

All of Reading's teachers attended a day long training last Monday with author and researcher Weston Kieschnick. He modeled innovative ways to support our students in their learning. "Bold school is an attitude. It's a mindset. It's a way of thinking and behaving. Bold school is a space we all must inhabit so that all of our thinking, decisions, and instruction come from a place of purpose" (p. 27). The Bold School Framework for Strategic Blended Learning looks like this:

- Identify Desired Academic Outcome(s)
- Select a Goal-Aligned Instructional Strategy That Works
- Choose Digital Tool(s)
- Plan Blended Instruction
- Self-Assess Your Plans and Progress with a Framework

Kieschnick reinforced the idea we do not start with technology, using technology for technology's sake. We must begin with the learning outcome for our students, strategically apply high impact instructional strategies to the learning, then use digital tools to blend instruction. He continues the process through the self-assessment component, aligning the work we do in the classroom with Daggett's Rigor and Relevance Framework. This ensures rigor and relevance are evident in the instructional process and it is not just about using technology in the classroom.

Did you know... the acronym RISE


(testing set to replace SAGE this year) stands for Readiness, Improvement, Success, Empowerment?

SUCCESS: With a clear understanding of where students excel and where they need to improve, teachers can work collaboratively with families to ensure students continue to be success bound!


EMPOWERMENT: Knowledge and skills provide students valuable resources that empower them by expanding their future opportunities and freedoms.
