Coming Soon – a new big toy



Our long-awaited project is expected to get underway next week! The first step is for Davis District crews to lay a new concrete pad west of the playground near the walking path. A contractor, Quality Time Recreation, will then apply the tile surface on top of the new concrete pad. In early October the new play structure can be installed. The picture above is part of the new play area we are expecting, with a few more spinning things and doo-dahs that kids will think are fabulous and adults will probably not – but that is okay. It's all about what's best for kids. This project wouldn't be possible without our amazing PTA and School Community Council advocating for our school. Their efforts caught the attention of our school director, Dr. Gwen Hill, who also went to bat for Reading Elementary. Ultimately a commitment of \$150,000+ dollars was made by the district facilities department. Hopefully these playground enhancements will benefit Reading Wranglers for many years to come.
