

TRUST IS CRITICAL! Trust that during an emergency our first priority is to do what is needed to protect students, then convey that to parents as quickly as possible when we have full and accurate information. Trust that staff and students are prepared for emergency situations. Schools participate in emergency drills throughout the year, and staff and emergency responders know the best procedures for keeping students safe. The district and police departments both recommend you NOT call the school or rush to the site. Phone lines, first responders, school personnel and local roads are needed for emergency response efforts. Also, please do not phone or text your child in the midst of an emergency. The noise of cell phones and phone conversations may put your child in danger. Students need to be paying attention to the instructions from trained staff. Conflicting instructions from parents may put a child's safety at risk.
