## THE HIGH SCHOOL

Pelham Memorial High School (PMHS) is located in the Town of Pelham in southern Westchester County, a half hour north of New York City. Its 12,500 residents range from professionals to skilled workers who all share a commitment to education as well as the arts, athletics and civic responsibility.

As a 4-year high school with both academically and culturally diverse students, PMHS takes pride in its rigorous college preparatory program and extensive extracurricular, athletic and fine arts opportunities. Based upon New York State census guidelines, the PMHS population is 65.5% White, 17.6% Hispanic, 6.6% Black, 5.4% Asian, and 4.9% Two or more Races.

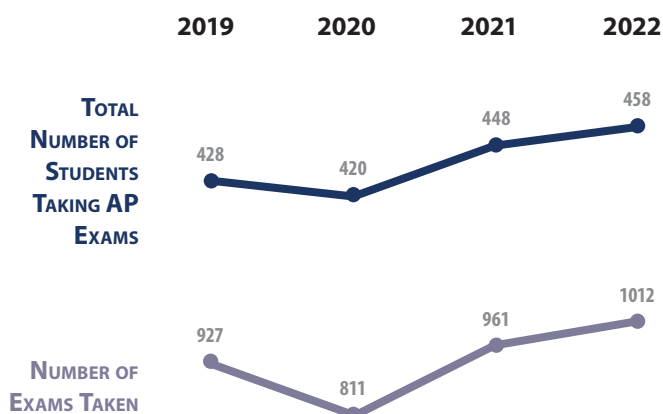

## Student Enrollment in APs



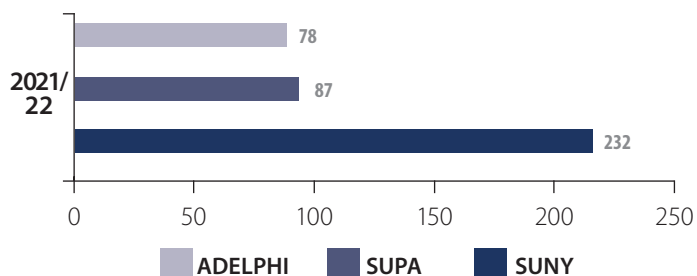

## GRADING

### GRADE POINT AVERAGES

Computed at the end of the 11<sup>th</sup> grade, the grade point average is determined by grades in all subjects.

### GRADE POINT AVERAGE CALCULATION

To calculate cumulative unweighted grade point averages (GPAs), total all grades (multiply semester courses by .5) and divide by total credits earned. To calculate cumulative weighted GPAs, multiply all Honors/AP and college classes by 1.05, or 1.1 as appropriate, total all grades, and divide by total credits earned.

**NOTE:** All Advanced Placement and College level courses will receive a weight of 1.10. All Honors level courses will receive a weight of 1.05.

- ◆ All students at Pelham are required to complete a ½ credit writing seminar.
- ◆ As of June 2017, PMHS discontinued the administration of the Algebra 2 and Physics Regents exams.

*Pelham Memorial High School closed for in-person learning in March 2020 due to the COVID pandemic and remained closed for the remainder of the school year. The initial closure occurred during the middle of our third quarter. All students were given the option of taking a pass/fail or a numerical grade for the third quarter. At the start of the fourth quarter, we transitioned back to our grading scale for the balance of the school year. Consequently, final grades from the 2019-20 school year appear on the transcript. Thereafter, Pelham Memorial High School transitioned to hybrid instruction for the 2020/21 school year. Please also note that New York State Regents exams were not administered for this period. Students not able to take the exam during that period received an exemption or "E" posted to their transcript.*
