What is a parent/school compact?

District schools operating under School-wide Title I screen all students in the fall, using state assessments, teacher referrals, and district curriculum benchmark assessments, to determine student needs. Each school creates and provides a differentiated, multi-tiered approach to instruction to meet the needs of all levels of learners. Title I can involve identified students in pull-out, inclusion, and/or one-on-one assistance in addition to instruction received in the regular classroom. Other students may also benefit from the opportunity of working one-on-one with Title I staff members to support academic gains in the regular classroom. Parents of students needing more strategic or intensive interventions to meet grade level expectations will be notified about any changes and or additions to their child's instruction.

Each school receiving funds under Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) must develop a written school-parent compact for all children participating in Title I. This school-parent compact outlines how parents, the school staff, and students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement.
