## WHO WE ARE

Peddie is committed to the intellectual, social and moral growth of each of its students. The school welcomes individuals with diverse talents and backgrounds whose excitement, curiosity and character create an educational community where passion for learning grows. With enthusiasm, humor and patience, Peddie challenges its students to reach beyond their expectations and to define success by the progress they make. In this boarding school environment, students are prepared for the rigors and rewards of college and are inspired to strive for the highest quality of citizenship.

## *540 students representing 34 countries and 23 states

* 41\% are U.S. students of color and 19\% hold citizenship outside of the United States
* 147 seniors including 11 post-graduates
* 63\% of students reside on campus; 90\% of faculty reside on campus

## AGADEMIC AND GRADING CONTEXT

Peddie runs on a trimester calendar and uses A-G block scheduling. Classes meet Monday through Saturday. Select students take six academic courses, and a rare few take a full seven.

Peddie uses a letter-based grading system and does not weight grades. We do not report any form of class rank.

## CURRICULUM HIGHLIGHTS

Peddie has built its reputation on academic rigor, a friendly culture and a focus on the whole student. Our curriculum fuses the hallmarks of a traditional college preparatory experience with opportunities for innovative co-curricular synthesis and personal balance. > The Signature Experience program affords select students the opportunity to complement classroom learning with in-depth, independently-driven explorations of an academic or co-curricular passion. There are offerings in Research Science (EXP), Art, Asian Studies, Creative Writing, Language (Chinese, French, Latin or Spanish) and Robotics. Signature Experiences become a sustained and integral part of a student's academic and life experiences and are noted on participating students' transcripts.

A total of 18 Advanced Placement courses are offered in English, history, math, world Ianguage, visual and performing arts, and the sciences. With rare exceptions, students are limited to a maximum of three AP classes in each academic year. There are advanced and post-AP opportunities in all disciplines, including visual and performing arts.

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## A GOMMIMENT TO STUDENT DIVERSTTY

In 1993 Walter Annenberg '27 awarded Peddie the largest financial gift ever given to an independent boarding school, in large part to endow substantial financial aid for deserving students.

Peddie's $\$ 344$ million endowment is one of the largest for independent boarding schools. Approximately $40 \%$ of students receive financial aid, awarded by need and merit. Peddie disperses funds with the philosophical intent to reach students with diverse talents and backgrounds.
