Failure is in Our DNA

“27th Time Lucky for Southridge?” read the headline in the Peace Arch News on March 25, 1995. Most of our current Southridge families probably don’t realize that our school almost never got off the ground.

When our founding parents began to think about providing an educational option for families in South Surrey/White Rock back in 1993, the idea was not well received. Our team of committed parents went to Surrey city council with their proposal time and time again. Every time they presented their proposal for a new independent school starting in Grandview Heights area, council voted them down.

On the eve of going to council for the 27th time (!), one of our parents expressed the sentiment of the Southridge team, “We don’t see how we could go through this again. Every time we fail, we have to make a complete new start.” Every time a proposed development site was turned down an entirely new site needed to be identified, and a completely new proposal needed to be developed.

In a period of roughly 18 months, Southridge went to council 27 times, which means our founding parents relentlessly pursued their goal (it was a *dream*, really) at a pace in excess of one council meeting per month. They failed 26 times before finally gaining city approval, which was ultimately decided by a differential of just one vote.

I am very thankful, as I am sure you are as well, that our parents didn’t give up. I am grateful for their commitment, their resolve, their dedication and their perseverance, but I am most thankful for the example they set for our community of learners.

In an age filled with heightened anxiety around the notion of failing, I think it is absolutely wonderful that the founding of our school is steeped in a story that demonstrates how the realization of a dream truly plays out – not as a yellow brick road of achievement filled with success after success, but as an undulating passage of ascent met with obstacles, hazards and failures . . . and countless opportunities to learn and grow.

Indeed, failure is in our DNA, and I am truly proud it is a vital part of our humble heritage.

27th time lucky for Southridge?

*Grandview Hts.
site may be last
chance for school*

"We don't see how we could go through this again. Every time we fail, we have to make a complete new start."

That's David Alderdice, glumly contemplating what will happen if Surrey city council rejects the Southridge School proposal in Grandview Heights, the 27th site the private school's backers have proposed.

Alderdice is one of 10 directors for the school. He and his wife, Trisha, have devoted the last year to getting the project off the ground, or rather, finding a plot of ground to put it on.

Early in 1994, the city rejected a site on 152nd Street near Highway 10 because it was zoned industrial and deemed inappropriate for a private school. That's when Alderdice, who wants his two children to attend Southridge, decided to immerse himself in the project.

After they lost the 152nd Street site, Alderdice says the board attempted to lease the old Star of the Sea building in White Rock, but that fell through as well.

He then looked at 24 sites from 72 Avenue south, and from Crescent Road to the Langley border.

"We identified these two dozen sites, and the planning department said they were unable to support every single one for one reason or another, some because of the designation under the Official Community Plan, others because they felt the site

was inappropriate for institutional use."

Finally he found the present proposed site at 160th Street and 26th Avenue — a location which has come under considerable fire from local residents.

To his surprise, city planners approved the site, and an initial petition showed most people in the area supported it.

That is no longer the case. The Southridge issue has degenerated into a bitter campaign of letters to the editor, public meetings, petitions, accusations and counter-accusations.

The school's proponents says they only want a chance to educate their children in a school of their choice. The other side says allowing a school on the unserved lot will set a dangerous

precedent, and they're worried about traffic, noise, sewage and drainage problems.

Alderdice says he and the 120 other parents involved want their children to attend Southridge, because as a non-denominational private school, it will offer an enhanced academic, sports and artistic program, and will stress values such as responsibility and integrity.

Prospective headmaster Alan Brown says as a small school — 200 students from Kindergarten through Grade 9 to start — Southridge will offer personal attention, and the staff won't be afraid to talk about values and responsibility.

Both Brown and Alderdice say this is not about disliking the public school system. Alderdice,

who went to public schools himself, says he just wants his kids to have the best education possible.

"It's a very competitive world today. It's much more difficult than it was when I went to school for children to get into college and succeeding in college. If a school like this can give them a better chance of that success, I want them to have it."

He expects his children to do well even without a private school, but it might require more commitment from him and Trisha, Alderdice says.

