TOPIC: **RESOLUTION NO. 21-18-19: FINDINGS PERTAINING TO DEVELOPER FEES AND APPROVAL OF THE COMBINED ANNUAL AND FIVE-YEAR DEVELOPER FEE REPORT**

DESCRIPTION: Government Code Section 66001 and Section 66006 require districts to be accountable for developer fees that are collected and expended on both an annual and five-year basis.

The annual report focuses on the amount of developer fees collected and expended throughout the fiscal year. The five-year report requires a more detailed analysis of a district's overall use of developer fees. It is more convenient for districts to prepare a comprehensive report each fiscal year that includes both the annual and five-year collection and expenditure information. By combining these two reports, it guards against the potential penalty of refunding unexpended developer fees for failure to timely report expenditures in the appropriate year.

Although not required by a resolution, the report findings are often made in the form of a resolution that is adopted by the governing board to facilitate compliance with the requisite codes and regulations.

The annual report must be made within 180 days from the last day of the fiscal year. The five-year findings must be presented for approval by the governing board in conjunction with an annual report. The completed reports and applicable findings must be available for public review at least 15 days prior to approval by the governing board.

Combined Annual and Five-year Developer Fees Report Fiscal Year 2017/18

Background

Education Code Section 17620, et seq., and Government Code Section 65995, et seq., authorize school districts to impose fees on residential, commercial, and industrial developments to mitigate the impact of the development on a school district's facilities. On January 24, 2018, the State Allocation Board (SAB) acted to increase the Level I Developer Fees for both residential and commercial/industrial construction pursuant to Education Code Section 17620 and Government Code Section 65995.

The Level I fee for residential construction was increased from \$3.48 to \$3.79 per square foot of new residential construction. The Level I fee for commercial/industrial construction was increased from \$0.56 to \$0.61 per square foot of new commercial/industrial construction. These fees are collected by the District at the maximum allowable rates. The District will perform its next Developer Fee Justification Study in 2020 concurrently with the SAB adjusting rates at its January 2020 meeting.

For the period July 1, 2017, through April 15, 2018, the Level I Developer Fee amounts were \$3.48 for residential \$0.56 for commercial/industrial. For the period April 16, 2018, through June 30, 2018, the Level I Developer Fee amounts were \$3.79 for residential \$0.61 for commercial/industrial.

Reporting Requirements

Government Code Section 66001 and Section 66006 require districts to be accountable for the fees that are collected and expended on both an annual and five-year basis.

Annual Report - The annual report focuses on the amount of developer fees collected and expended throughout the fiscal year and must include the following:

- Type of fees collected
- Amounts collected
- Beginning and ending balances of accounts
- Total amounts collected and interest earned
- Information regarding each project on which fees were expended
- Identification of any interfund transfers or loans, if applicable
- Amounts of any refunds

Five-year Report – The five-year report requires a more detailed analysis of a district's overall use of developer fees. The purpose of the five-year report is to illustrate to what extent the fees collected for development are necessary in meeting the district's facility program needs

with respect to housing students and mitigating the impact of growth associated with the development. The five-year plan should include findings that:

- Identify the purposes to which the fees will be put
- Demonstrate the nexus between the fees and the purposes for which they are charged
- Identify the sources and amounts of funding anticipated to complete the financing of incomplete projects
- Identify the approximate date(s) when the funding referred in bullet point 3 above is expected to be deposited into the respective district account(s)

Findings – Although not required by a resolution, these findings are often made in the form of a resolution that is adopted by the governing board to facilitate compliance with the requisite codes and regulations. Resolution 21-18-19 Findings Pertaining to Developers Fees, is available under separate cover.

Timeline – The annual report must be made within 180 days from the last day of the fiscal year. The five-year findings must be presented for approval by the governing board in conjunction with an annual report. It is more convenient for districts to prepare a comprehensive report each fiscal year that includes both the annual and five-year collection and expenditure information. By combining these two reports, it guards against the potential penalty of refunding unexpended developer fees for failure to timely report expenditures in the appropriate year.

Report Availability and Notification –The completed reports and applicable findings must be available for public review at least 15 days prior to approval by the governing board. Although a public hearing is not required, notices must be mailed to any interested party who files a written request for a mailed notification. A notice was posted on the District’s Web site and the information has been available since Monday, October 1, 2018. The District did not received any requests for mailed notification.

