TOPIC: **LIGHTS ON AFTERSCHOOL! October 25, 2018**

DESCRIPTION: *Lights On Afterschool!* is celebrated nationwide to call attention to the importance of after school programs. More than a million people in thousands of communities are expected to participate in *Lights On Afterschool* on or around October 25th by attending science fairs, fun runs, community service events, music and dance performances, open houses and other events at schools, community centers, malls, parks and recreation centers, museums, state capitols, and other settings. All these events will celebrate the afterschool programs that keep kids safe, inspire them to learn and help working families.

Lights On Afterschool! is organized by the Afterschool Alliance to underscore the need to invest in afterschool programs, which offer students the chance to hone their skills and discover their passions. These programs provide homework help, mentoring, sports and physical fitness, robotics, computer programming, community service opportunities, art and music, and other hands-on learning opportunities.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education recognize October 25, 2018, as the CARES program "*Lights On Afterschool!*" and encourage school and community participation in events and activities to celebrate the importance of afterschool programs.

TOPIC: PUBLIC HEARING ON THE SUFFICIENCY OF TEXTBOOKS, INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS AND SCIENCE LAB EQUIPMENT (9-12) AND ADOPTION OF BOARD RESOLUTION NO.16-18-19

DESCRIPTION: The Williams Settlement set a specific timeline for districts in certifying the sufficiency of textbooks, instructional materials, and science lab equipment (9-12). The settlement requires the hearing to be held prior to the end of the eighth week after the first day pupils attend school. Education Code Section 60119 specifies that the governing boards of school districts establish steps and procedures and take appropriate action to ensure the availability of textbooks and instructional materials on a yearly basis.

1. Hold a public hearing.
2. Make a determination, through a resolution, on the status of the sufficiency or insufficiency of textbooks and instructional materials in the District and that they are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board in the following areas:
 - Mathematics
 - Science
 - History-social science
 - English/language arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program
 - Visual and performing arts
3. Make a determination, through a resolution, on the status of the availability of laboratory sciences equipment as applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades 9 to 12 inclusive.

The District has posted, as required by law, a notice of public hearing ten days in advance of this evening's hearing, and the attached Resolution satisfies the requirements of the Timeline for Implementation of the Williams Settlement Legislation.

FISCAL IMPACT: Adoption of the resolution has no fiscal impact.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education hold a public hearing, adopt Resolution No. 16-18-19, and certify to the California Department of Education that the District has complied with the requirement of Education Code Section 60119.

RESOLUTION NO. 16-18-19
OF THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT GOVERNING BOARD
DETERMINING STEPS TO ENSURE AVAILABILITY OF
TEXTBOOKS AND INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS FOR 2018-19

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 60119 establishes steps and procedures to ensure the availability of textbooks and instructional materials in order to be eligible to receive funds for that purpose, and;

WHEREAS, the procedures require that school districts take appropriate action to ensure the availability of textbooks and instructional materials on a yearly basis, and;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Sections 60119, the Board is required to hold a public hearing to encourage participation by parents, teachers, members of the community interested in the affairs of the school district, and bargaining unit leaders, and;

WHEREAS, the Board is required to provide 10 days' notice of the public hearing or hearings, and;

WHEREAS, the notice shall contain the time, place, and purpose of the hearing and be posted in three public places within the school district, and;

WHEREAS, the hearing shall be held at a time that will encourage the attendance of teachers and parents and guardians of pupils who attend the schools in the district and shall not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the governing Board of a school district, as part of the required hearing, shall also make a written determination as to whether each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board for those subjects, and;

WHEREAS, the governing Board shall also determine the availability of laboratory science equipment as applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades 9 to 12, inclusive, and;

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on October 11, 2018 at seven o'clock pm, which is on or before the eighth week of school and;

WHEREAS, the Board is required to make a determination, through a resolution, as to whether each pupil in each school in the district has, sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 and Education Code 33126 in each of the following subjects, as appropriate, that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board:

- i. Mathematics
- ii. Science
- iii. History-social science,
- iv. English/language arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program,
- v. Visual and performing arts. (Not listed in 60605 or 33126)

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the governing Board makes the determination that each pupil of the district, has available sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 and Education Code Section 33126 in each subject listed above, consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board and adopted by this Board in accordance with the procedures as established.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the 2018-19 school year, the Orange Unified School District, has provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 and Education Code Section 33126 in each subject listed above, consistent with the content and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board for those subjects.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the 2018-19 school year, the School District has provided sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board, to each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course, and that sufficient laboratory science equipment applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades 9 to 12, inclusive, is available to pupils.