But both he and Brown stress that Southridge parents are already extremely committed to their children's education. They are prepared to pay not only the \$2,600 to \$6,000 annual tuition,

Advanced Placement courses are College Board certified courses that are recognized as the equivalent of first year university programs.

These courses are intentionally restricted to students in Grades 11 and 12 because of the cognitive and emotional maturity required to achieve the depth of learning expected at this level of coursework.

Because of our commitment to student learning and success, Southridge will only permit students who have completed Advanced Placement courses at Southridge to take the AP exam at the school in May. We are repeatedly advised by post-secondary admissions counsellors that universities want students to take a rigorous course of study **within the school's curriculum offerings**; thus, we will not facilitate any AP courses or exams taken outside the school.

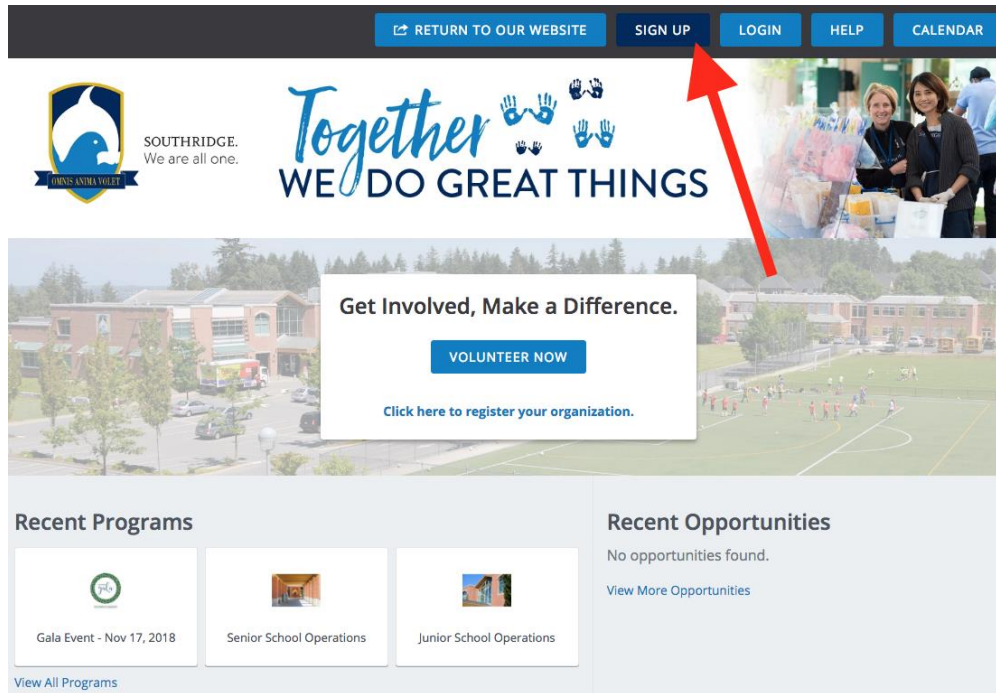

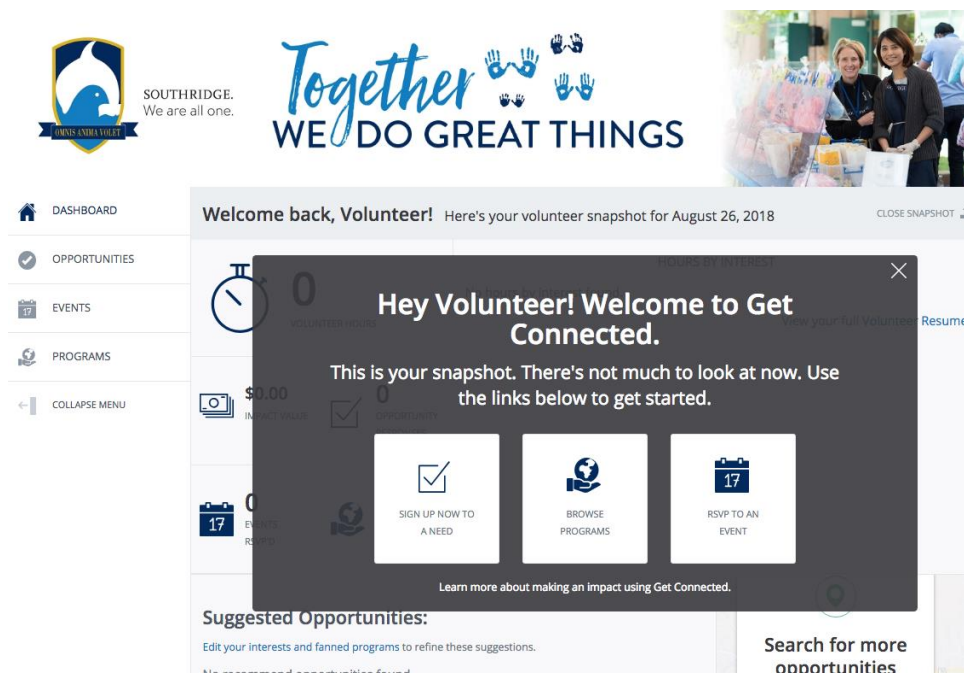
Volunteering at Southridge – Signing up through Galaxy!

