ABOUT

Founded in 1970, Oak Hall School is an independent, college-preparatory school serving 758 students in grades Preschool-12. Students are admitted to Oak Hall on the basis of previous academic record, recommendations, a writing sample, and a personal interview. For the 2016-2017 school year, 168 students (K-12) are receiving financial aid totaling \$1,174,110.00. The school admits academically qualified students without regard to race, creed, sex, or national or ethnic origin.

Of the Class of 2016, 82% matriculated to four-year colleges and 18% matriculated to two-year colleges. Minority/international students comprised 6% of the class.

Of the 34 faculty members in the Upper School, 27 hold advanced degrees in their fields. All teachers serve as faculty advisers and most coach or sponsor student clubs and activities.

PROGRAM OF STUDY

The school year is divided into two semesters. Examinations are administered at the end of each semester. Students are required to enroll in and satisfactorily complete six credit courses each year (including four academic classes). Juniors may take five credit courses if all of them are AP. Seniors may take five credit courses if four of them are AP or dual enrollment courses. All students must earn 24 credits for graduation.

SPECIAL CURRICULUM FEATURES

Qualified juniors and seniors may be dually enrolled for both college and high school credit in courses offered at the University of Florida and at Santa Fe College. All seniors are required to complete a two week off-campus Senior Project with either a vocational or a community service focus and to complete 10 hours of approved community service for each year of the Upper School enrollment.

Established in 2010, the Arts Conservatory Program (ACP) allows students to concentrate in theatre, music or visual arts. The ACP is designed to enhance students' problem-solving skills, global/cultural awareness, and critical thinking skills through intensive creative study. Entrance is by audition or portfolio; upon graduation, students earn special designation on their diplomas and transcripts.

GRADING, GRADE POINT AVERAGE, RANK IN CLASS, AND HONOR ROLL COMPUTATION

Grade point averages are calculated on a traditional four point scale. GPAs include grades in all classes except elective PE courses taken at Oak Hall beginning in Grade 9. Grades earned in AP classes and senior Advanced Seminar courses are weighted one point and grades earned in Honors course are weighted .5. Arts Conservatory Program courses taken within a student’s designated concentration (theatre/music/visual arts) as a junior or senior, are weighted one point as well. Oak Hall does not calculate rank in class. Honor rolls are published at the end of each quarter. To qualify for the Honor Roll, a student must have earned no grade below “B-”. To qualify for the High Honor Roll, a student must have earned no grade below “A-”.
