SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Mercy High School, a Catholic college preparatory school founded in 1931, is dedicated to educating young women of all cultural and economic backgrounds for academic excellence, compassionate service, Christian leadership, global awareness, and life-long learning. Rooted in Catherine McAuley's unique vision for women and the poor, Mercy High School is sponsored by the Sisters of Mercy. The faculty and staff work in collaboration with the Sisters of Mercy to create a Christian community which values hospitality and the dignity of each person. Mercy High School challenges its faculty, staff and students to act with integrity and work for justice.

Located on the Peninsula within the San Francisco Bay Area, Mercy draws students from as far South as Palo Alto, as far North as San Francisco, and includes International students, as well.

Mercy's current enrollment is 397 young women. There are 39 faculty on staff, and the student: faculty ratio is 10:1, and there are 4 full-time counselors on staff. The average class size is 18 students.

Admission is by entrance examination, recommendations, elementary school grades, and interview.

Mercy High School is one of 38 high schools sponsored by the Mercy Education System of the Americas. Mercy High School is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges and the Western Catholic Education Association.

ACADEMICS

Graduation Requirements

The academic program at Mercy High School is designed to prepare young women for college. A student must complete 280 units in order to graduate, in addition to completing 88 community service hours. Students are required to take Religion every year. Upon completion of these requirements, seniors will graduate June 2, 2019.

**AMES (Academic Mentoring Educational Support) is Mercy's program for students with documented learning differences. Students with the AMES class listed on their transcripts participate in a directed study hall. CORE is the class dedicated to freshmen in the AMES program which teaches study skills, time management and test taking strategies.*

Subject Requirements

Mercy requires the following minimum coursework:

English: 4 years, 40 credits

Math: 3 years, 30 credits

Health & Wellness: .5 years, 5 credits*

Religion: 4 years, 40 credits

Science: 3 years, 30 credits**

Social Science: 3 years, 30 credits

Visual/Performing Arts: 1 year, 10 credits

World Language: 2 years, 20 credits

Electives: 75 credits
