ACADEMIC PROGRAM

- All courses are highly rigorous and college preparatory.
- All Upper School students take at least five academic courses each semester.
- The school year consists of two semesters.
- Each year-long course is worth one credit.
- The Potomac School does not rank students or provide a GPA.
- AP enrollment is based upon departmental approval.
- Due to the structure of the curriculum, few students take AP courses prior to 11th grade.

CONCENTRATION PROGRAMS

Potomac offers three concentration programs for students who are interested in intensive study in a particular discipline. Students in the GPAC and SERC concentrations design and conduct original research projects. All three programs have required courses; VPAC also includes after-school and/or extracurricular commitments. The number of students admitted to these programs is limited, and admission is competitive.
