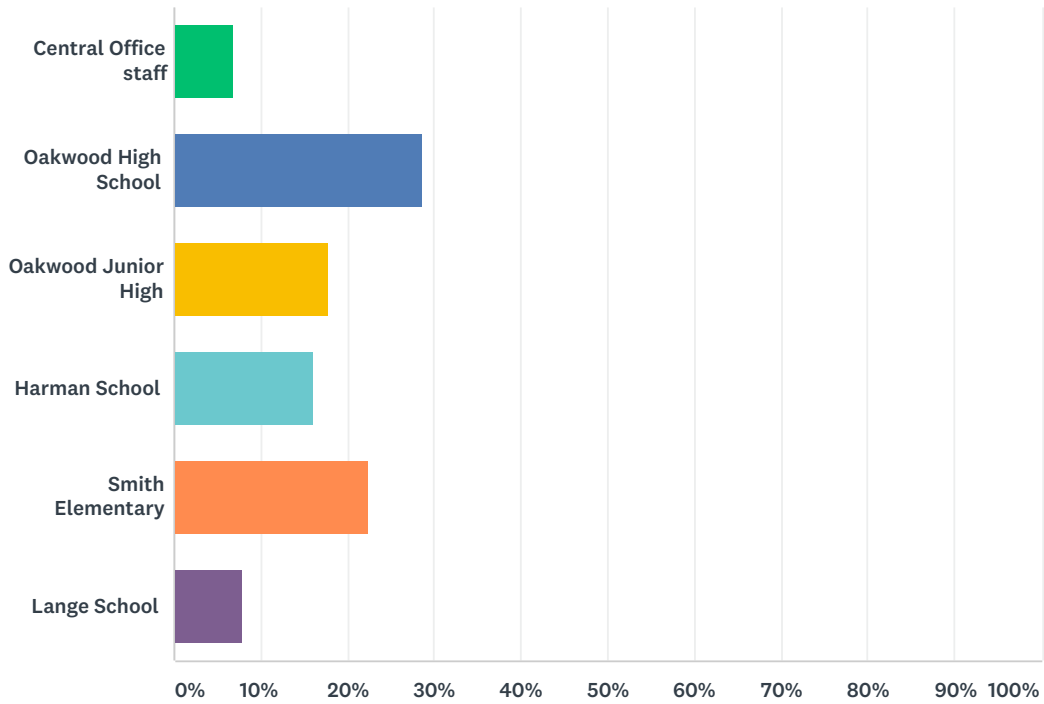


Q1 Please identify if you are a member of a school staff or central office

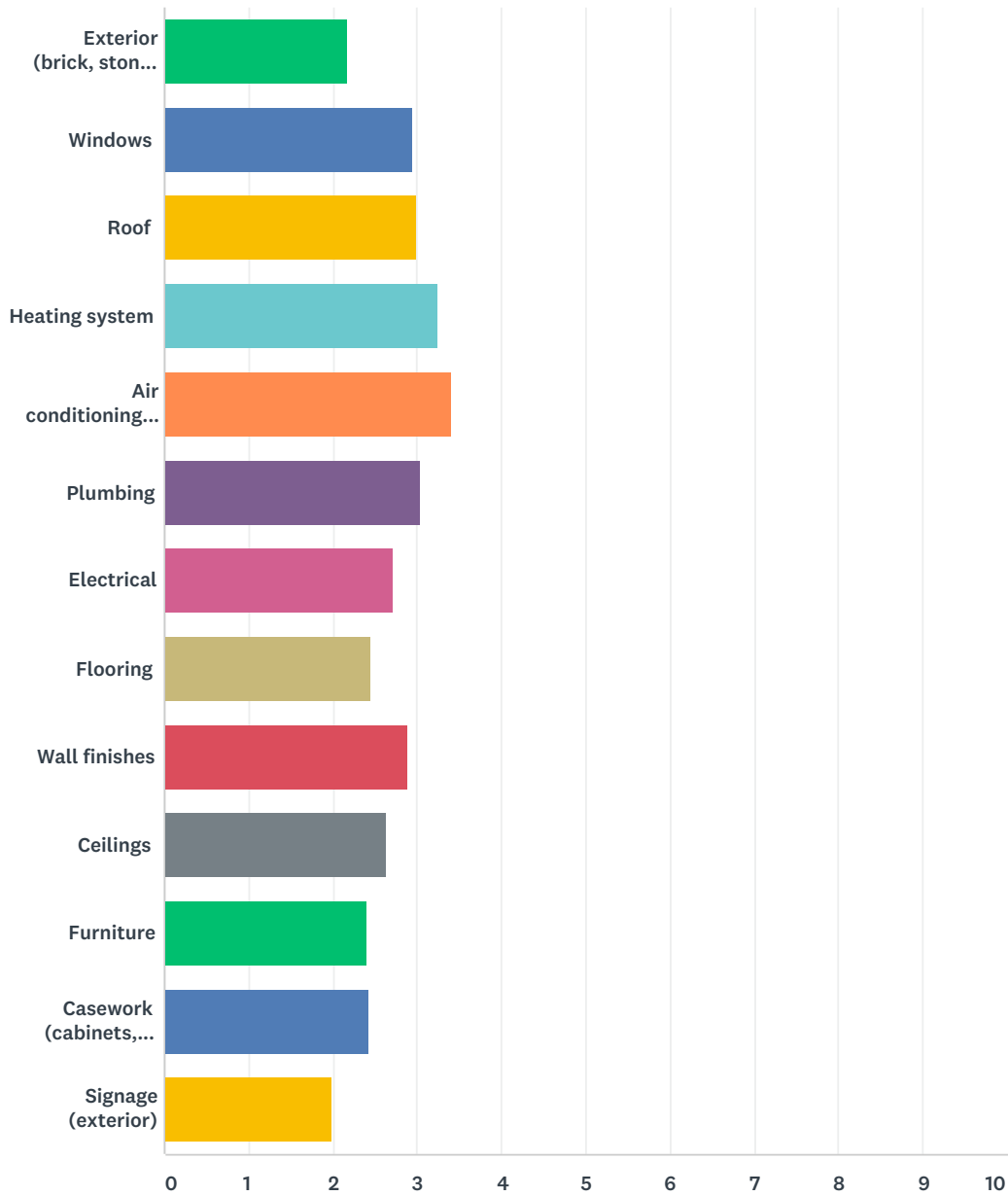
