Forest Hills Global Elementary Comprehensive Plan

Forest Hills' School Improvement Team (SIT) has developed a comprehensive plan identifying specific indicators of effective practice in which our school will focus on during the 2016-2017 school year.

- All teachers develop student leadership and global citizenship.
- The school's Leadership Team regularly looks at school performance and classroom observation data to make decisions about school improvement and professional development needs.
- Instructional Teams develop standards-aligned lessons for each subject at the grade level.
- All teachers systematically report to parents the student's mastery of specific standard-based objectives.
- All teachers reinforce classroom rules and procedures by positively teaching them.

Teachers, Family, Students – Together for Success

Teachers suggested home learning strategies, parents added ideas to make them more specific, and students told us what would help them learn.

In the Kinder Classroom

- Teachers will send home core word flash cards and other resources such as tracing sheets for letters, numbers and name.
- Teachers will provide a reading log to record titles and minutes read each night.
- Teachers will provide a homework rubric for families to participate in nightly activities together.
- Teachers will send home weekly newsletters with important dates as well as the descriptions of activities and topics learned in class.



At Home with Family

- ✓ Review and practice skills learned at school in both literacy and numeracy by completing activities in the homework rubric with my child.
- ✓ Read with my child every day and talk about how the story connects with things they have experienced.
- ✓ Read the class newsletter and initial my child's work/homework each night, adding comments where needed.