TOPIC: RESOLUTION NO. 18-18-19 – APPROVAL TO APPLY FOR STATE ALLOCATION BOARD SCHOOL FACILITY BOND FUNDS FOR CANYON, EL MODENA, ORANGE, AND VILLA PARK HIGH SCHOOLS NEW CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS.

DESCRIPTION: The State Allocation Board (SAB) has established an “Application Received Beyond Bond Authority List” for projects that have been received and need to be approved by SAB. Pursuant to Title 2, Code of California Regulation section 1859.95.1 SAB requires school districts to pass a resolution acknowledging that matching State funds are currently exhausted and that the District recognizes the State Facilities Program may change in the future.

The Canyon, El Modena, Orange, and Villa Park High Schools projects may be eligible for new construction funds. Approval of this resolution will allow staff to submit funding applications so as to maintain the District’s position on the project workload list.

FISCAL IMPACT: Unknown Income

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve Resolution No. 18-18-19, and authorize staff to submit a funding application for Canyon, El Modena, Orange, and Villa Park High Schools New Construction Projects.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education ("School Board") has determined that school facilities within the Orange Unified School District (the "District"), within Orange County need to be modernized; and

WHEREAS, the State Allocation Board (SAB) has established an "Applications Received Beyond Bond Authority List" for projects that have been received. Pursuant to Title 2, Code of California Regulations section 1859.95.1, the Board of Education for the Orange Unified School District hereby acknowledges the following:

- (1) That the remaining School Facility Program Bond authority is currently exhausted for the funds being requested on Canyon HS, El Modena HS, Orange HS, and Villa Park HS application(s).
- (2) That the State of California is not expected nor obligated to provide funding for the project(s) and the acceptance of the application(s) does not provide a guarantee of future State funding.
- (3) That any potential future State bond measures for the School Facility Program may not provide funds for the application being submitted.
- (4) That criteria (including, but not limited to, funding, qualifications, and eligibility) under a future State school facilities program may be substantially different than the current School Facility Program. The District's Approved Application(s) may be returned.
- (5) That they are electing to commence any preconstruction or construction activities at the District's discretion and that the State is not responsible for any pre-construction or construction activities.

TOPIC: REJECTION OF ALL BIDS FOR MEASURE S PROGRAM PROJECT BID NO. S1819-001, ORANGE HIGH SCHOOL SCIENCE CENTER

DESCRIPTION: As required by Public Contract Code 20112, the District advertised Bid No. S1819-001, Orange High School Science Center in the Orange City News on August 9, and 16, 2018. Three-hundred eighty-two contractors, plus four plan rooms were solicited. Additionally, bid documents were posted electronically to allow for ease of project exposure and contractor access to plans. One-hundred twenty-five prime, mechanical, electrical, and plumbing contractors, were prequalified by District staff. Four bids were received on September 25, 2018.

Public Contract Code Section 20111 governs the letting of contracts for public works projects at schools. In addition to the Public Contract Code, Courts have held that school districts may reject all bids for any reason and at any time before the bid has been awarded. The Board of Education has the discretion and ability to award the contract or reject all bids.

Upon staff review and consideration, staff is recommending rejection of all bids, and authorization to staff to re-bid the project after completion of an analysis of the work and documents to identify and further amplify requirements stipulated by Public Contract Code.

FISCAL IMPACT: None.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that that Board of Education authorize rejection of all bids for Measure S Program project Bid No. S1819-001, Orange High School Science Center. Upon re-advertisement and receipt of new bids, staff requests to present the lowest responsive responsible bidder to the Board of Education for consideration of award of contract.

TOPIC: REQUEST TO REVISE LICENSE AGREEMENT AND MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH BURL AND MICHELE GREGORY

DESCRIPTION: The District entered into a First Amendment to License Agreement dated March 16, 2017, and a Second Amendment to License Agreement dated June 8, 2017, with Burl Gregory and Michelle Gregory for the use of three and one-half (3 1/2) acres of certain real property adjacent to the Santiago Middle School. The Board of Education approved the term as amended in the Second Amendment for a six month period with an additional six months automatic renewal license agreement with Gregory Palm Farms (GPF) and Jones Victorian Estate (JVE) owned by Burl and Michele Gregory.

