FREITAS Board approve the November 13, 2018 Regular Board Meeting Agenda. YES: Craig, Estheimer, Freitas, Green, Kupser, Pomponio NO: CITIZENS COMMENTS ON DISCUSSION OR ACTION ITEMS Ms. Anita Green-1828 Kings Hwy, Lincoln Park addressed the board with her concerns about the Tardy Sweep Policy at Anderson High School. She does not agree with the policy and feels it is detrimental to a students' education.

#### PRESENTATIONS

District Assessment Results: Curriculum Director, Dr. Baker-Herring shared the 2017/18 district-wide standardized assessment results with the board. Board members were given a packet with detailed data and a power-point presentation displaying the test results for grades three through eleven. District results were compared with state and national results.

Dr. Baker-Herring compiled longitudinal MSTEP results, which tracked students from the time they took the test in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade through their 8<sup>th</sup> grade year. These results showed Math and ELA scores. Scores from surrounding districts were also compared with Southgate's scores. AP results for student's taking- English Language Comp, English Literature Comp, Psychology, U.S. History, Calculus and Biology with a score of 3 or higher were presented and compared with U.S. and State Scores. College credit is earned with a score of 3, 4 or 5.

Our results will be shared with Leadership Teams, Department Chairs and School Improvement Teams. Data will be analyzed and improvement plans will be based on the data. The Curriculum Department will focus on the five factors for creating high-reliability schools by addressing each level; Competency-Based Education, Standards-Referenced Reporting, Guaranteed and Viable Curriculum, Effective

Dr. Baker-Herring concluded with an update on the district's transition from Graduation Alliance to Atlas online learning with our Odyssey-ware platform. We will no longer have to pay Graduation Alliance to support our students.

2018/19-50 It was moved by Dr. Pomponio supported by Mr. Kupser, the board approve the approve the minutes from October 23, 2018, HR Update and the Disbursements for October 2018.

#### ACTION

- 1. Lease agreement with the City of Southgate: Ms. Pastor explained the board is being asked to approve the property lease with the City of Southgate. This lease would be for 30 years for \$1.00 per year. The city will be using this property for a dog park. This idea was originally presented to the board at the May 22, 2018 board meeting by Dustin Lent. Discussion took place about the lease, construction timeline and maintenance of the property. Board members commented that this project had community input and support through the passage of the city's Recreation Millage and is good use of an unusable piece of land. This project will begin this winter/spring and with a summer grand opening.
- 2018/19-51 It was moved Mr. Estheimer supported by Dr. Pomponio, the board approve the property lease with the City of Southgate for 30 years for land behind Asher of approximately 7 acres.

2. Change to Substitute Teacher Rate of Pay: Mr. Morin explained, the board is being asked to approve a change in the rate of substitute teacher pay for daily substitute teaching assignments to a single daily rate of \$95 for both certified and non-certified substitute teachers.

Discussion took place about the current rate of pay and the need to increase the current rate to keep us competitive. Board members were given the sub rates from the surrounding areas.

2018-19-52 It was moved by Mr. Green supported by Mr. Estheimer, the board approve the \$95 per day rate of pay for daily substitute teachers (this excludes premiere substitutes and longterm substitutes, no change at this time to their rate of pay).

- 3. Approval of the Wayne RESA Master Service Agreement for payroll services: Ms. McLachlan explained to the board, Wayne RESA provides contracted series for select business office functions. With the retirement of one of the business office personnel on December 31, 2018 and the realignment of positions and duties for maximum efficiency, we are able to contract with Wayne RESA for the management of our payroll processes. Wayne RESA has had successful experience with providing payroll services to districts our size. This change in staffing would result in annual savings in the general fund of \$33,000. The master service agreement was attached to the board members' packets.
- 2018/19-53 It was moved by Dr. Pomponio supported by Mr. Green, the board approve the Wayne RESA Master Service Agreement for Payroll Services effective January 1, 2019, for an initial term of 18 months.
