- Community council to come prepared to discuss new SIP goals for 2018-2019 school year.


## 11. Adjournment

Mr. Scott Zigich,

At Reading Elementary, administrators, teachers, parents, and staff are committed to the outstanding development of mind, body, and character for each student. Providing a school environment that allows for optimal learning includes feeding those three aspects of an individual. As a Community Council we are constantly examining the school's performance and ability to foster a sound mind, strong body, and exceptional character. Upon reflection, we have realized changes need to be made on the playground to ensure safety, proper physical development, and opportunities for positive peer interaction.

Our first change needs to be the removal of a ball wall that is dangerously close to an entrance/exit to the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade hall. Students entering and exiting the building for recess through this door and are bombarded by other students playing wall ball. Removing the current wall and relocating it to a location away from the school would allow for student safety. The addition of a second wall ball will double the amount of students who can participate.

The next change is imperative to the safety and sanitation of the school. There is a dangerous wall, not up to code, that students could easily fall from and cause serious harm. Initially the district recommended a railing along the top of the wall. We fear students could and probably would climb the railing. By doing so, a railing would create an even higher point for students to fall and be seriously hurt. Directly west from this dangerous edifice is a huge sandbox filled with dirty sand, wind blown trash (no matter how often the custodian cleans it out), and "deposits" from various wildlife and the neighborhood cats. Although our older students avoid this area completely, younger students bring home several ounces of this sand in their shoes, hair, and pockets. Both the wall and the sandbox should be removed to provide a safe and hospitable environment for everyone.

Finally, as per every other elementary school, Reading needs a second big toy. We only have one toy at Reading for all 530 students to share, including, but really excluding, some of our amazing handi-capable students in wheelchairs. Students in wheelchairs cannot access our big toy due to the wood chips. Therefore, we propose a second toy be added in the area where the ball wall and sandbox are currently located, with the rubber flooring, so all students can join the fun. All means all! We appreciate the time and consideration taken to listen to our plea and look forward to communicating in the future. We invite you to work with us to make these needed improvements.
