

Conrad Fischer School Discipline Plan

Level 1 Misconduct

Behavior

- Late or missing assignment
- Running, rough play, or loud talking
- Food in an area other than the lunchroom
- Gum at school
- Possession of distractions – (*skateboards, roller blades, bikes, toys, trading cards, video games or other electronic device*)
- Inappropriate or abusive language
- Failure to follow adult directions

Disciplinary Action

The teacher or supervisor will:

1. Give a verbal correction
2. Implement an individual classroom behavior plan
3. Contact parents to assist in correcting the problem
4. Student is assigned a 30 minute lunch or after school classroom detention

Level 2 Misconduct

Behavior

- Repeated Level 1 or 2 offenses
- Inappropriate behavior on the bus
- Physical aggression towards student
- Creating a classroom disruption
- Disrespect of a student or adult (*including substitutes*)
- Truancy (unexcused absence or tardy)
- Disrespect or misuse of property or equipment
- Dishonesty including lying, cheating or stealing
- Possession of an electronic device
- Violation of technology use guidelines
- Failure to serve office discipline

Disciplinary Action

Disciplinary Referral to the administration, who will notify the parent and:

- a. Restrict the student from all school privileges and arrange a conference which includes the parent, teacher, student and administrator
- b. Assign a lunch or afterschool detention
- c. Assign multiple detentions
- d. Suspension from bus if behavior is bus related
- e. Suspension from lunch if repeat behavior occurs at lunch or recess

When a student is assigned an In-School or Out-of-School suspension, he/she is not allowed to participate in, or attend, extracurricular activities, and may be restricted from participation for up to 9 school days following the suspension.

Level 3 Misconduct

Behavior

- Repeated Level 1 or Level 2 offenses
- Using, possessing, or passing over the counter drugs
- Vandalism, theft or damage of school or personal property
- Pulling a fire alarm (false alarm)
- Forgery of parental signature
- Leaving school grounds without permission

Disciplinary Action

Disciplinary Referral to the administration, who will notify the parent and:
Assign the student to an In-School suspension for 1-10 days;

When a student is assigned Out-of-School suspension, he/she is not allowed to participate in, or attend, extracurricular activities, and may be restricted from participation for up to 9 school days following the suspension.

Level 4 Misconduct

Behavior

- Physical assault of a staff member
- Behavior that is a danger to self or others
 - Possession of a weapon or object with potential use as a weapon
 - Using, possessing or passing alcohol, illegal drugs, cigarettes or any smoking related or incendiary object
 - Sexual Harassment or bullying another individual

Disciplinary Action

Disciplinary Referral to the administration, who will notify the parent and the Superintendent:

- a. Assign the student to an Out-of-School suspension for 1-10 days.
- b. Student is referred to the administration, which will make a recommendation to the Superintendent and the School Board for expulsion.

Most Level 4 Behaviors are violations of local and/ or state law, and students who commit Level 4 offenses will be reported to the Elmhurst Police Liaison officer when appropriate.

Level 1 Misbehavior

- Late or missing assignment
- Running, rough play, or loud talking
- Food in an area other than the lunchroom
- Failure to follow adult directions
- Gum at school

- Name calling or bad language
- Clothing that is not school appropriate

Level 2 Misbehavior

- Repeated Level 1 offenses
- Behavior on the bus that leads to a Bus Report
- Fighting for any reason – including “play” fighting
- Creating a classroom disruption
- Disrespect of a student or school adult (*including substitutes*)
- Disrespect or misuse of property or equipment
- Truancy (unexcused absence or tardy)
- Behavior that is a safety issue for others such as throwing object(s)
- Dishonesty including cheating on assignments
- Inappropriate use, or possession, of a cell phone

Level 3 Misbehavior

- Repeated Level 1 or Level 2 offenses
- Using, possessing, or passing over the counter drugs
- Vandalism, theft or damage of school or personal property
- Pulling a false fire alarm
- Leaving school grounds without permission
- Forgery of parental signature

Level 4 Misbehavior

- Physical assault of a staff member
