- Close Reading (Power Point Presentation)
 - Dr. Doug Fisher expert on close reading and base of Northpoint's model
 - Less complex text builds stamina, and more complex text builds strength
 - Simply assigning hard book will not ensure reading at high levels!
 - KEY: 3 levels of questioning, often 3 times reading through text
 - o 1st time- What happened (literal)
 - o 2nd time- Structure of text, how organized, vocabulary, purpose, genre

• 3rd time- making opinions, inferences, connections to other texts, leading to discussion with their students, asking questions, and Socratic seminar
