Of our more than 250 employees, over 180 are faculty members, 74% of whom hold advanced degrees, 24 of them doctorates.

- understanding of cross- and multi-disciplinary approaches, and
- commitment to work cooperatively with administrators, faculty, students, families, and global partners in order to maintain a strong program.