RESOLUTION NO. 21-18-19

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE
ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT,
COUNTY OF ORANGE, CALIFORNIA,
FINDINGS PERTAINING TO DEVELOPER FEES**

- WHEREAS, the Orange Unified School District (“District”) has received and expended statutory and/or alternative school facilities fees (“Reportable Fees”) for the construction and/or modernization of the District’s school facilities in order to accommodate students from new development (“School Facilities”); and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 66006(a), the District has established and maintained a separate capital facilities account for the Reportable Fees (“Reportable Fees Account”); and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 66006(a), the Reportable Fees have been deposited into the Reportable Fees Account in order to avoid any commingling of the Reportable Fees with other revenues and funds of the District, except for temporary investments, and has expended the Reportable Fees, along with any interest income earned, solely for the purpose(s) for which the Reportable Fees were originally collected; and
- WHEREAS, Government Code Section 66006(b)(1) provides that the District shall make a written report containing certain required information available to the public within one hundred eighty (180) days after the last day of each fiscal year; and
- WHEREAS, Government Code Section 66006(b)(2) requires that the Board of Education (“Board”) of the District review the information made available to the public, including the report entitled, “Combined Annual and Five-year Developer Fee Reports” (“Report”) for the 2017/18 fiscal year in compliance with Government Code Section 66006 and Section 66001, at least fifteen (15) days after the Report was made available to the public; and
- WHEREAS, the Report contains the requisite information and proposed findings concerning the collection and expenditure of Reportable Fees pursuant to Government Code Section 66006 and Section 66001; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 66006(b)(2), notice of the time and place of the Board meeting, where the Report would be considered for adoption (“Notice”), was mailed at least fifteen (15) days prior to the Board meeting to any interested party who filed a written request with the District for mailed Notice of the Board meeting; and

WHEREAS, the District posted the Public Notice Regarding Annual Developer Fees Report in the District's regular posting locations and on the District's Web site; and

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 66001(d) provides that for the fifth fiscal year following the first deposit into the Reportable Fees Account, and every five years thereafter, the District shall make findings with respect to the portion of the Reportable Fees Account that remains unexpended; and

WHEREAS, when Government Code Section 66001(d) requires certain findings, these findings will be made at the same time as that information required by Government Code §66006(b); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 66001(e) and (f), the District shall make certain findings when sufficient Reportable Fees have been collected to complete the financing of incomplete School Facilities Projects ("Project(s)), and the Projects remain incomplete; and

WHEREAS, the District has complied with all of the foregoing provisions.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Education of the Orange Unified School District hereby resolves and declares as follows:

The Board finds and determines that the foregoing recitals and determinations are correct.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 66006(a), the District has established and maintained a Reportable Fees Account during fiscal year 2017/18.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 66006(a), the Reportable Fees collected during fiscal year 2017/18 have been deposited into the Reportable Fees Account in order to avoid any commingling of the Reportable Fees with other revenues and funds of the District, except for temporary investments, and has expended the Reportable Fees, along with any interest income earned, solely for the purpose(s) for which the Reportable Fees were originally collected.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 66006(b)(1), the District made the Report available to the public within 180 days after the last day of fiscal year 2017/18.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 66006(b)(1), the Board reviewed the Report at the next regularly-scheduled public meeting, at least 15 days after the Report was made available to the public.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 66006(b)(1) and (2), the Board reviewed the Report, which is incorporated by this reference and contains the following information:

1. A brief description of the type of Reportable Fees in the Reportable Fees Account;
2. The amount of the Reportable Fees;
3. The beginning and ending balance of the Reportable Fees Account;
4. The amount of Reportable Fees collected and the interest earned;
5. An identification of each Project on which Reportable Fees were expended and the amount of the expenditures on each Project, including the total percentage of the cost of the Project that was funded with Reportable Fees;
6. An identification of an approximate date by which the construction of the Project will commence if the District determines that sufficient funds have been collected to complete financing on an incomplete Project, as identified in Government Code Section 66001(a)(2), and the Project remains incomplete;
7. A description of each interfund transfer or loan made from the Reportable Fees Account, including the Project on which the transferred or loaned Reportable Fees will be expended, and, in the case of an interfund loan, the date on which the loan will be repaid, and the rate of interest that the Reportable Fees Account will receive on the loan; and
8. The amount of refunds made pursuant to Government Code Section 66001(e) and any allocations pursuant to Government Code Section 66001(f).

