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Timeline

- <u>September 2017</u> A.L.I.C.E. presentation from Officer John Julian and SafeEd Steve Brandimore to Deputy Superintendent
- October 2017 A.L.I.C.E. presentation to Superintendent and all central office administrators
- January 2018 A.L.I.C.E. presentation to Board of Education with approval to further investigate implementation in Troy

Timeline

- February 14, 2018 Parkland, Florida active shooter tragedy
- March 2018 A.L.I.C.E. contract and implementation plans for 2018-2019 academic year
- <u>June 2018</u> A.L.I.C.E. train the trainer training for all administrators and key support personnel
- August 2018 Begin A.L.I.C.E. implementation for the school year



ALERT

Initial Alert may be a gunshot, PA announcement, etc...

Avoid code words.

LOCKDOWN

If Evacuation is not a safe option, barricade entry points. Prepare to Evacuate or Counter if needed.

INFORM

Communicate real time information on shooter location. Use clear and direct language using any communication means possible.

COUNTER

As a last resort, distract shooters ability to shoot accurately. Move toward exits while making noise, throwing objects, or adults swarm shooter.

EVACUATE

Run from danger when safe to do so using non-traditional exits if necessary. Rallying point should be predetermined.

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- Proactive approach
- Provides additional options beyond traditional lockdown
- Assumes every event is not the same

- ALICE is NOT sequential
- Increases odds of survival
- Research based







ALERT = Initial Awareness

PA announcement, (Can be heard external? Are there deaf-spots?)

Gunfire, screaming, loud noises (sensory input)

Text or emergency notification

Intelligent Projector

WHO makes and WHO receives?

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
= Lockdown

Traditional lockdown procedure PLUS

- Barricade the door
- Spread out within the room with Counter devices.
- Do not huddle.
- Look for alternate escape routes (another door/window)
- Do NOT open the door for anyone.
- Dial 911 when it is safe to do so
- First Aid supplies



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= Inform

Pass on real time information

- A Continuation of ALERT
- What, Where, When, Who, How

Typical Communication Methods


- PA System
- Phones
- Radios

New Technology Methods?

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How to COUNTER





Interrupt process of shooting accurately:

- Target acquisition
- Sight picture/Sight alignment
- Trigger control
- Stance
- Grip
- Breathing

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= Evacuate

The preferred response

- Occupants must have authority to leave building
- Leave all belongings behind
- No Vehicles
- Removes as many potential targets
- Removes need for parents to come to scene.
- Evacuate to a rally point.

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A.L.I.C.E. Implementation

• <u>Staff Training</u> – Administrators, teachers, secretaries, bus drivers, food service, guest teachers, health care aides, paraprofessionals, all key contracted staff

• <u>Supplemental Building Training</u> – Principals will lead additional training sessions with staff in October



A.L.I.C.E. Implementation

• Fall Crisis Drill – First lockdown drill will include minimum lockdown drill with A.L.I.C.E. education for students. Instructions will be appropriately tailored specifically for elementary, middle, and high school level students.

• Future Drills – Introduce elements of A.L.I.C.E. emergency response



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