This evening, the Gregory's are requesting to revise the existing license agreement to extend for an additional term up to and including December 31, 2018, as in its entirety, set forth in the Third Amendment to License Agreement.

FISCAL IMPACT: Unknown

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education renew the license fee agreement to allow Gregory Palm Farm and Jones Victorian Estate to continue its operation at the Walnut site.

THIRD AMENDMENT TO LICENSE AGREEMENT

This Third Amendment (“Third Amendment”) to the License Agreement and Memorandum Of Understanding dated March 16, 2016, by and between the ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, a California public school district duly organized and existing under Chapter 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Education Code of the State of California (“Licensor” or the “District”) and BURL GREGORY AND MICHELLE GREGORY, (“Licensee” or “Gregory”) (collectively, Licensor and Licensee are referred to as the “Parties”), as amended by that certain First Amendment to License Agreement dated March 16, 2017 (“First Amendment”) and that certain Second Amendment to License Agreement dated June 8, 2017 (collectively, referred to as the “License Agreement”), is hereby made and entered into as of _____ (“Effective Date”) as follows:

WHEREAS, the License Agreement granted Licensee a non-exclusive license to use certain real property owned by the Licensor identified as approximately three and one-half (3 ½) acres of certain real property adjacent to the Santiago Middle School (the “Property”).

WHEREAS, the term of the License Agreement, as amended and established in the Second Amendment, commenced on March 16, 2017 for a period of six (6) months and automatically extended for an additional twelve (12) months.

WHEREAS, the Parties have agreed to extend the term of the License Agreement pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth herein for an additional ninety (90) days.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the Recitals set forth above, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby agree as set forth below.

1. Revise Section 3 of the License Agreement to read as follows, in its entirety:

Term. The term of this License Agreement shall be extended for an additional term up to and including December 31, 2018 (the “Additional Term”). This License Agreement may be terminated immediately at any time during the Additional Term by the District without notice if (1) Licensee is in material breach of the License Agreement, (2) if District reasonably determines there is unsafe and/or dangerous conditions, threats to life or property, (3) in the event that a natural disaster or emergency makes it necessary for the District to use the License Area for alternative purposes, or (4) if District and Licensee enter into a revised License Agreement for the use of the License Area. Either Party may terminate the License Agreement at will or without cause upon giving the other party notice in writing. The Parties will each endeavor, but shall not be required, to give at least fifteen (15) days written notice to the other party.

2. License Fee.

During the Additional Term, Licensee shall pay the “Palm Farm License Fee” and the “JVE License Fee” as set forth in Section 2 of the License Agreement. As established in Section 2 of the License Agreement, the Palm Farm License Fee is calculated based on the formula set forth in Section 5 of the original lease, attached as Exhibit A to the License Agreement. Specifically,

the Palm Farm License Fee formula requires Licensee to release a percentage of payment received by Licensee for the sale of the Assets to the District. During the Additional Term, any Asset removed from the Property by Licensee, for any reason, shall be deemed a "sold Asset" for the purposes of calculating the Palm Farm License Fee. The value of any Asset removed from the Property, for the purposes of calculating the Palm Farm License Fee, shall be the fair market value of the Asset.

Further, for any Asset sold by Licensee during the Additional Term, Licensee shall establish the fair market value of any Asset to determine the Palm Farm License Fee in place of the actual amount sold by Licensee.

4. Counterparts. This Third Amendment may be executed and delivered in any number of counterparts, each of which so executed and delivered shall be deemed to be an original and all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.

5. Inconsistencies. In the event of any inconsistency between the terms of this Third Amendment and those of the License Agreement, the Third Amendment shall control.

6. Binding. The Parties and each of their signatories hereto warrant that each has the power and authority to execute this Amendment. This Amendment shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns. If any provision of this Amendment shall be held invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision of this Amendment or the Lease.

7. Modifications. This Amendment may be amended or modified only by an agreement in writing signed by both Parties.

INFORMATION/DISCUSSION
ITEMS

TOPIC: 2018 SUMMER MAINTENANCE PROJECTS UPDATE

DESCRIPTION: Over the past several months, the Maintenance and Operations Department completed a variety of repair and improvement projects throughout the District including painting, flooring, roofing, asphalt, and asbestos abatement. Staff will provide a brief overview of the projects that were accomplished over the summer.