Pursuant to Government Code Section 66006(b)(2), Notice was mailed at least fifteen (15) days prior to the Board meeting to any interested party who filed a written request with the District for mailed Notice of the Board meeting.

The District posted the Public Notice Regarding Annual Developer Fees Report in the District's regular posting locations and on the District's Web site.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 66001(d)(1), the Board reviewed the Report, which is incorporated by this reference and contains the following proposed findings:

1. Identification of the purposes to which the Reportable Fees are to be put;
2. Demonstration of a reasonable relationship between the Reportable Fees and the purpose for which they are charged;
3. Identification of all sources and amounts of funding anticipated to complete incomplete Projects of the District; and
4. Designation of the approximate dates on which the funding referred to in paragraph (3) is expected to be deposited into the respective District account(s).

When findings are required by Government Code Section 66001(d), these findings shall be made at the same time as the findings as that information required by Government Code Section 66006(b).

Pursuant to Government Code Section 66001(e) and (f), the District shall make certain findings when sufficient Reportable Fees have been collected to complete the financing of incomplete Projects, and the Projects remain incomplete.

The Board determines that the District is in compliance with Government Code Section 66000, et seq., regarding the receipt, deposit, investment, expenditure, and/or refund of Reportable Fees received and expended relative to Projects for fiscal year 2015/16.

The Board determines that no refunds and allocations of Reportable Fees, as required by Government Code Section 66001(e) and Section 66006(b)(1)(H), are deemed payable at this time for fiscal year 2017/18.

TOPIC: PUBLIC HEARING AND ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION NO. 19-18-19, SOLAR POWER INITIATIVE

DESCRIPTION: At the July 26, 2018 regular meeting, the Board of Education received information regarding the installation of solar panels at various sites throughout the District. The Board acknowledged the two vendor proposals analyzed by EcoMotion (District solar energy consultant) and directed staff to move forward on negotiations with Ameresco Inc. The following sites are considered viable locations (indicating a net cash flow savings) for the installation of solar arrays:

- El Modena High School
- Orange High School
- Maintenance, Operation, & Transportation (Collins Site)
- Portola Middle School
- Yorba Middle School
- Canyon Rim Elementary School
- McPherson Magnet School
- Santiago Charter Middle School

Based on Board direction, the District analyzed the details of both the Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) and Lease/Purchase options provided by Ameresco and are recommending moving forward on a PPA. Contract options were negotiated in compliance with the provisions of California Government Code, Chapter 3.2, Section 4217, Energy Conservation Contracts (designed to encourage Public Agencies to enact Section 25008 of the public Resources Code calling for Energy Conservation/Generation projects).


A public hearing was noticed as of October 24, 2018 on the District website and posted conspicuously at 1401 N. Handy Street, Orange, CA in accordance with Government Code 4217.10 and, accordingly, will be held at tonight's meeting.

FISCAL IMPACTS: The solar feasibility analysis for the sites identified herein determined there is a net cash flow savings as a result of the installation of solar arrays at these sites.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended the Board of Education hold a Public Hearing, adopt Resolution 19-18-19, and enter into a Power Purchase Agreement contract with Ameresco for the eight viable locations as listed.

WHEREAS, Government Code sections 4217.10 through 4217.18 authorize the District's Governing Board, without advertising for bids, to enter into one or more energy service contracts with any person or entity, pursuant to which that person or entity will provide electrical or thermal energy or conservation services to the District, which may comprise or include an energy conservation facility, if the anticipated cost to the District for thermal or electrical energy or conservation services provided under the contract(s) is less than the anticipated marginal cost to the District of thermal, electrical, or other energy that would have been consumed by the District in the absence of those energy service contracts;

WHEREAS, the Orange Unified School District ("District") finds it to be in the best interests of the District to implement projects to promote energy efficiency and renewable energy production to achieve energy cost reductions;

WHEREAS, District staff reviewed the qualifications presented by AMERESCO, INC. to conduct and provide assessment of school district energy usage, energy needs and opportunities to reduce energy expenses, found AMERESCO, INC.'s qualifications to appear bona fide and adequate;

