From the

President's Desk

As Totino-Grace High School celebrates our 50th anniversary, I can't help but look back to where we've been and how far we've come. In September 1966, 175 freshmen were enthusiastically welcomed for the first day of school by our founding principal Sister Mary Mark Tacheny and superintendent Brother William Koutsky. For each of the next three years, another class of students was added. The school cost just over \$2.2 million to build and tuition was \$180 per year for our first students.

Archbishop Grace High School opened with four Christian Brothers and six School Sisters of Notre Dame joining together to oversee the administration of the school. At one point, these numbers eventually grew to 11 Brothers and 18 Sisters living on campus. The Brothers have had a presence on campus until 2015 when Brother Milton Barker officially retired and he, along with Brother Kevin Brutcher, moved off campus.

From our inception, school leaders embraced the model of Christ, our Church, and our founders' charisms by purposefully creating a welcoming environment rooted in respect and love. Totino-Grace is more than just an academically rigorous high school. In the classroom and beyond, students make lasting friendships, enrich their faith, and become lifelong learners.

Ours is a remarkable story of how generations of families, educators and board members have continually sacrificed, challenged and supported one another to provide the best for our students. A stable legacy has endured:

- A sense that every student matters
- A sense that a rigorous education is a leg up to a good life
- A sense that serving others is incumbent as members of the human race
- A sense that God has a purpose for each of us

In the years ahead, Totino-Grace will remain dedicated to offering a comprehensive, challenging, supportive and doctrinally sound academic program for all learners, one that stimulates their intellectual curiosity, develops their creative and enterprising capacities, and strengthens their union with Christ and His Church. We will also continue to emphasize science, technology, engineering, mathematics and the fine and performing arts; and also provide an array of co-curricular offerings that include service and mission work. Just as important, we will welcome a more academically, culturally and economically diverse student body -- one that will require greater financial support.

This year, our celebration recognizes and honors all the hard work, discipline, and talent represented in the Totino-Grace community over the past 50 years. I recall a simple expression, "together and by association," which describes a promise to make a difference in young people's lives through relationships and education. As a Catholic school, helping students to develop a meaningful relationship with God is the center of our mission. That was the focus of Archbishop Grace High School in 1966, and that is the focus of Totino-Grace High School today.


In the late 1950s, the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis sought to expand the number of Catholic high schools in the Twin Cities. At this time, Monsignor Joseph Lapinski, pastor of Immaculate Conception Catholic Church in Columbia Heights, purchased land in Fridley in the hope that the Archdiocese would soon build a new high school to serve Catholic families in the surrounding area. In 1965, the Archdiocese invited the Christian Brothers and the School Sisters of Notre Dame to join together to oversee the administration of the new school. Named in honor of Archbishop Thomas L. Grace, an early Minnesota bishop who was a pioneer in education, Archbishop Grace High School opened in September 1966 with 175 freshmen. For each of the next three years, another class of students was added.

In 1980, in honor of the generous benefaction of Jim and Rose Totino, entrepreneurs in the frozen pizza business, the name of the school was augmented to Totino-Grace High School. At the time, Jim and Rose's gift of \$1 million was the largest ever given to a Catholic high school in the nation. Their profound commitment to Catholic education

funded facility expansion and established the school's endowment, which remains the foundation of our student financial aid program.

In 1997, Totino-Grace's long association with the Christian Brothers and its support of the Lasallian educational mission led Totino-Grace to declare itself a Lasallian school. Totino-Grace continues to be part of a worldwide network of over 975 Lasallian schools across 80 nations. Lasallian educators believe that to touch the hearts and minds of the children entrusted to them is the greatest miracle of them all.

From the beginning, the Brothers and Sisters welcomed the presence of lay teachers and staff as their colleagues in every area of school operations. This partnership provided a continuity of spirit and tradition that endures as one of the school's hallmarks. Today, a lay Board of Directors is responsible for school operations.



LEARNING

Totino-Grace is dedicated to offering a comprehensive, challenging, supportive academic curriculum for all learners, one that stimulates students' intellectual curiosity and develops their creative and enterprising capacities. This commitment has led to the development of a number of innovative programs and enhanced learning experiences, including: Kathleen Murphy Scholars Program, Experiential Engineering Education Institute, Learning Lab, and the Totino-Grace Boarding Program.

Technology innovation has long been a priority. Since the early years, a variety of tools have enhanced classroom teaching and learning. Today, 1:1 personal learning devices enable students and teachers to collaborate, create, critically problem solve, and communicate as never before. Totino-Grace believes effective teaching is relational and inspirational. Our small classes are impactful in affording teachers the means to challenge, encourage, and support our students to become the best possible versions of themselves.


FAITH

As an Archdiocesan Catholic high Totino-Grace wants students to know God and understand His purpose for each of them. The Religion Department curriculum is designed to provide students



Those state championships really brought the school together and put Grace High School on the map.

I received my undergraduate and MBA degrees from the University of St. Thomas. For over 20 years, I ran a small company, Best Vendors, in Minneapolis and most recently have taken on the assignment of CEO of Eurest, the largest food source company in North America. While my children were attending TG, my wife and I spent a significant amount of time on campus, attending their co-curricular events, the Winter Place Gala and other activities.

Although the faculty and staff change, the captive "soul" of Totino-Grace still resonates; I don't believe that will ever change. Totino-Grace is a place and community where your child can grow and thrive as a young man or woman. They will not only benefit from the fine academic programs and strong co-curricular programs that TG has to offer, but — most importantly — their hearts and souls will be cared for, nurtured and developed in the spirit of Jesus Christ for four important years of their development. 
MARISSA MURLOWSKI SKAJA
