MOTION: Made by Dennis Slopak (seconded by Aaron Daniels) to approve the First Student

Transportation RFP award. Motion passed 7-1. Patricia Staley voted in opposition.

Leadership Evaluation Committee

Joyce Werden reported that Heather Romanski and Tricia Staley have joined the committee. The committee has looked at the evaluation time line and has decided to move the Board self-evaluation to the Fall.

Made by Dennis Slopak (seconded by Mark Kulos) for the Board of Education, Pursuant to C.G.S. Section 10-215f. to certify that all food items offered for sale to students in the schools under its jurisdiction, and not exempted from the Connecticut Nutrition Standards published by the Connecticut State Department of Education, will comply with the Connecticut Nutrition Standards during the period of July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019. This certification shall include all food offered for sale to students separately from reimbursable meals at all times and from all sources, including but not limited to, school stores, vending machines, school cafeterias, and any fundraising activities on school premises sponsored by the school or by non-school organizations and groups. Motion passed unanimously.

MOTION:

Made by Dennis Slopak (seconded by Patricia Staley) to allow the sale to students of food items that do not meet the Connecticut Nutrition Standards provided that the following conditions are met: 1) the sale is in connection with an event occurring after the end of the regular school day or on the weekend; 2) the sale is at the location of the event; and 3) the food items are not sold from a vending machine or school store. An "event" is an occurrence that involves more than just a regularly scheduled practice, meeting, or extracurricular activity. Motion passed unanimously.

MOTION:

Made by Robert Aldi (seconded by Mark Kulos) for the Board of Education to allow the sale to students of beverages not listed in Section 10-221q of the Connecticut General Statutes provided that the following conditions are met: 1) the sale is in connection with an event occurring after the end of the regular school day or on the weekend; 2)

the sale is at the location of the event; and 3) the beverages are not sold from a vending machine or school store. Motion passed unanimously.

MOTION: Made by Aaron Daniels (seconded by Joyce Werden) to accept the Kelly Middle School

construction project 104-0112 as complete. Motion passed unanimously.
