## **Briarwood Makerspace**

Did you know that Briarwood has a dedicated Makerspace for all grades?? You might be asking......"What exactly is a Makerspace? What does this mean for my kid(s)?"

A makerspace is simply a space designed and dedicated to hands-on creativity and the key is that the students are making something. Creativity is sometimes idea generation, it's sometimes problem-solving. But in a makerspace, the students create some kind of product. It could be a digital product. It could be a physical product. The Makerspace is a place to explore, be creative, expand imaginations, use technology, learn to do something new and challenge self.

The Briarwood Makerspace has been stocked with many resources - from your basic craft supplies but also more sophisticated tools:

- Sphero An app-controlled robotic ball that can be programmed. The SPRK Lighting Lab app empowers anyone to program their robot. The visual block-based building interface makes learning the basics of programming easy and fun.
- Dot & Dash These are real robots that teach kids programming while they play. Make the robots sing, dance and navigate obstacles using the free apps via a tablet or smartphone.
- Keva Planks Wooden planks designed to allow students to design and build structures such
  as towers, bridges, catapults and more. Keva planks are a great solo or teamwork STEAM
  activity and help to encourage critical thinking skills.
- Makey Makey It's a simple invention kit for beginners and experts doing art, engineering, and everything in between. Turn everyday objects into touchpads and combine them with the internet.
- little Bits littleBits invented the electronic building block! Magnetic "Bits" snap together to turn ideas into inventions, transforming the way kids learn.
- Green screen equipment screens, stands lights currently used to produce the school announcements.
- 3D printers
- Drones
- Sewing Machine

In addition, the following are a few additional items that have just been approved for purchase this year!

- LEGO WeDo kits A robotics hardware and software platform
- Osmo Coding Awbie and Jam Coding Awbie is an easy way to introduce coding to a child.
   Jam introduces them to making music.
- Peel and stick LEGO plates
- Star Wars Droid Inventor Kit Students can create their own Droid and bring it to life using littleBits electronic blocks.
- Keva Plank Idea Cards and Connectors

As you can imagine, it takes a lot of supplies to keep our Makerspace stocked. Throughout the year, we will ask for simple donations when we are running low on supplies. At this time, we are asking for specialized volunteers to help with these more advanced tools. As you can imagine, it is difficult for one teacher to assist 20+ kids in learning how to use the 3D printer or sewing machine!!

## Food Service Updates

Did you know all students will receive a full breakfast and a full lunch regardless of the money they have in their account effective November 1, 2018?

- School Café is the parent portal for Shawnee Mission School District food service. The link to instructions for using School Café https://www.smsd.org/about/departments/food-service. Parents can:
- View their children's account balance and purchases
- Set restrictions for ala carte purchases
- Submit free and reduced meal applications
- Set reminders for low account balances
- If a parent does not want their child to purchase anything from food service, they need to contact the food services office.
- Students will not be permitted to purchase ala carte items if their account is negative.
- Parents or guardians of all students will receive low account notifications via email or phone call if their students account is at \$8.00 or less for full price and \$2.00 or less for reduced price.
- Negative account notifications will be made to all students via parents or guardians email or phone call.
- All negative account balances will follow the student throughout the year.
- If the debt is not repaid, all negative account balances will be sent to the collection agency at the end of the school year.

Don't forget – if your child receives free or reduced meals, they are eligible for one breakfast and one lunch per day as part of this benefit. All breakfast and lunch meal choices are available for all students regardless of eligibility status. The school breakfast menus, lunch menus, and other nutrition information are available on the district's website at <a href="http://foodservices.smsd.org">http://foodservices.smsd.org</a>
