PROPOSITION NO. 1

(Ladd Farm Site)

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of Central School District No. 1 of the Towns of Victor, Farmington and East Bloomfield, Ontario County, and Perinton, Monroe County, New York, be authorized to acquire by purchase at a cost of not exceeding \$5,000.00, the following described land located in said District, namely:

All that tract or parcel of land situate in the Town of Victor, County of Ontario, and State of New York, being partly within the Village of Victor, and bounded as follows: Beginning at the northeast corner of a parcel of land conveyed by Joseph Perkins and wife to Axel Perkins by deed dated July 1, 1899, and recorded in Liber 69 of Deeds at page 385, said point being also located on the center line of the said Town of Victor, also known as the three-mile line; thence southerly on a line forming an angle of 90° 31' 3" with said three-mile line in the southwest quadrant 764.88 feet; thence westerly on a line forming an angle of 89° 29' 27" with the last described course in the northwest quadrant 368.73 feet; thence southerly on a line forming an angle of 89° 29' 27" in the southeast quadrant with the last described course 727.68 feet; thence westerly on a line forming an angle of 89° 0' 17" in the northwest quadrant with the last described course 246.45 feet; thence southerly on a line forming an angle of 17° 2' in the southeast quadrant with the last described course 20.12 feet; thence northerly on a line forming an angle of 89° 29' 27" in the northwest quadrant with the last de-

scribed course 170.63 feet; thence southwesterly on a line forming an angle of 80° 22' 57" in the southeast quadrant with the last described course 179.75 feet more or less to the center line of High Street; thence northerly along said center line of High Street forming an angle of 89° 33' 32" in the northwest quadrant with the last described course 197.43 feet; thence northerly and continuing in the center line of said highway and deflecting 25° 22' 17" toward the right from the last described course 161.51 feet; thence northerly and continuing in the center line of said highway and deflecting 25° 01' 55" toward the left from the last described course 773.82 feet; thence northerly on a line forming an angle in the northeast quadrant of 125° 28' 35" with the last described course 708.75 feet to a point in the center line of said town, also known as the three-mile line; thence westerly on said three-mile line forming an angle of 74° 49' 32" in the southwest quadrant with the last described course 677.20 feet to the center line of High Street; thence northerly along said center line of said highway and forming an angle of 115° 2' 56" in the northeast quadrant with the last described course 1204.40 feet; thence northerly on a line forming an angle of 128° 22' 25" on the east side with the last described course 86.48 feet; thence northerly on a line deflecting 24° 54' 16" to the left from the last described course 1688.38 feet to the center line of Aldine Road; thence easterly along the center line of said road and forming an angle of 90° 52' 27" in the southeast quadrant

with the last described course 1304.89 feet to an angle in said road; thence northerly and continuing along said center line and deflecting 169° 38' to the left from the last described course 864.09 feet; thence southerly on a line forming an angle of 72° 12' 51" in the southwest quadrant with the last described course 307.04 feet to a point in the center line of said Town of Victor, also known as the three-mile line; thence easterly along said center line of said town and forming an angle of 89° with the last described course 131.60 feet to the place of beginning, containing 174.24 acres of land be the same more or less.

Excepting and reserving from the above described premises a parcel of land conveyed by John M. Ladd and wife to Homer D. Jacobs and wife by Deed dated December 8, 1928, recorded in Ontario County Clerk's Office in Liber 340 of Deeds at page 118, situate on the east side of the road leading from the Village of Victor to Valentine's Hall, and being an extension of High Street, bounded and described as follows: Beginning at an iron pin on the east line of said road, said pin being south of the Tenant House now standing on said premises; thence south 89° 30' east 70.30 feet to an iron pin; thence north 1° 45' east 288.6 feet to an iron pin; thence south 81° 39' west 143.3 feet to an iron pin on the east line of said road; thence south 15° 2' east 244.9 feet to the place of beginning, containing 265 acres be the same more or less.

