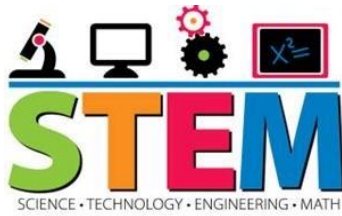
PIANO & HARP LESSONS
