Digital Citizenship Announcements Week: Creative Credit & Copyright 1/4/19

Here are a few words of wisdom regarding digital citizenship. This week, we are focusing on Creative Credit & Copyright. We've all heard about the boy who cried "wolf!" He lied so many times that no one believed him when the wolf was really after him. He suffered a serious consequence for his dishonesty. If we expect others to believe us, we have to earn trust by speaking the truth. If we stretch the truth, we may not be taken seriously when it counts. At Maryville City Schools, we recommend that each person: Think about how honesty online impacts your character. If you take someone else's work online and claim it for your own, will others believe when you really have created something?

An ancient proverb states, "if you lie and then tell the truth, the truth will be considered a lie." Make sure you're making good decisions with how you use others' work and present the truth. The reputation you build online can impact you in person! The choices you make follow you.