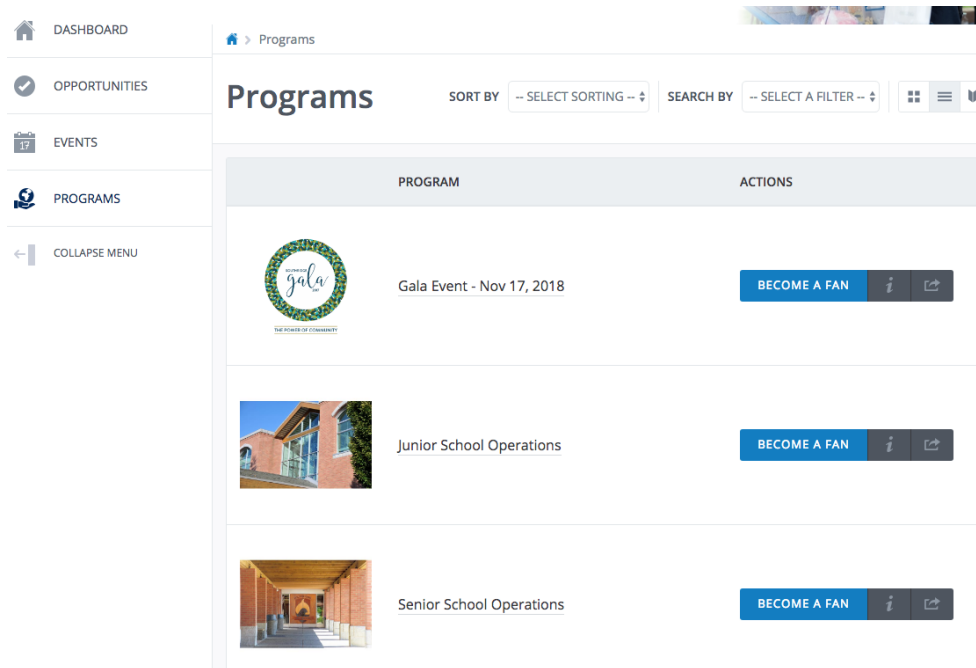


You can create your account with your email, or through your Facebook account. Once you've created your account, you will move to the dashboard:



