  - (1) Funding Bonds are to be entered in the fund or funds in which the liability occurs.
  - (2) Refunding Bonds can be entered in the Debt Services Fund only.
  - (3) Building Bonds can be entered in the Capital Projects Fund only.
  - (4) Fire Prevention and Safety Bonds can be entered in the Fire Prevention & Safety Fund only.