This item is for information and discussion only.

TOPIC: **ONLINE BOARD AGENDAS**

DESCRIPTION: California Assembly Bill 2257, enacted September 9, 2016 and effective January 1, 2019, amends Government Code section 54954.2, to impose additional requirements for posting an agenda online for any meeting occurring on or after January 1, 2019. The agenda must be posted on the homepage of the local agency's primary website and made accessible through a prominent, direct link. However, if the local agency's primary website has integrated management platform that meets certain requirements specified by the bill (i.e., the current agenda is the first agenda available at the top of the platform), that agency is exempt from the new requirement. The new law also requires all agendas be posted online in an open format, according to specific requirements, such as platform independence, being machine readable, and other terms that are defined by the bill.

Input was gathered by staff members from several surrounding school districts on their transition from a paper process to an online system. Staff members will present an overview of one of the several integrated agenda management platforms recently reviewed by multiple committee members over the course of several months. The solution will assist in satisfying accessibility compliance requirements set forth by state and federal regulations while substantially reducing the time investment necessary to create each board agenda.

TOPIC: REPORT OF FINDINGS – BOARD MEMBER REQUEST TO INVESTIGATE VOTER REGISTRATION WITH THE ORANGE COUNTY VOTER INFORMATION PROJECT

DESCRIPTION: The Board of Education took action at the regularly scheduled Board meeting of May 24, 2018, to authorize the Superintendent or designee to hire an attorney from an outside law firm to investigate the voter registration that took place on two OUSD campuses, Richland Continuation and El Modena High Schools, in April 2018. The scope of the investigation was to determine whether there were any violations of the California Education Code or any other laws associated with this occurrence, and to provide a report of findings to the Board of Education, including recommendations for any corrective actions moving forward with the entities involved.

In follow-up to the above, the Board of Education took action at the June 7, 2018 meeting of the Board to authorize the Law Office of Karen Bell to conduct an impartial investigation on behalf of the District in this matter.

This evening, Attorney Kathleen Kelly of the Law Office of Karen Bell will make a report of findings regarding this investigation to the Board of Education, including recommendations based on the findings of the investigation.

ROUTINE ITEMS ACTED UPON IN ONE MOTION UNLESS PULLED FOR DISCUSSION AND SEPARATE ACTION.

TOPIC: **CONTRACT SERVICES REPORT – MEASURE S**

DESCRIPTION: The following is a report of contract services items for the Measure S Program:

STATE OF CALIFORNIA, DEPARTMENT OF GENERAL SERVICES, CMAS CONTRACT NO. 4-18-51-0061A, 4-18-51-0061B, AND NO. 4-18-51-0061C, ACCO ENGINEERED SYSTEMS, INC.

On March 22 and May 5, 2018, staff obtained authorization from the Board of Education to award CMAS Master Contract Nos. 4-18-51-0061A, 4-18-51-0061B and 4-18-51-0061C, awarded to ACCO Engineered Systems, Inc., for the purchase of electrical switchgear equipment for Measure S Program projects, and Districtwide projects as needed.

Staff now needs to prepare for upgrades to the switchgear systems at Villa Park High School, which is necessary for sufficient power distribution to meet current needs and allow for future growth.

TOPIC: TEACHER ASSIGNMENT/CONSENT - VARIABLE OR SHORT-TERM WAIVER

DESCRIPTION: Since July 1994, the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CCTC) has had the authority to issue waiver documents relating to educator preparation and credentialing which provide school districts the ability to employ or assign persons who are not fully credentialed to qualifying assignments. The CCTC has divided the waiver process into two types of waivers; short-term and variable term. Short-Term Waivers give school districts the ability to cover immediate and short-term needs. This waiver allows employers to assign teachers who hold a basic credential to teach outside of their credential authorization for one semester or less with the teachers' consent. Variable Term Waivers give school districts the ability to cover assignments when a fully credentialed employee cannot be found. Waivers allow school districts to meet staffing needs while searching for an individual who either holds an appropriate credential or qualifies for one of the available assignment options. It also allows the individuals holding waivers to complete their credential requirements while serving in the classroom.

