Tracking Volunteer Hours at Southridge

There's a story I share with new parents about the first time I realized how special and unique volunteering at Southridge really is. A few months after I started, I attended a conference for Advancement professionals. There were a few hundred people there, all from independent schools across North America, and we attended various sessions about fundraising, alumni relations, and volunteering.

At one session, we were comparing our volunteer numbers. A few people admitted that volunteering wasn't a part of their school culture at all and they were hoping to start a program. Others had 30-40 parent volunteers. Another school proudly boasted that they had 150 volunteers. I felt like I had to clarify how they were 'counting' because I had a number in my head and it was significantly larger. When I realized that they were counting anyone who volunteered at any point during the year, I said, "Well, then, we must have over 500, because nearly all of our parents volunteer." I will never forget the look of shock (and some disbelief) on their faces.

Now, after being at Southridge for seven years, I can proudly say that our 'number' is even higher than that. And what is probably even more impressive, is that nearly all of our parents volunteer *not* because we're tracking their hours, or if they didn't, they would have to pay in lieu. They don't volunteer out of obligation because they promised they would in their Admissions interview. Parents volunteer at Southridge because that's just *who we are* as a school community.

On a regular basis, someone asks me how volunteering is going – usually someone who has been at the school for a long time, wanting to make sure that the volunteer spirit is as alive now as it was when they started at Southridge. Since I can't give them stats (because we *really* don't keep track), I usually tell them, "All I know is that we ask everyone to give when they can, how they can, and, as far as I can tell, everyone does". What I do know for sure is that we always have all the volunteers we need (often more than we need!) and they get the job done in half the time we expect them to. And...if there were some sort of volunteer competition, Southridge would sweep the podium!

Tomorrow is a very special day at Southridge. Between the PYP and Senior School Feasts, nearly 150 volunteers will be on-site setting up, preparing or serving food, and cleaning up after the students have enjoyed an amazing meal with their friends. I'm certain

if you're one of those volunteers tomorrow, you'll hear 100 thank-you's, but in advance, I want to say it to you one more time. Thank you for saying 'yes' when you were asked, for pitching in whenever and however you can, for helping make this special day at Southridge even more special because of your involvement, and maybe most of all, for keeping our culture of volunteerism alive and well. *Thank you so much.*

Provincial Graduation Numeracy Assessment

The new BC graduation requirements now include a mandatory Provincial Graduation Numeracy Assessment (GNA) that all students are required to complete before graduation. This has replaced the former Mathematics 10 Provincial Exam.

This exam is for students in Grade 10 or above and involves questions related to Grades K-10 math curriculum. The assessment requires students to solve problems by using the five numeracy processes (different ways of thinking and working): interpret, apply, solve, analyze and communicate.

We will be running this exam with all students who are currently registered in Pre-Calculus 11 on Monday, January 21 at 9:00 am. This means that students in Grade 10 or 11 who are in Pre-Calculus 11 are registered to write the Numeracy exam. Students will be spending time in class the week following the Winter Break preparing for the exam, but little preparation is required. Students can access the Pre-Assessment Activities before this time if they would like to view some sample questions and responses.

The exam consists of 24 common computer scored questions and 2 written response questions that students select out of a possible four. These questions are scored by trained markers hired by the Ministry of Education.
