Parents can access helpful resources for the district's K-6 math curriculum in two different ways. First, you can visit the <u>K-6 Mathematics</u> <u>OneDrive</u> (CTRL+Click to follow link). To log in, use your student's email address. Your child's districtassigned PIN number is the password.

A second option is to log into your own guardian myDSD account, then click on your child's picture or name. After you click on your child's grade level, scroll to the bottom of the page to find "Course Resources (DESK)". This will provide a list of resources available to parents and guardians. Parent videos have been provided for most 3rd -6th grade lessons. These can also be accessed by scanning the QR codes found on the "School to Home" pages. Any free QR code scanner will work. Choose "Parent Guide" to see a copy of the textbook, or choose "Parent Video Guide" to see video links for each lesson. New videos are posted as they become available. The numbers at the top of the School-Home Connection pages correspond to the chapter and lesson numbers in each book.
