Dear Parent/Guardian:

You have informed the school that your student has Diabetes Type I

Please return a **Parent Consent and Physician Authorization for Management of Diabetes at School and School Sponsored Events.** **You may use either the form provided by the school or the form used by your student's medical provider.**

This confidential information will be made available to your student's teachers. **The goal is always to promote independence of self-care and to provide supportive healthcare services as needed.**

As authorized by your medical provider:

- Students may carry their diabetes supplies on them.
 - Students may test their blood glucose as needed.
 - Students may treat lows on the spot.
 - Students will guard and dispose of all sharps in a responsible manner. There is a sharps container in the office.
 - Students may carry water and have bathroom privileges to treat highs.
 - Students may delay academic testing if their blood sugar is out of range specified by physician – usually if below 70 or above 300.
- **If your medical health care provider orders a **Glucagon Injection** for **Emergency Care of Severe Hypoglycemia**, you and/or your medical provider must also fill out and return the following form:**

1. Parent's Request for Specialized Health Care Procedure – Glucagon Injection

THERE IS NO SCHOOL NURSE ON SITE. If your health care provider orders a glucagon injection for emergency hypoglycemia, I will train an **unlicensed staff member to give the injection.**

911 WILL ALWAYS BE CALLED FOR ALL CASES OF SEVERE HYPOGLYCEMIA.

There is storage space and a refrigerator available for you to keep diabetes supplies/and or disaster supplies at school.

Please note that because FUHSD provides all students with Diabetes Type I the above accommodations, we do not have a need to document these accommodations in a 504 Plan. However, if your student is not independent in self-care and needs supervision and/or direct services at school OR if you believe that his diabetes is adversely impacting his education, please contact me. The schools will arrange a meeting with teachers to discuss and document concerns and other accommodations that may be needed.