WHEREAS, AMERESCO, INC. has offered to enter into the attached Power Purchase Agreement (Exhibit "A") to provide energy conservation services to implement the recommended energy conservation measures for the price stated therein;

WHEREAS, certain details remain to be negotiated to reach a final form of Power Purchase Agreement to provide energy conservation services to implement the recommended energy conservation measures for the price stated therein, prefatory to a final Power Purchase Agreement being approved by the Board;

WHEREAS, ECOMOTION, INC. assessed the feasibility of displacing purchases of electricity from Southern California Edison with electrical energy generated by certain solar photovoltaic systems to be designed, built, operated and maintained by ECOMOTION, INC. to reduce the District's energy consumption and expense and recommended specific energy conservation measures based thereon ("Analysis," Exhibit "B"), upon which the Board and District administration and staff have relied;

WHEREAS, the Analysis demonstrates that the cost of the Power Purchase Agreements to the District for the thermal or electrical energy or conservation services provided thereunder is less than the anticipated marginal cost to the District of thermal, electrical, or other energy that would have been consumed by the District in the absence of the Power Purchase Agreements ("Savings");

WHEREAS, on the date of this Resolution, the Board held a public hearing on the subject matter of this Resolution, notice of which was given not less than two weeks prior thereto;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT DOES HEREBY FIND, RESOLVE, DETERMINE, AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals. All of the recitals herein contained are true and correct.

Section 2. Energy Savings Findings. The Governing Board of the Orange Unified School District finds that the cost of the Power Purchase Agreements to the District for the thermal or electrical energy or conservation services provided thereunder is less than the anticipated marginal cost to the District of thermal, electrical, or other energy that would have been consumed by the District in the absence of the Power Purchase Agreements and that it is in the best interest of the District to approve and enter into the Power Purchase Agreements.

Section 3. Delegation of Authority to Finalize and Execute Power Purchase Agreements. The Governing Board of the Orange Unified School District hereby delegates authority to the Superintendent, or her designee, under Education Code section 17604 to finalize and execute the Power Purchase Agreement, subject to the later formal approval of the Governing Board.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect upon adoption.







DESCRIPTION: Staff will provide a Measure S Capital Facilities Program status report and overview of work currently in progress as it relates to the initial scope of work for the science center projects at the four comprehensive high schools.

TOPIC: **CALIFORNIA'S ACCOUNTABILITY AND CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT SYSTEM**

DESCRIPTION: California's accountability and continuous improvement system reported through the California School Dashboard is now in its second reporting cycle. The purpose of the Dashboard is to report on district, school and student group performance on multiple indicators aligned to the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) and state priorities. Performance levels are displayed using a color system for the state indicators: Academic Indicator English/Language Arts, Academic Indicator Math, English Learner Progress, Suspension Rate, and College/Career Readiness, and new this year, Chronic Absenteeism. Since state data is not available for some priority areas identified by LCFF, the State Board of Education approved local indicators and self-reflection tools for districts to use to measure progress. LEAs are required to collect and report information on the local indicators; Basic Services, Implementation of State Standards, Parent Engagement, School Climate, and Access to Broad Course of Study.

In compliance with state regulations, an annual presentation to the Board of Trustees will be held to report the District's progress on the Local Indicators using locally collected data. This report will include the District's current performance in each area, represented by a final rating of met, not met, or not met for two or more years.

STUDY TRIPS

DESCRIPTION:

Jordan Elementary - 6th Grade Class – Arrowhead Ranch – Outdoor Science School – January 18 - 22, 2019

The sixth grade students from Jordan Elementary, under the supervision of teachers Rebeca Nelson and Marina Ballesteros, as well as trained camp staff, will participate in the Arrowhead Ranch Outdoor Science School program. This five-day program provides students an opportunity to explore established trails, investigate geological features, observe wildlife and compare plant adaptations. Students will study the night sky through telescopes, participate in line and folk dances, create and perform science and nature skits. The curriculum at the camp is aligned with the California Science Content Standards and the California Science Framework. Transportation to and from program will be provided by OUSD Transportation. The cost per student is \$264 and no student is prevented from making the field trip due to lack of sufficient funds per Education Code 35330(b), 35331.


