- **Stephanie Masterson** (3<sup>rd</sup> grade)- keep the reading tutors and lab managers, they would like Pro Books for their grade level to share, 5 headphones per class for Google- Read and Write, and would love to keep the aides they have had this year.
- **Michele Friz** (ELA Coordinator)- Keep the reading tutors for grades 1-3. Michele showed the progress made from DIBELS.
- **Jean Bradford** (1<sup>st</sup> grade)- Keep the reading tutors
- **Michelle Petersen** (Special Education)- Keep the aide that assists in Special Education
- **Don Paver** (5<sup>th</sup> grade)- Maintain DIBELS testing for all students in grades 4-6, at least for the beginning of the year, if possible keep the class size reduction aides provided by the district, any added technology where possible

- **Jerilyn Olyer** (Librarian)- Discussed having the library open for two hours one day a week during the summertime, and the need for reference iPads
- **Amy McKenzie** (1<sup>st</sup> grade)- Presented the program RAZ kids, a supplemental reading program for home and school. It would cost \$109.95 per 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade class, for a total of \$880 for the entire 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grades.