Which land is hereby designated as the site for the new central school building and bus garage to be constructed with Federal aid; the cost of the acquisition of said land shall be paid out of the tax of not exceeding \$275,000 heretofore voted by the voters of said central school district at a meeting held on the 30th day of September, 1938, authorizing the raising of said tax, among other things, for the selection of a site on which to erect a central school building and bus garage, and said tax of not exceeding \$275,000 upon all the taxable property in said School District shall be raised, levied, and collected in annual installments as provided by Section 467 of the Education Law.

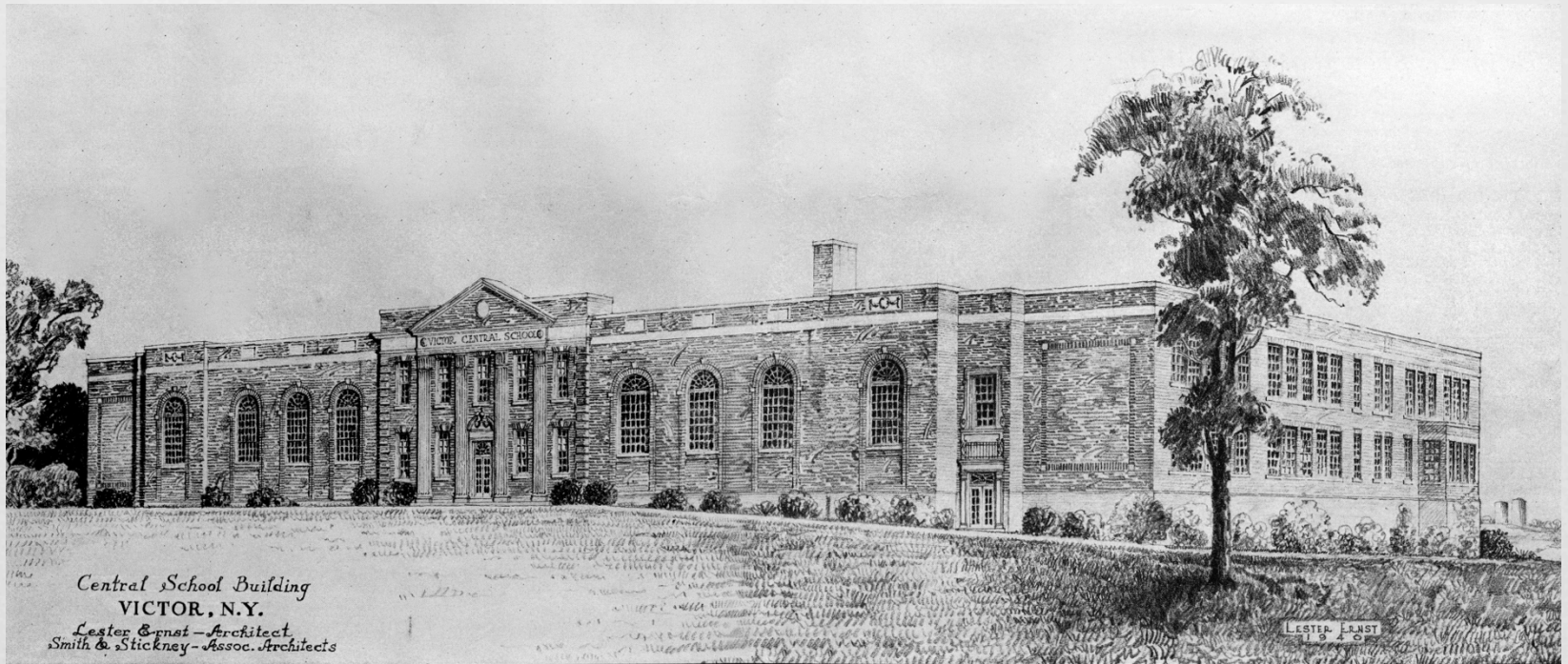

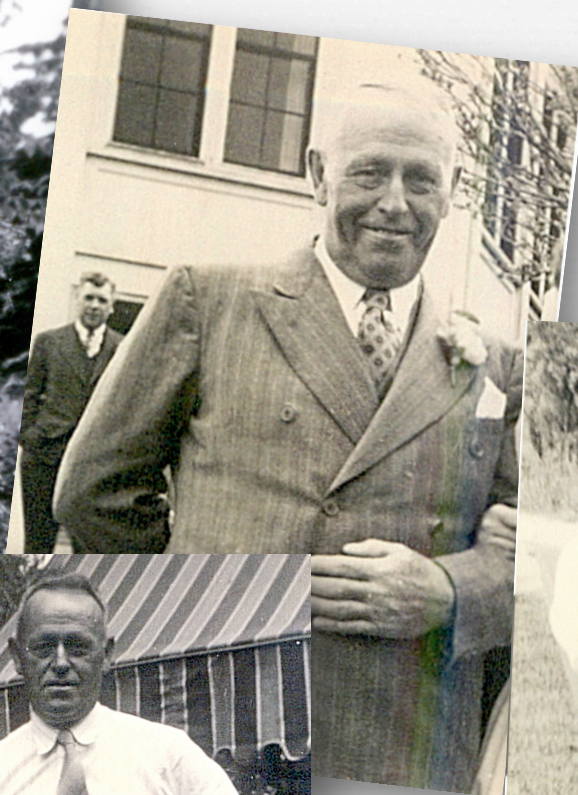
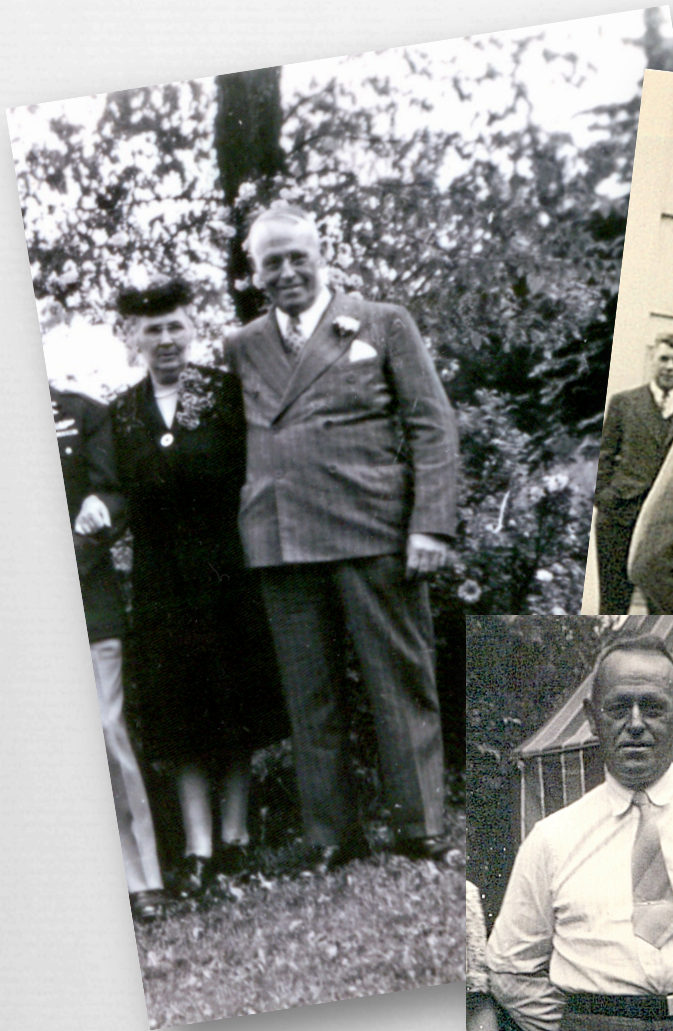
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