Fletcher Elementary 6th Grade class - Outdoor Science School, PALI Institute, Running Springs, CA - February 11 - 13, 2019

The 6th grade students from Fletcher Elementary, under the supervision of teacher Lingyu Du, as well as trained PALI Institute camp staff, will participate in the Outdoor Science School Program. This two-day program provides students an opportunity to explore established trails, investigate geological features, observe wildlife and compare plant adaptations. Students will study the night sky through telescopes, participate in line and folk dances, create and perform science and nature skits. The cost per student is \$200 and no student is prevented from making the field trip due to lack of enough funds per Education Code 35330(b), 35331.

Anaheim Hills Elementary - 6th Grade Class – Twin Peaks - Outdoor Science School – February 25 – March 1, 2019

The sixth grade students from Anaheim Hills Elementary, under the supervision of teachers Jeff Hawley and Christopher Tanioka, as well as trained camp staff, will participate in Arrowhead Ranch's Outdoor Science School program. This five-day program provides students an opportunity to explore established trails, investigate geological features, observe wildlife and compare plant adaptations. Students will study the night sky through telescopes, participate in line and folk

La Veta Elementary School – 6th Grade Class – OCDE – ECOS Institute Outdoor Science School – Green Valley Lake, CA - March 6 - 8, 2019

The sixth grade students from La Veta Elementary, under the supervision of teachers Lisa Shipman, Michelle Kauten and Andrew Matos, as well as trained Emerald Cove Outdoor Science (ECOS) Institute staff, will participate in the Outdoor Science School Program. This three-day, two-night program is comprised of days in the foothills where students experience physical, earth and life science principles through hands on lessons, outdoor activities and team building games. It is rich in content and addresses over 100 California State Standards. Gains in student learning are noteworthy and are measured through pre and post assessment activities. Transportation to and from the event will be provided by OUSD Transportation. The cost per student is \$320 and no student is prevented from making the field trip due to lack of sufficient funds per Ed Code 35330(b), 35331.

Crescent Elementary School – 5th Grade GATE Classes – Ocean Institute, Life in the Abyss, Dana Point – March 18 - 19, 2019 and March 19 - 20, 2019

The fifth grade GATE classes under the supervision of teachers Sharon Cecchi and Jennifer Bond from Crescent Elementary will travel to the Ocean Institute in Dana Point. The students will discover how blood circulates through the heart chambers, lungs and body and how carbon dioxide and oxygen are exchanged in the lungs and tissues. Students collect data and draw conclusions from their findings. The curriculum is aligned with California Science Content Standards and the California Science Framework. Transportation to and from the event will be provided by OUSD Transportation. The cost per student is \$110 and no student is prevented from making the field trip due to lack of sufficient funds per Education Code 35330(b), 35331.

Palmyra Elementary – 6th Grade Class – ECOS – Outdoor Science School – March 18 - 22, 2019

The sixth grade students from Palmyra Elementary, under the supervision of teachers Cynthia Thomas and Tanita Slattery,

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as well as trained ECOS staff, will participate in the Emerald Cove Outdoor Science School program. This five-day program provides students an opportunity to explore established trails, investigate geological features, observe wildlife and compare plant adaptations. The curriculum at the camp is aligned with the California Science Content Standards and the California Science Framework. Transportation to and from the program will be provided by OUSD Transportation. The cost per student is \$395 and no student is prevented from making the field trip due to lack of sufficient funds per Education Code 35330(b), 35331.

Linda Vista Elementary – 6th Grade Class – Camp Marston Outdoor Ed – Julian, CA - March 25 - 29, 2019

The sixth grade students from Linda Vista, under the direction of teachers Kelly Ward and Tamara Winslow, will participate in the High Trails Science School program. This five-day program provides students an opportunity to study science in a natural setting. Students will have the opportunity to explore established trails, investigate geological features, and observe wildlife and compare plant adaptations. Students will study the night sky through telescopes, participate in line and folk dances, create and perform science and nature skits. The curriculum at the camp is aligned with the California Science Content Standards and the California Science Framework. Students attending the program are responsible for the program cost. There is no impact to the general fund. The cost will not exceed \$300 per student and no student is prevented from making the field trip due to lack of sufficient funds per Ed Code 35330(b). 35331.

