Parent-teacher conferences are scheduled for Wednesday, November 14th, 2018. Please sign in to Pick-A-Time through the Parent Portal link, **no later than 4:00 p.m. Monday**, **November 13, 2018.** The link to the Portal is below:

Pick a Time

All parents are welcome to attend these conferences and we encourage your child to attend with you, as many parents find it beneficial to include their children in discussions of their academic progress. Interviews involving the student, parent(s) and teacher allow for input and ideas to be shared amongst all of those responsible for monitoring your child's learning. Student participation in these interviews is in keeping with current best practices in education and helps students to become more aware of, and responsible for,

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their own learning and to enable them to focus on setting improvement goals. Students who do attend the parent-teacher conferences must wear their school uniforms.

In order to manage the number of people in the gym and to ensure there are minimal wait times to see each teacher, we are asking parents to select an arrival time (at 30-minute intervals). We are assuming that a typical visit to the gym will be between 45 minutes to 1 hour in length which should allow parents time to meet with all of their child's teachers. **Please note that teachers will be taking a dinner break between 4:30 – 5:30 p.m. and will not be available for conferences during this time.**

We will be asking you to **please limit your discussion to five minutes**. If further discussion is required, Teacher Contact Request forms will be available for you to request a specific teacher to contact you. These forms will be available on each table and by the front entrance to the gym.

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The Land of The Midnight Sun - Yukon Trip 2019



For the first time in our school's nearly 25 year history, a group of students will be heading to Canada's north for an experience that promises to be very memorable. At the end of June 2019, Mr. Mitchell and I will be taking 10 students to the Yukon for 10 days of service, adventure, history, and exploration. Perhaps I have chatted with you in the hallway about this trip at some point? Or, maybe you've picked up on my excitement about it through social media or Schoology? If not, I am here to tell you that I am indeed, very excited.

While in the Yukon our group will be doing a number of pretty neat things. The main focus however, will be to spend time in the Yukon community of <u>Carcross</u> (formerly Caribou Crossing) working with local indigenous youth from the Carcross-Tagish First Nation as volunteer members of their stewardship program and <u>Singletrack to Success</u> program. Our students will have the opportunity to volunteer alongside some incredible Yukon youth while they develop employable skills through hands-on experiences in

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indigenous ethnobotany, remediation of a residential school site, trail building, and maintenance up on the now world famous Montana mountain, and more!

In July 2018, as part of a pre-trip scouting mission to the Yukon, Mr. Mitchell and I had the pleasure of working with a few of the young men from the Singletrack to Success program who are responsible for the construction of the mountain bike trails that now draw riders from around the world. Four of the main builders, Shane (aka "Wallyman"), Mackenzie, Jared, and Dominic took us up the mountain, then rode down with us, pointing out the trail features they spent thousands of hours (collectively) building over the past few summers.



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The trails are *incredible*, and certainly comparable to anything you can find on the North Shore of Vancouver. The boys were proud of their work, and Mr. Mitchell and I could not believe the quality of their trails. Needless to say, our kids will be very fortunate to work with these fine youth this summer. Some of them will even get to maintain some of the very trails these fellas built up on sacred Montana mountain.

To ensure that we won't let them down when we arrive in July, Mr. Mitchell and I took our 10 student travelers up to Mt. Seymour for a day of instruction and hands on experience on Monday, November 5. We had the privilege and pleasure of taking part in the <u>North Shore Mountain Bike Association's Trail Academy</u>, **and what a day we had!**



After a brief classroom session at the North Vancouver Community Centre, all 12 of us got right into the trail work on Mount Seymour. We moved mountains, literally! Under the careful instruction of NSMBA trail builder extraordinaire, Penny Deck, we focused our efforts on a 200-meter section of a popular trail called "Severed". We moved countless wheelbarrows of golden mineral soil (known on the North Shore simply as "gold") and laid it overtop of a surface that had been eroded by riders and rain. We filled out and buffed up berms with layers of rock and soil. We cleared puddles and built drainage infrastructure into the trail to avoid future pooling. We carefully repositioned ferns and logs in an attempt to discourage riders from making their own paths. When we were done, our section of trail was a mountain biker's dream. At the end of the day, we made our way down the mountain and back to the bus, all the while Mr. Mitchell and I drooling at the thought of riding the work our group had just completed.

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I speak from experience when I say that days like these on the mountain, and trips like the one we're going to embark on this July, play a huge role in making Southridge the great school that it is. They offer our students opportunities for growth in areas that the classroom simply cannot. They teach our students about the importance of service to their local community, to their fellow Canadians, and to a larger global community. These experiences (away from the comforts and familiarity of home) help push our students out of their comfort zones, which as educators and parents, we understand is where the most personal growth takes place.

Our ten adventurous students (and their incredibly supportive families) have decided to do something exceptional. They will travel to a part of our country that very few Canadians ever make it to and will work alongside a group of young Canadians who offer a very different perspective and Canadian experience from their own. Through swapping stories, working side by side, and learning new skills with some pretty awesome Carcross-Tagish youth, our students will come out of this with an experience that will last a lifetime.

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I won't go on much further but to say that after a day on Mount Seymour honing our trail building and trail maintenance skills, I am so looking forward to sharing this Yukon experience with our students. I thought you should know about it if you didn't already.

Perhaps I will have to write again before we depart. I didn't even make it to what we'll experience when we head 7 hours north of Carcross to visit the Yukon's famous Dawson City. With nearly 24 hours of daylight in July, we will have plenty of time to explore some Klondike Gold Rush history. We may even strike it rich panning for gold! We'll probably check in on Robert Service's famous cabin. Maybe we'll visit Jack London's former residence? Whatever we do, we'll definitely learn a thing or two about one of Canada's most historic cities before we head even further north for our hike in Tombstone Territorial Park. I can't wait to see the faces of our students when they round that corner of the Dempster Highway and set their eyes on tundra for the first time. But again, that's for another Wednesday article.
