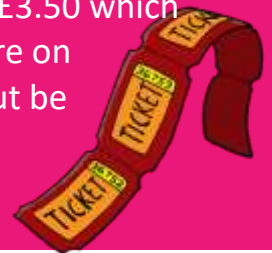

# TRIP TO GENEVA, SWITZERLAND— NOVEMBER

## About the event:

A group of ten Year 13 students—Keyhan, Rayyan, Khadija, Anees, Inaaya, Daniel, Mustafah, Ayaan, Aneela, and Abdul—accompanied by Mr Ziomek, had the amazing opportunity to visit Switzerland on what may prove to be a once-in-a-lifetime experience. The trip was organised and fully funded by WildHearts Foundation (a group behind the Micro-Tyco Challenge—a programme our school has been involved in for the last few years) and the main reason behind it was the Global Entrepreneurial Leaders' Summit (GEL) held at United Nations in Geneva. The trip offered a lot more though...

## Part 1: Journey to Switzerland and a tour of the International School of Geneva—our hosts

After a nearly 18-hour coach journey to Switzerland, we safely arrived in Geneva to discover that we were surrounded by mountains and, unfortunately, clouds. The morning was filled with introductions, tours and first workshops—all extremely well received by all involved!

Part 2: ‘When infinitely large, meets infinitely small’ — a visit to CERN

In the afternoon of our first day in Geneva, we were given a tour of CERN - the Nuclear research facility that is home to the Large Hadron Collider (LHC) - a circular tube 28km in diameter, built 100m underground. This is the place where the existence of the famous Higgs Boson was confirmed back in 2013.

As part of our tour, we visited a cryogenic test facility where we with the help of one of CERN’s physisits, we learnt about how the accelarator works and how the experiments are conducted. We also had a chance to visit the command centre of AMS POCC—an International Space Centre module currently orbiting the Earth.

# Go4SET Project



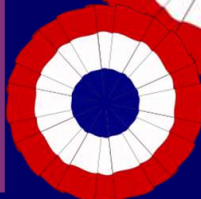
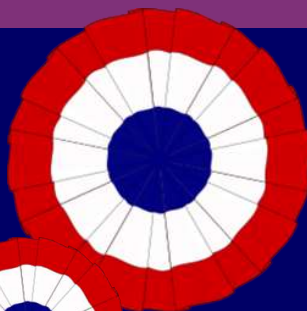
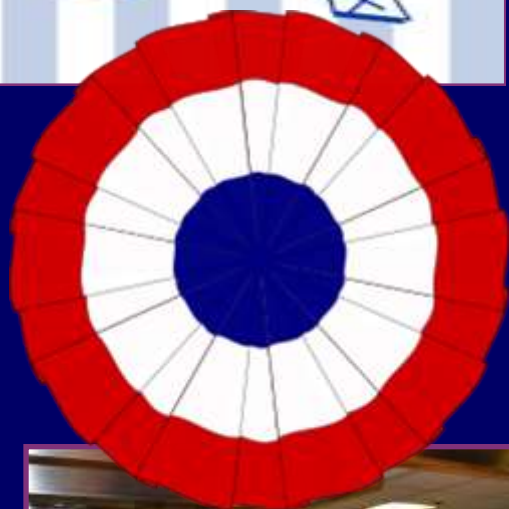

# Year 10 First Christmas Bake of the Year!

The Year 10 GSCE Food Preparation class produced their first Christmas product of the year with these stunning Yule Logs.

The students made the sponge, filling, icing and sugar decorations from scratch and applied icing using the piping technique to get the log effect.

The school cooking club students are also due to make their own yule logs in preparation for Christmas.

## Ingredients

### For the cake

3 eggs  
85g golden caster sugar  
85g plain flour (less 2 tbsp)  
2 tbsp cocoa powder  
½ tsp baking powder

### For the filling & icing

50g butter  
140g dark chocolate  
, broken into squares  
1 tbsp golden syrup  
284ml pot double cream  
200g icing sugar, sifted  
2-3 extra strong mint (optional)  
icing sugar and holly sprigs to deco-

## Recipe

### Method

Heat oven to 200C/fan 180C/gas 6.

Grease and line a 23 x 32cm Swiss roll tin with baking parchment.

Beat 3 eggs and 85g golden caster sugar together with an electric whisk for about 8 mins until thick and creamy.

Mix 85g plain flour (less 2 tbsp), 2 tbsp cocoa powder and ½ tsp baking powder together, then sift onto the egg mixture. Fold in very carefully, then pour into the tin.

Now tip the tin from side to side to spread the mixture into the corners. Bake for 10 mins.

Lay a sheet of baking parchment on the work surface.

When the cake is ready, tip it onto the parchment, peel off the lining paper, then roll the cake up from its longest edge with the paper inside. Leave to cool.

To make the icing, melt 50g butter and 140g dark chocolate together in a bowl over a pan of hot water. Take from the heat and stir in 1 tbsp golden syrup and 5 tbsp double cream from a 284ml pot. Beat in 200g sifted icing sugar until smooth.

Whisk the remaining double cream from the 284ml pot until it holds its shape.

Unravel the cake, spread the cream over the top, scatter over 2-3 crushed extra strong mints, if using, then carefully roll up again into a log.

Cut a thick diagonal slice from one end of the log. Lift the log on to a plate, then arrange the slice on the side with the diagonal cut against the cake to make a branch.

Spread the icing over the log and branch (don't cover the ends), then use a fork to mark the icing to give the effect of tree bark. Scatter with unsift-

# Year 7 'Making a Difference' App Design Challenge

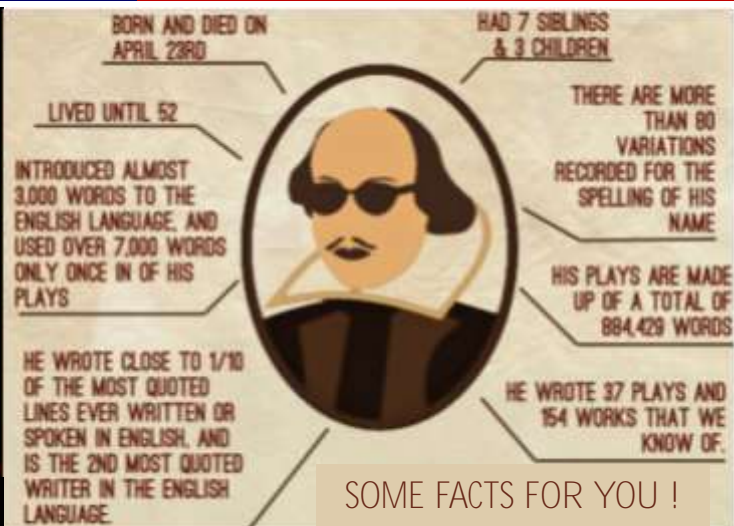