Serrano Elementary School – 6th grade class – YMCA Camp Marston Outdoor Science School – Julian, CA - March 25 – 29, 2019

The sixth grade students from Serrano Elementary, under the supervision of teachers Suzanne Kent, Art Coony and Linda Harestad, as well as trained YMCA of San Diego County camp staff, will participate in the Outdoor Science School Program. This five-day program provides students an opportunity to explore established trails, investigate geological features, observe wildlife and compare plan adaptations. Students will study the night sky through telescopes, participate in line and folk dances, create and perform science and nature skits. The curriculum at the camp is aligned with the California Science Content Standards and the California Science Framework. Transportation to and from the event will be provided by OUSD Transportation. The cost per student is approximately \$300 and no student is prevented from making

The curriculum at the camp is aligned with the California Science Content Standards and the California Science Framework. Transportation to and from program will be provided by OUSD Transportation. The cost per student is \$330 and no student is prevented from making the field trip due to lack of sufficient funds per Education Code 35330(b), 35331.

Crescent Elementary School – 4th Grade GATE Classes – Toyon Bay - Catalina Island Marine Institute – May 13 - 15, 2019

The fourth grade GATE students from Crescent Elementary, under the supervision of teachers Jennifer Bond and Kathleen Losi, as well as trained Marine Institute staff, will travel to Catalina Island Marine Institute. The students will be accompanied by five female and five male chaperones. The program focuses on hands on experience in Science. This program includes a combination of labs, aquariums and touch tanks on land as well as snorkeling, kayaking and collecting data in the field. Students and teachers will learn about the many eco-systems of the island and ocean and get to see and touch a whole range of fish, algae, sharks and rays. Transportation to and from the event will be provided by OUSD Transportation and Catalina Classic Cruises. The fifth grade students from Canyon Rim Elementary, under direction of teachers Heather Nevin, Dorielle Davidson, and Barbara Wright, as well as trained camp staff, will travel to Riley’s Farm. The students will be accompanied by five female and five male adult chaperones. The students will have the opportunity to participate in a “living history adventure tour.” Students will be re-enacting past events in America’s history, with special attention to the Revolutionary



TOPIC: ANAHEIM HILLS ELEMENTARY AND GREEN UP OUR SCHOOLS

DESCRIPTION: Green Up Our Schools is a 501c3 non-profit organization whose mission is to reduce the amount of material sent to landfills through early student engagement. Elementary schools submit applications for consideration and, if accepted, receive \$2,000 over three years (\$1,000 the first year and \$500 for each of the next two years). Accepted schools complete a schoolwide waste audit, and will receive personalized assistance from Green Up Our Schools staff in achieving two waste reduction goals each year.

This is to certify that this item was approved by the Board of Education.



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Green Up does not visit the school campus. Examples of waste reduction goals include running a zero waste lunch campaign on campus, starting a composting program, installing paper re-use boxes in each classroom, reducing paper towel waste, and many others. In addition to the two yearly goals, each school must form a student green team, meeting minimally once a month, and complete two school-wide waste assessments, submit waste audit data twice a year via shared google drive folder, and hold a school-wide assembly about waste reduction and the selected projects. The program has an emphasis on student engagement and students use of sound data to make the call when it comes to the topics they want to address at their school.

Anaheim Hills would like to participate in the program again and request a three-year approval to work with Green Up Our Schools.

FISCAL IMPACT: Receipt of funds for Anaheim Hills Elementary School over three years totaling \$2,000.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the Green Up Our Schools program.

TOPIC: **BOOSTER CLUBS**

DESCRIPTION: Booster Clubs are separate organizations from a school district that contribute financial and moral support to various sports, clubs and organization on school sites. California Education Code section 51521 requires all organizations that conduct fundraising to benefit clubs, schools, students and the district have prior approval from the district's governing board. The District adopted Board Policy 1230 and administrative regulations to establish specific conditions and controls for the relationship between organizations and the District. The list of school booster organizations below have completed the required application and provided a list of site officers, tax identification numbers, non-profit 501(c)(3), bylaws, proposed budget and proposed activities. These documents have been reviewed by the site principal and District administration for submission for Board approval. Booster Clubs may be revoked by the Principal and shall be reauthorized by the Board of Education every five years.




1. Sufficient Instructional Materials
