How you can help and support us? One of the most important things you can teach your child is respect, and the best way to teach respect is to show respect. When a child experiences respect, they know what it feels like and begin to understand how important it is.



Being respectful helps a child succeed in life. If children don't have respect for peers, authority, or themselves, it's almost impossible for them to succeed. A respectful child takes care of belongings and responsibilities, and a respectful child gets along with peers. Schools teach children about respect, but parents have the most influence on how respectful children become. How can you show respect to your child?

- Be honest If you do something wrong, admit it and apologize.
- Be positive Don't embarrass, insult or make fun of your child. Compliment them.
- Be trusting Let your child make choices and take responsibility.
- Be fair Listen to your child's side of the story before reaching a conclusion.
- Be polite Use "please" and "thank you". Knock before entering your child's room.
- Be reliable Keep promises. Show your child that you mean what you say.
- Be a good listener Give your child your full attention

AFTER school pick-up.

1. Family members who want to come in the building to <u>pick up their student(s)</u> - you will <u>enter door 11</u>, which is on the Southeast side of the building and wait in the EAC (big gym) hallway until your <u>student(s)</u> come to you. For safety and congestion reasons, family members are not allowed to walk into the hallways to get your student(s), **students will come to you in the EAC Hallway**. Also, the <u>doors will open at 3:05 p.m. to let you into that hallway</u>. You will need to wait outside or in your vehicles until 3:05. If you follow the blacktop path around the building, door 11 is the very first door to your left.

2. And just an FYI - the FOX bus line will now be waiting in the MPR to reduce the large number of students presently waiting in the cafe.

***And while I have your attention, this is the time of year we want to start teaching the younger students responsibility by having them walk to their classrooms by themselves in the morning. For safety reasons it is better that we don't have adults walking in the building unless you have checked in the office for a specific reason. It will also reduce the congestion in the halls as all the students are coming in the building after recess.

EXTRA CLOTHING

With the winter months approaching, snow on the ground, we are requesting that you send extra clothing in case your child's clothes get wet while playing at recess. If you would just put them in a plastic bag, your child could keep it in their locker for - JUST IN CASE - days. This would be much appreciated. The Nurse has only a limited amount of clothing and sizes. Please talk to your child about the rules on the playground when there is snow on the ground. If they are wearing boots/snow pants they can play in the snow

Please remind your children to dress appropriately for the weather. Students will have outdoor recess unless the weather is rainy, stormy, or too cold (-1 degree below zero temperature or below zero wind chill), please be sure they come to school with warm jackets, hats, mittens/gloves, and boots.



If they are not wearing boots/snow pants they will have to stay on the blacktop. This is for all grade levels.

Absences

Our Eastside Phone number is 834-7400. After the message Press #1 for the attendance line. This line is available to parents 24 hours a day. Please call the attendance line before 8:45 a.m. to report a child's absence. We must have a REASON for the absence or the student will be unexcused.

Pre-Excused Absences

If your family is planning an absence, please indicate in writing the dates that your child will be gone, and the reason. Send this to school before the day of absence. We may only consider these days excused absences if the absence is excused in advance (as per Wis. Statute). Otherwise, the days are counted as unexcused. Students are expected to make up all homework due to absences.

Attendance Procedures

While we understand that the parent is responsible for school attendance, we must be accountable for the attendance record of each child. The state of Wisconsin has changed the definition of truancy. Truancy is defined as part of /all of five or more days during a semester. Without the written notification of excused absences, your child might be considered truant. This is in addition to our concerns for the academic struggles that arise when you child has increased absences. School district policy JER outlines the definitions and procedures in more detail. Please contact me if you would like a copy of that policy.

Locked School Doors

School doors to the building will be LOCKED at 7:50 a.m. during the school day for the protection and safety of ALL children and staff during the school day. The exception will be the Front Door Entrance. This door has a camera which monitors those entering our building. There are signs directing those who enter to check in at the office, show a picture ID and receive a visitor or volunteer nametag. It is especially important that these procedures are followed in light of the recent unfortunate happenings across the state and nation.

Even if you are a frequent visitor or volunteer, this procedure needs to be done each time. Any staff seeing someone in the building that is not a student or another staff member, will ask the person to return to the office for a name tag.

So, whether you are arriving at school to attend a class presentation, concert, bringing in a lunch or birthday treat, etc. Please sign in at the office.

Volunteering at School or Field Trips

Please remember to fill out the form to have a background check if you want to volunteer at school or chaperone a field trip in the future. It is important that you plan ahead as a background check has been taking about a week or longer at this time, and we do not want to turn away any volunteers.

Lost and Found

With the winter weather here, your children will be wearing clothing items such as hats, mittens, scarves, boots, etc. By taking, a few moments to label your child's possessions much confusion can be eliminated and prompt return of lost items will be insured.


Please encourage your youngsters who have already lost items to check our lost and found. Items will be displayed by the playground doors Items not claimed will be donated to a charitable organization.

Message from Kobussen

Stopping for Flashing Red Lights

Please remember, drivers must stop on the street or highway 20 feet or more from any school bus that has stopped and is flashing red warning lights.

This applies both to vehicles approaching from the rear and from the opposing lanes.

All lanes of traffic must stop for the school bus, except in opposing lanes if the highway is divided with a center median.

No vehicle may proceed until the bus resumes motion and has turned off the red warning lights.

The stop arm on the bus is an added communication to other drivers, but the lack of an extended stop arm is not reason to pass a bus whose red lights are flashing.

Lost and Found

Kobussen has a lost and found for all items left on the bus. The driver will keep the lost item on the bus for a few days, then turn it in at the terminal. If your child has a lost item don't forget to check with Kobussen. Feel free stop by the terminal at 1500 Forward Drive, Sun Prairie to check the lost and found.
