presentation during the State of the Schools OneZone Chamber Luncheon.
- Dr. Beresford reported that through the tremendous generosity of the Carmel community and the dedication of committed volunteers, the Carmel Summer Meals Program was able to serve 179 children, 69 families and 23,806 meals during the 11 week summer break.
- Dr. Beresford shared that it was a busy weekend for Carmel athletics. He reported that the Carmel High School football team defeated North Central in triple overtime 41-40. He mentioned that he participated in the Clay Middle School Trojan Trot and that there was also a great turnout for the Creekside Cat Race. He shared that both the CHS girls and boys cross country teams won the MIC Championship, the CHS girls golf team won the IHSAA Regionals, the boys tennis team won the MIC Championship and the girls soccer team defeated Zionsville at Pack the House Night.
- Dr. Beresford was excited to report that the Marching Greyhounds won the Bands of America Oxford Regional Championship in Ohio.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT (CONT'D)

- Dr. Beresford shared that he attended a reception at the high school that recognized the 45 National Merit Semifinalists and their parents. He shared that these hardworking students represent the top 1% of students that take the PSAT exam their junior year. Dr. Beresford shared an impressive statistic that Carmel High School has more National Merit Semifinalists than some U.S. states.
- Dr. Beresford reported to the Board that students in the Carmel High School culinary program showcased their talents at the International Arts Festival. He stated that they cooked and served delicious foods such as autumn bratwursts and Belgium waffles with pumpkin butter.
- Dr. Beresford shared that that he attended the CHS fall musical, EDGES. He stated that the musical was very entertaining and the talented students and staff did a wonderful job making this musical a big success.
- Dr. Beresford stated that this week is homecoming week! He shared that the high school has a spirit week which includes creative themes such as Holiday Day, The Year 3000, Vine/Meme Day, Dynamic Duo Day and Blue & Gold Day. He stated that he is looking forward to attending the homecoming parade this Friday at 1 p.m.
- Dr. Beresford shared that the next workshop will be October 8 and the topic will be Graduation Pathways.
- Dr. Beresford stated that Orchard Park Elementary's student run bookstore, Quakenbooks, will be hosting their annual book sale this Saturday from noon to 3 p.m.
- Dr. Beresford shared his "bell ringer," which was that he attended the Superintendent, Principal and Student Advisory Council. When he asked students about their favorite subjects, he stated that students' favorite lessons included aspects of real-world problem solving, student choice and student voice.

#### Carmel Clay Schools Names Chard Reid Assistant Principal of Prairie Trace Elementary

Carmel, IN – Carmel Clay Schools' Board of Trustees voted to approve Mr. Chard Reid as the next assistant principal of Prairie Trace Elementary during a board meeting held September 24th. Mr. Reid will start his new position in October.

For the past six years, he has served as a Carmel High School business teacher, DECA advisor, International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Program Coordinator and coach for the Carmel High School varsity men's golf team. Within those roles, he was responsible for providing support to nearly 1400 students and 27 teachers.
