ABOUT NAMED DESIGNATED HONOR AT AGNES IRWIN

As part of the overall tuition assistance program, there are four named honors for new students whose families qualify for financial assistance. New applicants may be considered for one of these need-based awards: The Class of 1955 Award (applicants to grade 9 every four years - *next awarded for the 2021-2022 school year*), The AIS Scholar Award (applicants to grades 6-9), The J. Mahlon, Jr. Buck Family Scholar for the Arts Award (applicants to grade 9 or grade 10), or The Carter A. Mannion '81 Student-Athlete Award (applicants to grades 9-12).

All applicants who meet the qualifying criteria outlined below will be considered for a named award. Information on how to qualify for an award is below. If your daughter is selected for a named award, you will be notified when you learn of your tuition assistance decision no later than early February, 2019.

The Class of 1955 Award – next awarded for the 2021-2022 school year, applicants must:

- Qualify for financial assistance and complete all steps to the process by stated deadlines
- Be an applicant to grade 9
- Meet the admission application deadline of December 15, 2018
- Meet the tuition assistance application deadline of December 11, 2018

The AIS Scholar Award – to qualify, applicants must:

- Qualify for financial assistance and complete all steps to the process by stated deadlines
- Be an applicant to grades 6-9 for the AIS Scholar Award. The student who is honored with this designation is typically the strongest overall new applicant to the school in that year.
- Meet the admission application deadline of December 15, 2018
- Meet the tuition assistance application deadline of December 11, 2018

Applicants to grades 9-12 whose families qualify for assistance may be considered for the Carter A. Mannion'81 Student-Athlete Award in lieu of The Agnes Irwin Scholar Award or The Class of 1955 Award (for the 2021-2022 school year).

The J. Mahlon, Jr. Buck Family Scholar for the Arts Award – to qualify, applicants must:

- Qualify for financial assistance and complete all steps to the process by stated deadlines
- Be an applicant to grade 9 or grade 10
- Demonstrate excellent academic ability
- Display proficiency or promise in the fine and performing arts
- Provide two letters of recommendation from professional mentors or coaches/teachers by December 5, 2018
- Meet the admission application deadline of December 5, 2018
- Meet the tuition assistance application deadline of December 11, 2018

The Carter A. Mannion '81 Student-Athlete Award – to qualify, applicants must:

- Qualify for financial assistance and complete all steps to the process by stated deadlines
- Be an applicant to grades 9-11
- Demonstrate excellent academic ability
- Be proficient in two sports **OR** has demonstrated outstanding experience in one sport and will participate in at least two athletics seasons at Agnes Irwin each year of high school
- Provide two letters of recommendation from coaches by December 5, 2018
- Meet the admission application deadline of December 5, 2018
- Meet the tuition assistance application deadline of December 11, 2018