The certificated employees whose names are listed on the attached have met the requirements, have consented to the assignment, and have been judged by the site administrator to be competent in the subject matter. Likewise, all other means of credentialing and reassignment have been explored. The passage of this waiver will allow the District to remain compliant with SB 435, which requires that all teachers be appropriately assigned.

FISCAL IMPACT: This item has no fiscal impact.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the variable term waivers as presented.

DESCRIPTION: Individual school districts are responsible to provide their respective county superintendent of schools with evidence of legal and appropriate assignments for all certificated employees. Legal and appropriate assignments for certificated employees are those based upon the authorization(s) contained on the specific certificate(s) held by the certificated employee, as well as additional assignments which are authorized "assignment options" by the Education Code.

Most of the assignment options provided by the Education Code allow a teacher to serve in an additional assignment, provided that the teacher has received a specified level of training relative to the subject area to be taught, that the teacher consents to the assignment, and that the local governing board takes action on the assignment. These assignment options are typically employed in middle schools and high schools where the teacher is assigned to instruct groups of students in a specific subject matter area or areas.

The teachers/assignments listed on the attached Teacher Assignment/Consent Report reflect legal and appropriate assignments based upon authorized assignment options in the Education Code where the teacher has met all requirements and has consented to the assignment.

Serrano Elementary School – 4th grade class – Ocean Institute – The Pilgrim Tall Ship Experience - March 7 - 8, 2019

Fourth grade students from Serrano Elementary School, under the supervision of teachers Victoria Schmuhl, Celeste Ivory, as well as trained Ocean Institute staff, will participate in the Ocean Institute The Pilgrim Tall Ship Program. This overnight program provides students an opportunity to participate in the reenactment of life on a tall sailing ship of the 1800's. This program correlates with the social studies curriculum. Transportation to and from the event will be provided by OUSD transportation. The student cost may be supplemented by funds donated from individual parent organizations. The cost will not exceed \$100 per student and scholarships are available. No student is prevented from making the field trip due to lack of sufficient funds per Education Code 35330 (b), 35331. There is no impact to the general fund.

Panorama Elementary – 5th Grade Class – Guided Discoveries CIMI – Fox Landing - Catalina Island Marine Institute – March 27-29, 2019

The fifth grade students from Panorama Elementary School, under the supervision of Heather Irwin and Allison Hurst, as well as trained CIMI Education camp staff, will participate in the Outdoor Science Marine School Program. Students will be accompanied by three adult chaperones. The program focuses on hands on experiences in science. This includes a combination of labs, aquariums and touch tanks on land as well as snorkeling, kayaking and collecting data in the field. Students and teachers will learn about the many ecosystems of the island and ocean and get to see and touch a whole range of fish, algae, sharks and rays. Transportation to and from the event will be provided by OUSD Transportation. The cost per student is \$300 and no student prevented from attending the field trip due to lack of sufficient funds per Education Code 35330(b), 35331.

Villa Park High School - Vocal Music – San Diego, CA - March 21-23, 2019

The Villa Park High School Madrigal Singers and Bella Voce, under the supervision of teacher Stacy Oh, will travel through

Los Angeles, San Diego and Anaheim to participate in collaborative performance exchanges and attend a Disneyland Guest Artist Workshop. These experiences offer a comprehensive educational and performance experience for Villa Park's choral singers and is vital to the growth of the vocal music program. The ten male and thirty female students will be accompanied by two male and two female adult chaperones. Chaperones and students will stay at the Holiday Inn Express in Old Town San Diego. Transportation will be provided by OUSD school busses. Cost per student is \$500 and no student is prevented from making the field trip due to lack of sufficient funds per Education Code 35330(b), 35331. Students will miss two days of school and a substitute will be required for both days.

Canyon High School – Cross Country Team – Fresno, CA – November 23 – 25, 2018

Canyon High School's Cross Country Team, under the supervision of the coach Chris Anderson, will travel to Fresno to participate in CIF State Cross Country Championships. The seven male and seven female students will be accompanied by two male and two female adult chaperones. Parents will provide transportation for their own student and any parent driving a student other than their own, will have an approved OUSD Driver Certification on file prior to this trip. The chaperones and students will stay at Residence Inn, Fresno, with expenses paid by parents. The students will not miss any school and no substitute is required.

Canyon High School – Boys Varsity Water Polo Team – La Mesa, CA – October 19 – 20, 2018

Canyon High Boys Varsity Water Polo team, under the supervision of coach Celena Photopulos, will travel to La Mesa to participate in the San Diego Open Tournament. The student athletes will have the opportunity to compete with top teams in the San Diego area and participate in team bonding exercises. The seventeen male athletes will be accompanied by three male and two female adult chaperones. Chaperones and athletes will stay at the Best Western Hotel. Parents will provide transportation for their own student and any parent driving a student other than their own will have an approved OUSD Driver Certification on file prior to this trip. Cost per student is \$100 and no student is prevented from making the field trip due to lack of sufficient funds per Education Code 35330(b), 35331. No substitute is required and the students will miss one day of school.

El Modena High School – Girls’ Soccer Team – Beaumont, California – November 29, 2018 – December 1, 2018

El Modena High School’s Girls’ Soccer team, under the supervision of coach Doug Franco, will travel to Beaumont, to compete in the Beaumont High School Girls Soccer Tournament. The El Modena High School student athletes will gain valuable experience working and playing in a team environment. Other important life skills will be practiced. One male and two female chaperones will accompany the twenty-six female students. Transportation will be provided by parents who will be transporting their own students. The students and chaperones will stay at the Best Western Las Brisas in Palm Springs, paid for by the soccer booster club. Students will miss two days of school and a substitute will be required for one of the days.

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no fiscal impact to the District

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the Study Trips as presented.

**TOPIC: COOPERATION AND SERVICE AGREEMENT/
MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING - APPROVAL OF
SERVICE AGREEMENT BETWEEN COMMUNITY
HEALTH INITIATIVE OF ORANGE COUNTY AND
ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT**

DESCRIPTION: Orange Unified School District is working in conjunction with Community Health Initiative (CHI) of Orange County to ensure that all eligible children and youth in Orange County have access to primary healthcare and social services through various programs available for the 2018-19 school year. The program's objectives are: increase enrollment of eligible children and youth into available healthcare and social services; education families on how to navigate their child's health coverage; increase utilization of health services, especially preventive services; and increase re-enrollment and retain children and youth in the healthcare and social services. The program will have a liaison to ensure outreach efforts. The liaison will work with CHI of Orange County's outreach office to coordinate the dissemination of outreach and education on health insurance. They will also provide on-site support as needed.

FISCAL IMPACT: Approval of this service agreement has no fiscal impact. Orange Unified students will receive sustainable services provided by the Community Health Initiative of Orange County, but the district receives no funds.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the agreement with Orange Unified School District as presented.

TOPIC: RESOLUTION NO. 15-18-19 CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION FACILITIES PROGRAM PROP 51

DESCRIPTION: The Career Technical Education Facilities Program (CTEFP) provides funding to school districts for the construction of new facilities, modernization or reconfiguration of existing facilities, and equipment for Career Technical Education programs. Prop 51 has allocated \$500 million to Career Technical Education with a \$3 million state match for new construction and \$1.5 million state match for modernization.

On May 24, 2018 the Board of Education approved the facilitation of a Construction Trades Lab at El Modena High School. The lab will take students through eighteen Building Skills Construction Careers for the 21st Century modules, which vary from Concrete and Electrical Skills to Drywall and Plumbing Skills. All courses within the pathway will offer University of California A-G approved elective courses. This lab is scheduled to open in January 2019.

Orange Unified is submitting a CTEFP Application in the amount of \$1,607,218.93 to modernize 4,480 square feet of adjoining space to the Construction Trades Lab. This space will be utilized for small group instruction of specified trades, storage of materials, and the facilitation of the Capstone Project, which is the construction of a Tiny House.

FISCAL IMPACT: Cost of mandated 50% match, which is \$803,609.45

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education adopt Resolution 15-18-19 Giving Notice of Intention to submit a Career Technical Education Facilities Program Prop 51 Application

TOPIC: **2018-19 RECLASSIFICATION CRITERIA**

DESCRIPTION: When students enter Orange Unified School District, parents/guardians complete a Home Language Survey. This survey determines if a student will be assessed for English Language proficiency. If the assessment determines that the student is an English Learner, the student then works towards the goal of Fluent English Proficiency. The California Department of Education requests that LEAs have their district reclassification criteria board approved.

The District Reclassification of students to *Fluid English Proficiency* must be met by the following four criteria: 1) assessment of English language proficiency using an objective assessment instrument, including, but not limited to the state test of English Language development; 2) teacher evaluation, including, but not limited to a review of the student's curriculum mastery; 3) parent opinion and consultation; and 4) comparison of student performance in basic skills against an empirically established range of performance in basic skills based on the performance of English proficient students of the same age.

FISCAL IMPACT: No fiscal impact

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the 2018-19 Reclassification Criteria as presented.

TOPIC: TITLE III LOCAL PLAN UPDATE

DESCRIPTION: The purpose of Title III is to help ensure that English learners (ELs) attain English language proficiency and meet state academic standards. Federal funding is provided through various channels to assist State Education Agencies (SEAs) and Local Education Agencies (LEAs) in accomplishing this as supported through student achievement and academic assessments. This year is an online Federal Program Monitoring review for the district, as such, the state is asking for our Title III local plan template to be reviewed and approved by our Board of Education.

Included in the Title III Plan for Orange Unified is research based actions/strategies for improving student achievement for all English Learners. English learner Instructional Specialists, Coaches, and teachers will provide strategic training, data analysis and student data chats to support all levels of language learners. Orange Unified will provide support for students and families of newcomers with a summer academy which includes parent support classes and expanded student learning opportunities. Teachers of English learners, especially those instructing long-term English learners receive professional development on Guided Language Acquisition Design (GLAD) strategies, Thinking Maps, and English Learner Shadowing.

Orange Unified implements a focus on language development at the preschool level by holding family literacy nights and providing families with books and materials to support language development. Orange USD supports two sites with Dual Immersion language programs to foster primary language and support the acquisition of each students' second language.

FISCAL IMPACT: Acceptance of this report has no fiscal impact.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education accept and approve the Orange Unified School District Title III Local Plan Update for 2018-19.

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TOPIC: **COURSE APPROVALS**

DESCRIPTION: The new course outlines described below have been reviewed by the Central County Career Technical Partnership (CTEp) for CTE courses and the District's Curriculum Department for all other courses.

ART APPRECIATION (APEX)

Art Appreciation is a survey of the history of Western visual arts, with a primary focus on painting. Students begin with an introduction to the basic principles of painting and learn how to critique and compare works of art. Students then explore prehistoric and early Greek and Roman art before they move on to the Middle Ages. Emphasis is placed on the Renaissance and the principles and masters that emerged in Italy and northern Europe. Students continue their art tour with the United States during the 20th century, a time of great innovation as abstract art took center stage. While Western art is the course's primary focus, students will finish the course by studying artistic traditions from Africa, Asia, Oceania, and the Americas.

Coverage of each artistic movement highlights historical context and introduces students to key artists that represent a variety of geographic locations. Throughout the course, students apply what they have learned about art critique to analyze and evaluate both individual artists and individual works of art. This course is built to state standards and informed by the Consortium of National Arts Education Associations standards. It encompasses a variety of skills to enable students to critique, compare, and perhaps influence their own works of art. This semester course meets the UC "f" requirement.

MUSIC APPRECIATION (APEX)

Music Appreciation introduces students to the history, theory, and genres of music, from the most primitive surviving examples through the classical to the most contemporary in the world at large. The course is offered in a two-semester format. The first semester covers primitive musical forms and classical music. The second semester presents the rich modern traditions, including American jazz, gospel, folk, soul, blues, Latin rhythms, rock and roll, and hip-hop.

The course explores the interface of music and social movements and examines how the emergent global society and the Internet bring musical forms together in new ways from all around the world. This semester course meets the UC “f” requirement.

SOCIOLOGY (APEX)

Sociology examines why people think and behave as they do in relationships, groups, institutions, and societies. Major course topics include individual and group identity, social structures and institutions, social change, social stratification, social dynamics in recent and current events, the effects of social change on individuals, and the research methods used by social scientists.

In online discussions and polls, students reflect critically on their own experiences and ideas, as well as on the ideas of sociologists. Interactive multimedia activities include personal and historical accounts to which students can respond, using methods of inquiry from sociology. Written assignments provide opportunities to practice and develop skills in thinking and communicating about human relationships, individual and group identity, and all other major course topics.

This course is built to state standards and the National Council for the Social Studies (NCSS) Expectations of Excellence: Curriculum Standards for Social Studies. This semester course meets the UC “g” requirement.

ETHNIC STUDIES (APEX)

Ethnic Studies is a one-semester history and sociology course that examines the multicultural fabric of the United States. The course emphasizes the perspectives of minority groups while allowing students from all backgrounds to better understand and appreciate how race, culture and ethnicity, and identity contribute to their experiences.

Major topics in the course include identity, immigration, assimilation and distinctiveness, power and oppression, struggles for rights, regionalism, culture and the media, and the formation of new cultures.

In online Discussions and Polls, students reflect critically on their own experiences as well as those of others. Interactive multimedia activities include personal and historical accounts to which students can respond using methods of inquiry from

history, sociology, and psychology. Written assignments and Journals provide opportunities for students to practice and develop skills for thinking and communicating about race, culture, ethnicity, and identity.

This course is built to state standards and informed by the National Council for the Social Studies (NCSS) Expectations of Excellence: Curriculum Standards for Social Studies as well as the National Standards for History published by the National Center for History in Schools (NCHS). This semester course meets the UC “g” requirement.

COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (APEX)

Computer Applications provides an introduction to software applications that prepares students to succeed in the workplace and beyond. Students will develop an understanding of professional communications and leadership skills while gaining proficiency with word processing, email, and presentation management software. Students will also be able to demonstrate digital literacy through basic study web publishing and design, spreadsheets and database software.

This course allows students to explore careers in the fields of business and information technology while learning skills applicable to any professional setting. Through a series of hands-on activities, students will create, analyze, and critique reports, letters, project plans, presentations, and other professional communications. Regular engagement in active learning ensures students can continually refine the skills necessary to prepare them for work. In addition, students will evaluate the qualifications required for specific careers so they can identify opportunities that are of interest to them.

Computer Applications is an introductory level Career and Technical Education course applicable to programs of study in Business Management and Administration, Information Technology, and other career clusters. This course is built to state and national standards. This semester course meets the UC “g” requirement.

THE BUSINESS OF MUSIC, COMPOSITION, AND PERFORMANCE (CTE)

In this course, students will continue to hone their composition and theory skills by creating original music projects with the use of professional software and

equipment. To complement their growing academic skill set, students will demonstrate mastery of professional performance skills such as audition, solo, chamber, and portfolio presentation.

To apply these skills effectively in the marketplace, students will also explore the dynamics of the music business environment by identifying key aspects of the industry, including branding, marketing, communications, promotion, touring, distribution, management, and ethical considerations. Throughout this course, students will examine the socio-cultural context of various music genres as inherently cultural forms of expression.

MUSIC COMPOSITION AND TECHNOLOGY (CTE)

In this course, students will encounter a wide array of practical concepts critical to the production of music and the use of technology in the music industry. In order to develop as music professionals, students must be able to interpret the language of music. Students will develop competency in notation and rhythm by writing music by hand and with the use of software, as well as identifying features on the MIDI keyboard.

As students encounter more advanced skills, such as solfège and scale types, they will begin to outline the historical development of melody, harmony, and song structure and then illustrate their mastery of these elements using the appropriate software. The course concludes with the exploration and integration of MIDI interface devices with composition and engineering tools to produce polished musical works. Throughout this course, students will listen to and analyze complex works of music from various periods and genres. This course meets the UC “f” requirement.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact for course approvals. The cost of instructional materials will be addressed during the forthcoming textbook adoption process.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education authorize the Superintendent or designee to approve the courses presented by the Central County Career Technical Partnership (CTEp) and the District’s Curriculum Department.

TOPIC: **BOOSTER CLUBS**

DESCRIPTION: Booster Clubs are separate organizations from a school district that contribute financial and moral support to various sports, clubs and organization on school sites. California Education Code section 51521 requires all organizations that conduct fundraising to benefit clubs, schools, students and the district have prior approval from the district's governing board. The District adopted Board Policy 1230 and administrative regulations to establish specific conditions and controls for the relationship between organizations and the District. The list of school booster organizations below have completed the required application and provided a list of site officers, tax identification numbers, non-profit 501(c)(3), bylaws, proposed budget and proposed activities. These documents have been reviewed by the site principal and District administration for submission for Board approval. Booster Clubs may be revoked by the Principal and shall be reauthorized by the Board of Education every five years.
