Adult Schedule Options

The Automotive Services Technology program at MNTC is a performance-based program in which students build skills through a scheduled progression of coursework. Knowledge and skills gained from early coursework is necessary for success in later coursework. Courses are organized as:

Rotation 1 (½ day, semester):

- Brakes/Suspension & Steering (half semester)
- Electrical/Electronics (half semester)

Rotation 2: (½ day, semester):

- Automatic/Manual Transmissions and Drive Train (half semester)
- Engine Repair (half semester)

Rotation 3: (½ day, semester):

- Engine Performance (semester)

Rotation 4: (½ day, semester):

- Shop & Career Experience (half semester)
- Heating & Air Conditioning (half semester)

One in AM; the other in PM

SEMESTER 2—Spring

Rotation 4 (AM or PM)
Work-based learning half day

SEMESTER 3—Fall

Rotation 3 (AM or PM)
Work-based learning half day

OPTION 2 – Spring start date (January)

SEMESTER 1—Spring

Rotation 1 and 2
One in AM; the other in PM

SEMESTER 2—Fall

Rotation 3 (AM or PM)
Work-based learning half day

SEMESTER 3—Spring

Rotation 4 (AM or PM)
Work-based learning half day

Schedule Options continued

- Regardless of time of year that a student begins the program, Automotive Fundamentals will be included in the first semester.
- Adult students have the option of attending full-time or part-time depending on personal needs.
- Students may elect to include additional work-based learning to their Plan of Study with instructor approval during the regular school year and/or summers.
