# SENIOR CHECKLIST

**TEXAS SUCCESS INITIATIVE (TSI)** 

#### Who Must Take the Test?

- You must take the THEA or an equivalent test if any one of the conditions listed below applies to you.
- You are entering or are enrolled in a Texas public institution of higher education (i.e., a college, university, or technical institute) as a full-time or part-time student in an associate or baccalaureate degree program.
- You are a full-time or part-time teacher education student in either a public or a private institution in Texas.
- You are entering a certificate program that contains nine (9) or more semester credit hours, or the equivalent, of general education courses as defined by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

#### At What Point Must an Exam be Taken?

- If you have not taken a placement test at the Texas college or university in which you are enrolling as a freshman-level student, you must take the THEA test before accumulating nine (9) or more college-level semester credit hours, or the equivalent.
- If you have taken a placement test at the college or university in which you are enrolling and that institution has elected to use a 15-hour policy, you must take the THEA test before the end of the semester in which you have accumulated fifteen (15) or more college-level semester credit hours. Check with your institution about its policies on placement testing.

## Who Is Exempt From Taking an Exam?

There are exemptions but each college is responsible for determining what the criteria are. Often this depends on test scores from SAT, ACT or TAKS.

### How Do I Enroll?

- Also, many community colleges offer the Accuplacer exam free of charge for students who are enrolling in their college.