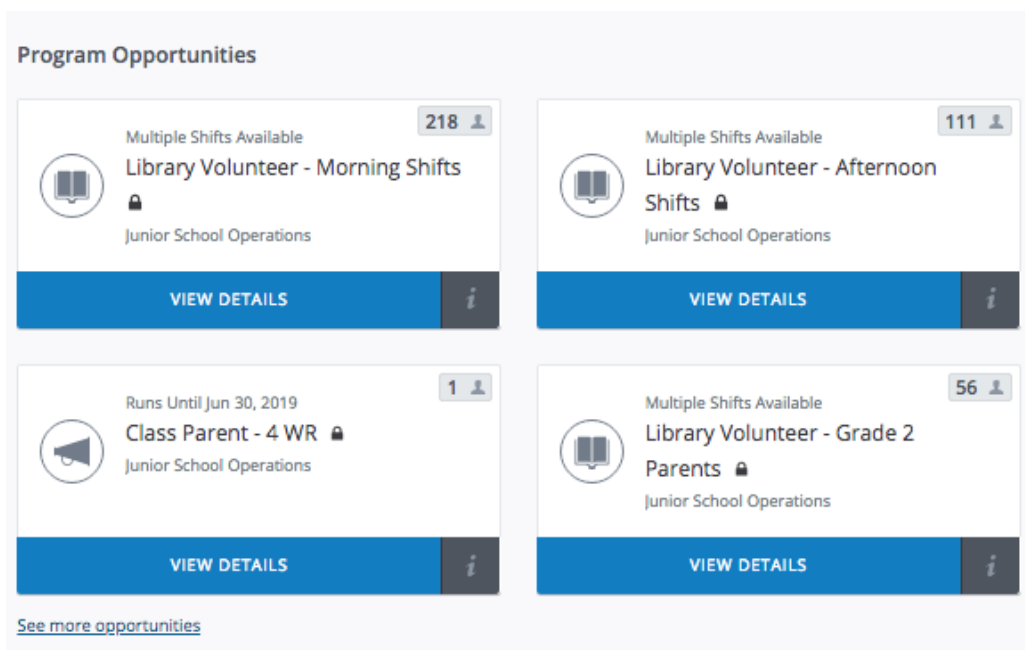
STEP 2:

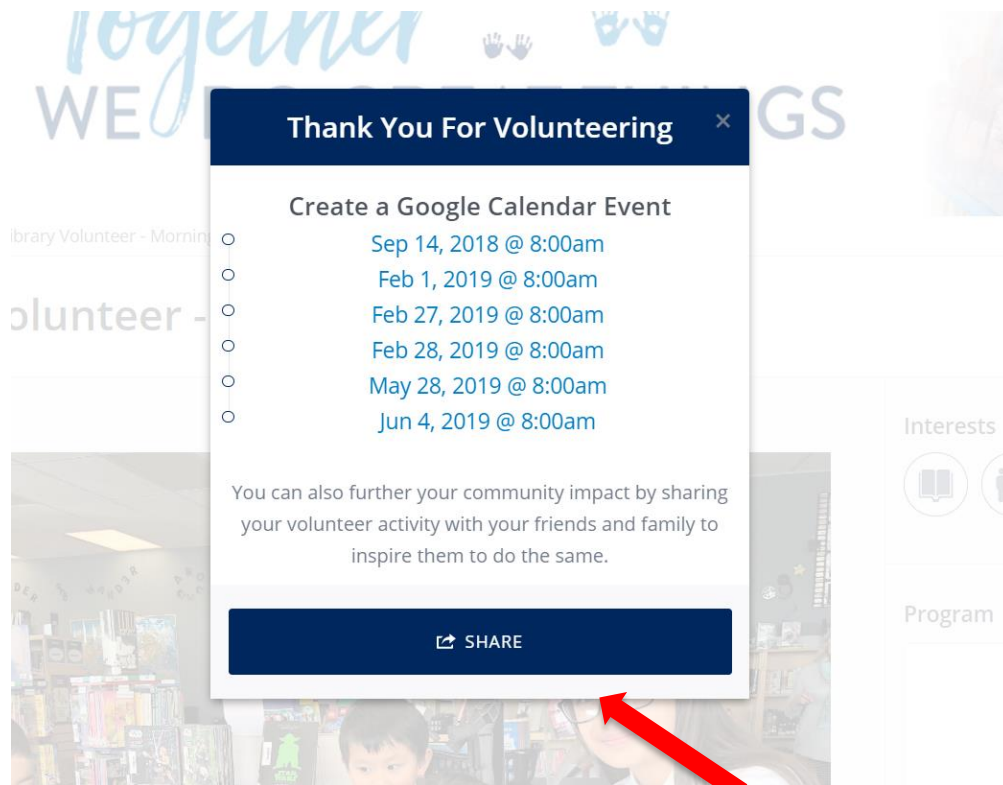



Volunteering at Southridge – Looking up volunteer opportunities


Step 1:
