-Welcome -Secondary Math Teacher(s) share how they have used the tools provided by Land Trust Funds

Sheree Christensen and Julianna Lund reported. Secondary Math II PLC attended training during the summer. 12 laptops were purchased for each teachers' classroom. They are used to access Canvas and ALEKS. Secondary Math II students can retake tests and have a lab option as an elective class. Canvas helps teachers collect data to improve student learning. Canvas has also created more conversation between teacher and students related to math content.

Continued needs include: graphing calculators and paid time for continued improvement and implementation of Canvas.

-Approval of December 6 Meeting Minutes

-Mr. Brian Hunt, Principal Report (given by Tyler Poll)

First semester data shows that GPA has increased and the number of F's has decreased.

Three ceramics students have advanced to Nationals.

First Night is planned for February 7, 2018 at 5:30 to welcome all incoming sophomores.

February has been named CTE month by Governor Herbert. CTE Pathways are being introduced to students who can earn certificates based on the Pathways they complete.

-Appointment of a school employee to fill the unexpired term of Dawna Burton because she retired last month

The NHS Community Council will discuss names and a person will be appointed to finish the remained of Mrs. Burton's term, which ends this school year.

-Identify and Summarize Progress and Needs by collecting data and monitoring Trust Land funds

Mr. Poll reported that the DSD has granted the school \$45,000 for productivity which frees up some Land Trust monies allocated for productivity in the NHS School

Improvement Plan. Mr. Poll proposed moving the \$45,000 gain under goal #1 of NHS School Improvement Plan from salaries to equipment. He also proposed the money be spent on an Interactive Video Conferencing lab to stream instructor-taught courses in and out of the building. Allen Miller motioned to approve. Robert Shaffer seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous.

-Begin 2018/2019 SIP/School Land Trust Process Develop a School Improvement Plan (SIP): Annually evaluate school test results and use evaluation in creating or modifying the plan. Create the School Land Trust Program: Outline how the school will use the money for the implementation of a component of the school's improvement plan.

The school anticipates receiving approximately \$10,000 more in Land Trust monies for the new year. It was proposed to keep the salaries/ benefits sections the same, but to revise the rest of the plan to address technology and professional development needs. The revision would include teachers applying for the money through a grant process. Grants will be offered to teachers who connect their needs to goals in NHS School Improvement Plan. Mr. Poll will email the council with exact numbers and grant applications so that the plan can be finalized before the next meeting.

-Knights' Pride Food Pantry

NHS Studentbody and local community groups and churches have helped collect over \$41,000 in money and food donations for the Superbowl of Caring. NHS is 2nd in the state and 5th in the nation for the Superbowl of Caring total donations.
